## Magic Valley Traffic Death Toll Hits 41 as Lone Motorist Is Killed in Crash at Wendell

WENDELL, Nov. 29.—Melvin E. Jones, 32, Lincoln, Neb., became Magic Valley's 41st traffic fatality of the year when he was killed instantly at 9:30 p.m. Wednesday one mile south of Jerome by Herman Hodges, lost control of his automobile on a sharp curve, skidded off the highway and over a pile of gravel. The car was 45 feet off the highway and Jones was thrown from the vehicle. His body was found six feet from the car, lying on a rural road. An accident at this same curve and under similar circumstances claimed the lives of two Magic Valley youths Sept. 10, 1950, when their automobile failed to make the curve and rolled up the gravel pile. Jones was driving a 1951 Chevrolet owned by Hodges and loaned to him by his father, Dr. J. G. Gooding county sheriff's deputies who investigated the mishap said Jones was traveling at a high rate of speed when he failed to make the turn. He estimated he was traveling at 45 miles an hour. A witness in an "oncoming car" told officers Jones was traveling at a high rate of speed when he was alone at the time of the accident. Jones' body was taken to the Weaver mortuary following an investigation by Gooding county coroner, Dr. J. G. Gooding.

## Artillery resumes Snooting in Korea As Odd Lull Ends

SEOUL, Korea, (Friday) Nov. 30.—Allied artillery resumed long-range shelling of the Reds Thursday after a strange 36-hour lull. The U. ## Red Delegates Back Down in Troop Bid

PANMUNJON, Korea, Nov. 29 (AP)—The communists backed down slightly today in their demand for immediate withdrawal of foreign troops from Korea and opened the way for a possible compromise. North Korean Gen. Nam Il, chief communist truce negotiator, suggested informally that the Reds might be willing to settle for a gradual reduction in foreign contingents—presumably Chinese as well as U.N.—after an armistice. Officials in Washington said the U.N. and Reds might work out a deal, if not formal plan, for gradually reducing their forces. Eventually, they said, South Korea's army could be built up to deal with any new North Korean threat.

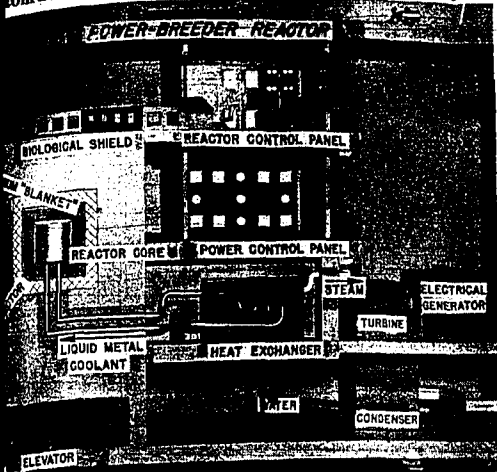

# Atom Reactor Ready to Produce Electricity



Every model shows operating principles of a nuclear reactor which would produce electrical power at the same time as a source of fissionable material. The main elements of such a reactor would be a fissionable material where a chain reaction would be maintained and a cooling system to carry heat to a heat exchanger where it would convert water to steam. The steam would turn a turbine to produce electricity. A condenser would convert the steam to water to be returned through the heat exchanger. The reactor coolant would be returned to the reactor core after being cooled in the heat exchanger. 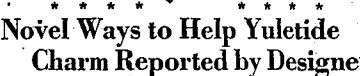

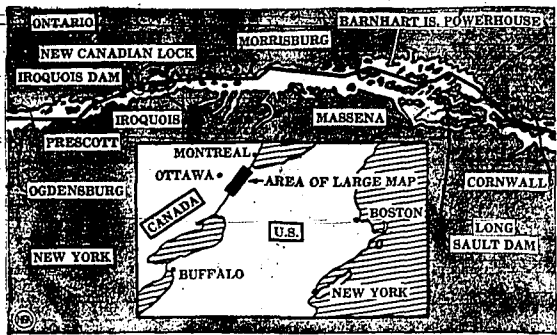

mean a delay of at least 18 months. Canada's decision for a sole project is not exactly new. Such plans are understood to have been ready for about 150 years, but not put into operation because of hope that the U. S. would ratify the 1911 treaty for the seaway.

