S. Takes Greatest Air Fight; Red Plan Rebuffed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30 (AP)—American Sabrejet pilots won their greatest air battle of the war today, reporting a total haul of 10 red planes shot down, four damaged and one destroyed. The fifth air force said no allied planes were lost.

The red craft shot down were propeller-driven fighters and light bombers, the first caught in a mass raid on the Manchurian border. Near the close of a day of aerial warfare, 10-16 Sabrejets shot down 10-16 propeller-driven fighters.

Great Change Reported for Arco Atom Plant in Year; Secrecy Covers All Work

REACTOR TESTING STATION, ARCO, Nov. 30 (Special)—In the last year's time, this place has become a hotbed of activity.

When this reporter visited here just 12 months ago, it had all the appearance of a fresh beachhead. Even the phone line to atomic energy commission headquarters in Idaho Falls was temperamental.

That's all changed now. The phone works fine. If it shouldn't, there's a voice radio-circuit and a Pat Murdoe teletype available for outside communications.

Other signs of neatness include: 1. A wonderful new road that cuts distance to Idaho Falls from 80 to 50 miles. The U. S. picked up the tab for all but \$200,000 of this \$2,000,000 project.

2. A fancy new cafeteria with a picture-glass front is just being completed to replace a crowded shack that has specialized in sandwiches and apples.

The new cafeteria will cook for the outfit's installations, rushing hot chow along in special containers.

3. A fleet of sleek green and white buses, operated by the Oregon Motor stages under AEC contract, bring workers to and from neighboring towns for all three shifts.

The roads will be clogged with cars and pickup trucks, thus delaying more important vehicles. A snug waiting room for passengers also is being completed.

4. There's a doctor and nurses at a well-equipped hospital. Each of the installations on the sprawling 440,000-acre tract boasts a nurse.

5. New fire trucks are handy in case of fire. The firemen while away their time with checkers and card games like they do anywhere else.

6. The trailer camps of construction workers that formerly dotted the outskirts of Arco, which is 20 miles from here, are disappearing.

The "fruit-lover" of Midway, which changed its name enthusiastically a while back to Atomic City—wonders if it was worth the trouble.

And there's something else new in the two and one-half year life of this vital project—total secrecy.

ABC says that one of its three reactors—the "breeder"—is undergoing tests. They'll admit work is "well-advanced" on the others, as well as on the huge chemical plant.

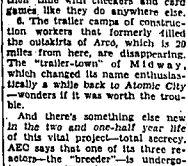
The U. S. will spend \$70,000,000 here.

If successful, the lessons learned in the "breeder" could more than double the U. S. supply of "go-boon" uranium in a few years time.

As for the submarine motor being built here, AEC Chairman Gordon Dean told a press conference a few months ago that the less information made public about it will indicate more and more progress.

For whatever consultation there is in the matter, AEC is saying absolutely nothing now.

As good an authority as Science Editor Bill Lawrence of the New York Times, who was the sole press witness at the first atomic explosion in New Mexico, predicts the sub engine will be completed by the end of next year. He also says that atomic powered aircraft likely will not be far behind.