New Canadian opinion has stiffened in the face of U. S. opposition, and legislation for an all-Canadian seaway is expected at the current session of parliament.

The cost would be divided between the dominion and Ontario governments, since Ontario wants the electric power from the dams.

Above the cost of the waterway itself, there will be another \$32,000,000 for power development. This would be shared with New York state if New York gets the go-ahead from the international joint commission.

## Canada Ready to Build St. Lawrence Seaway Alone After Long Wait on U.S.

TORONTO, (NPA)—Sometime in 1930, ocean-going ships may be able to steam up the St. Lawrence river through Canadian waters and all through all the Great Lakes.

That is how Canadian planners visualize the future at the moment in their decision to go ahead and build the controversial St. Lawrence seaway alone, without U. S. help.

Although the U. S. congress has shied action on the idea of a joint project until 1933, rather than actually turning down the idea, the present plan has been rebuffed for the past 10 years and has been under study since 1920.

"This Canada now has begun action to do the job alone, building all the canals to clear the St. Lawrence rapids on the Canadian side of the international boundary. Since there are international complications to be cleared away, however, the door is still open should congress change its mind early next year.

Three major considerations prompted Canada to give up waiting.

Canada needs the power the waterway would provide for immediate industrial expansion.

She needs the waterway to ship iron ore from the new fields being developed in Labrador and northern Quebec to the steel mills in the Cleveland and southern Ontario areas.

And she needs the seaway to al-

low construction of larger naval vessels at Great lakes shipyards as part of Canada's defense effort.

Major pressure on the Canadian side of the border has come from Ontario, where a phenomenal industrial boom growing since 1929 has pushed up electric power needs.

Right after World-war-II, there were electricity "brownouts" in Ontario. Although new power plants are now going into operation and the "brownouts" have been eliminated temporarily, there still is a power shortage.

If Canada sticks by the present decision to go ahead alone, all shipping will go through Canadian territory and building costs (estimated at \$200,000,000) will be met through toll charges at the locks.

The eight-year project will require a labor force of more than 10,000 men and will flood out 20 miles of Canadian territory in the International rapids section north of New York state.

It will mean wiping out seven villages and one larger town in the 47-mile stretch between Cornwall and Prescott and moving these communities to new sites. And it would require deepening of existing channels all the way from Montreal to Lake Ontario, as well as the Welland canal and other canals all the way up to Lake Superior.

Development of the waterpower at the international rapids still would require approval of the international joint commission which

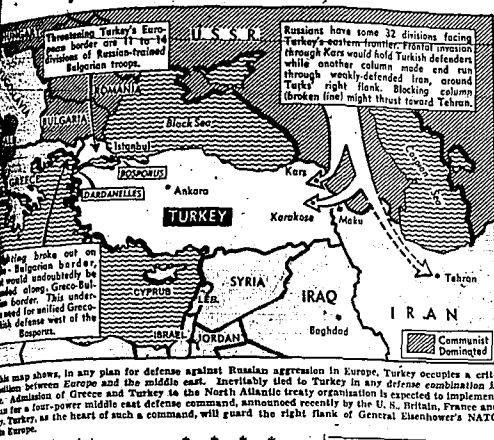

### Keystone to Middle East Defense



...the map shows, in any plan for defense against Russian aggression in Europe, Turkey occupies a critical position between Europe and the middle east. Inevitably tied to Turkey in any defense combination is Greece. Admission of Greece and Turkey to the North Atlantic Treaty organization is expected to implement the first step in a four-power middle east defense command, announced recently by the U. S., Britain, France and Turkey, as the heart of such a command, will guard the right flank of General Eisenhower's NATO in Europe.

...the route of invasion of Turkey's northern frontiers would be through Kara, in east-central Turkey. This has been the historical route of two previous Russian invasions of Turkey.

On this eastern front it is believed the Russians have some 32 divisions. They are made up of Azerbailian, Georgian and Armenian troops, commanded by Russian officers. While the people of these three Russian states are believed to be restless under Soviet domination, the Turks are under no delusions over any possibility of revolt.

To the west of the Black sea, on Turkey's second front, the Turks face another 11 to 14 divisions. This is in Turkey-in-Europe, west of the Bosphorus, in what is known as Thrace, or the Macedonian plain. The troops opposing the Turks here are Bulgarians.

### Solons Report Production for Defense Falling "Dangerously Behind Schedule"

WASHINGTON, Nov. 29 (AP)—Production of defense items has fallen dangerously behind schedule, a senate subcommittee reported last night, and it recommended that the government "take a greater bite out of civilian production."

Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, D. Tex., chairman of the armed services subcommittee set up to keep an eye on the military preparedness program, said in a statement accompanying the report.

"Under any circumstances we will have to have both guns and butter. But somebody is going to have to decide how much butter and how many guns. Furthermore, that decision will have to be made in terms of the national appetite."

In a critical report, the group reported "deliveries of defense hard goods—planes, tanks, ships, and guns—have fallen dangerously behind schedule."

The subcommittee suggested appointment of a new "procurement czar" with broad powers within the defense department.

"It said this official might be a former undersecretary of defense or the present chairman of the munitions board, John D. Small, given additional powers.

In any event, the report to the senate said defense production must get first claim and top priority on scarce materials, machine tools and manpower.

The report said that, after meeting all needs to reach production targets fixed by top military officials, any other resources should be used to this end.

"1. To expand the industrial base so that if an attack comes we will have the industrial capacity necessary to produce the enormous quantities of weapons and goods required by a total war.

"2. To assure an adequate supply of critical war materials for essential wartime production.

"3. To maintain as healthy a civilian economy as at high a rate of civilian production as possible in view of the more compelling demands upon our resources."

The report said more than a year had elapsed since start of the Korean war before defense officials drastically cut back use of critical materials for non-essential civilian goods and restricted new model designs on automobiles.

"Mobilization progress is not doing well and we believe congress and the public are entitled to be informed as to this fact."

Although congress provided more than \$110,000,000,000 defense funds and contracts were let promptly, the subcommittee said, deliveries of aircraft, guided missiles, tanks and initial estimates.

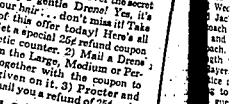

**Disease Use Is Tested as Cancer Help**

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Nov. 29 (AP) — Science is learning to use disease to combat the most dreaded malady, cancer. Dr. Cornelius P. Rhoads, director of the Sloan-Kettering Institute for cancer research in New York, told a meeting of urologists certain viruses can be trained to fight cancer and destroy it. He said particular viruses have a natural tendency to eat certain cancer cells without attacking surrounding normal tissue. Develop Appetites By feeding such viruses cancer cells over long periods and through several generations, they develop such strong appetites for cancer cells they will destroy them completely, he said. Dr. Rhoads said the first successful experiments were made on cancerous animals using viruses taken

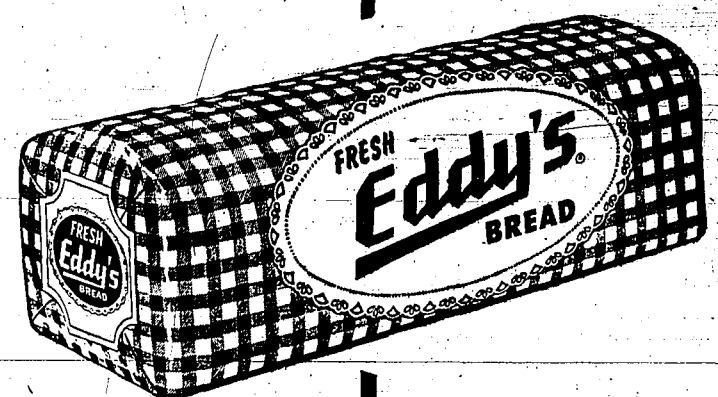

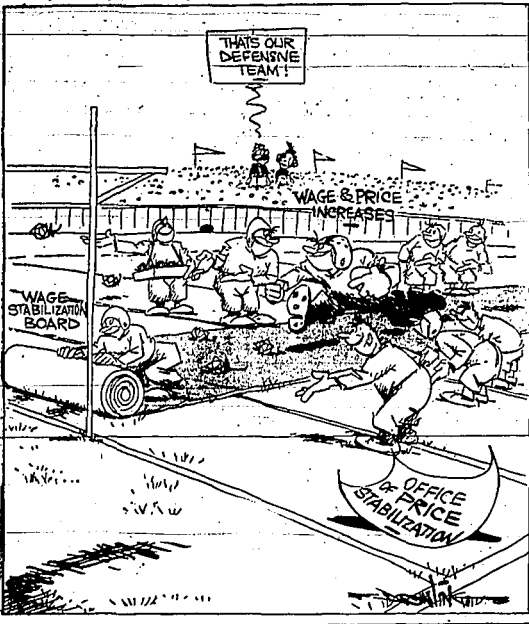

### Idaho PUC Report Attacks U. S. Power Policies as Hinderance for Basin Area

BOISE, Nov. 29 (AP)—The Idaho public utilities commission recommended today that the federal government stop its policy of blocking the power industry in the northwest.

It made the recommendations to a joint congressional committee on defense production looking into the power situation. The committee requested the report.

The commission's report criticized Bonneville power administration and the Helms canyon project in particular and federal power in general.

It accused BPA of trying to block Washington Water Power company from building a transmission line from Cabinet Gorge dam to Spokane.

If BPA is able to prevent WWP from using certain forest service areas, the report said it controls, may have a power plant with no means to transmit its output to power-shed consumers.

It claimed there won't be enough annual storage for Helms canyon, and suggested instead that the Idaho power company be allowed to build the five low-head dams it has proposed.

Saying Idaho was concerned because it participates in the northwest power pool, the PUC claimed the interior department of "working under cover" to block the project in Washington and Oregon—a 120,000-kilowatt project proposed by Portland General Electric company on the Deschutes river, and a 400,000-kilowatt project proposed by Tacoma on the Cowlitz river.

Proposals for a tie-in of California with the northwest power pool were termed "questionable," they were called "a major element in the plans of those people who are attempting to build a socialistic power empire and who have contemplated for 15 or 20 years such an empire embracing the entire western part of the United States."

The commission suggested the best way to remedy power deficiencies would be "removal by congress of the federal government, concentrating its own power program in areas where shortages exist, and where federal expenditures for such a program can be justified."

NEW YORK (AP)—I went down to Wall street the other day to see how a young Phil Beta Kappa is doing in his campaign to make America a land of little capitalists. The idea of not apologetically for capitalism has a made quite a bit of noise and bears of the financial district. 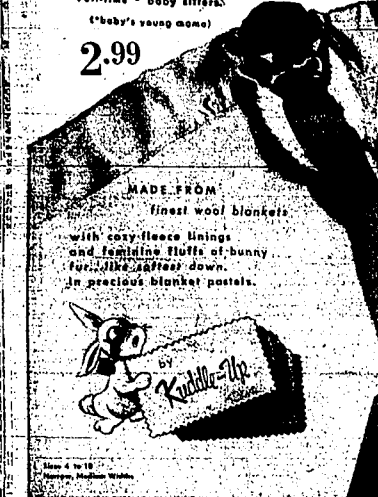
