These are being sold this year in place of passenger plates. In order to obtain the tabs, car owners must bring their correct 1951 registration to the assessor's office. Tabs will not be sold to car owners who do not have the registration with them, Thompson said.

The assessor's office can sell truck plates for gross weights under 26,000 pounds, including the truck and the load. FIFTH AIR FORCE, Korea, Dec. 13 (AP)—Twelve communist planes shot down in just 16 days—that is the astonishing record chalked up by America's hottest jet ace. Maj. George A. Davis, Jr., Lubbock, Tex., MIA today in two stunning air battles over Korea. That boosted his MIG kill to nine, three more than Maj. James A. Jabara shot down to set the previous record here. Davis also has banded three MIGs today in 12 jet kills, probably destroyed two and damaged one—TU-2 and one MIG. All told, American jet pilots knocked down 12 jet jets, probably destroyed two and damaged one—the biggest all-jet victory in history.

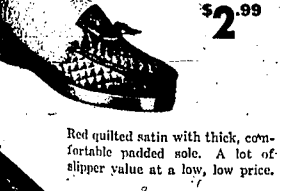
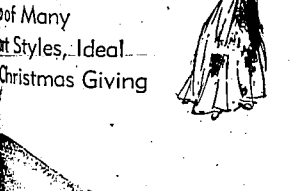

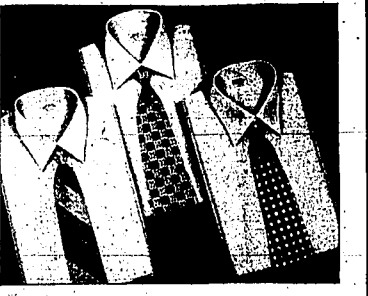

FBI Men Nab Bank Leader On Shortage

THOMASVILLE, Ala., Dec. 13 (AP)—Residents of this town (population 2,400) were shocked today when the FBI arrested the president cashier and a leading contractor in an alleged \$800,000 shortage.

The arrested men are James Stewart, administrator of W. Stuart Gymnasium and the department of justice in investigating the shortage of irregularities in a large RFO loan to Stutta Lumber Industries, Inc.

Arrested were J. Moody Drinkard, 47, president of the Thomasville Bank and Trust company; Mrs. Myrtle M. McCrory, 46, cashier, and owner of the lumber company.

Result from Tip

Senate sources in Washington said the arrest resulted from a tip to the federal deposit insurance corporation by the senate special committee on the activities of the Federal Reserve Bank, headed by Senator Hoey, D., N. C.

The subcommittee had investigated the bank's activities in connection with an inquiry into reports, Hoey said, that Rep. Frank W. Boykin, R., Ala., had made a \$100,000 loan to the bank.

The Stutta Lumber company has a 100-acre tract of land and lands owned by Boykin and his family near McClinton, Ala., in the adjoining county.

The FBI charged Drinkard and Mrs. McCrory with making false entries in the bank records and Stutta with misapplication of bank funds in violation of the federal reserve act.

\$10,000 Benefit

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said an investigation showed Stutta received the benefit of \$10,000 of the total shortage through illegal extensions of credit. These extensions were made by Drinkard and Mrs. McCrory in violation of federal law, Hoover said.

Drinkard and Mrs. McCrory declined comment on the charges. They were arraigned before U. S. commissioner and were released on \$10,000 bonds each.

Drinkard was reported by his physician to be ill, and was unable to make the 100-mile automobile trip to Mobile.

Openings Listed By Civil Service

The U. S. civil service commission announced today all the positions of geologist, \$3,410 and \$4,200 a year, and geologist-reporter, \$2,785 to \$3,600 a year.

Geologist positions are located throughout the nation in 15 states in the territories and possessions. Applicants must pass a written test and have completed a college degree or college study or have a combination of education and experience. The maximum age limit is 35 for the \$3,410 jobs and 40 for the \$4,200 jobs.

The shorthand reporter jobs are in Washington, D. C., and vicinity. Applicants must pass a test consisting of dictation for five minutes at 175 words per minute. For jobs paying \$4,200 and higher they must have appropriate experience. Age limits are from 18 to 67.

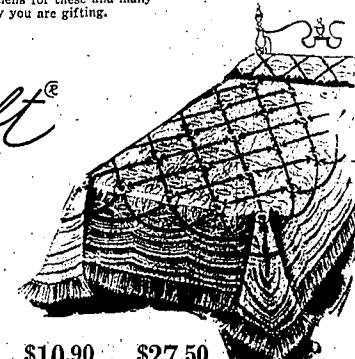

Electrical Inspector Recommends Set Of Safety Rules for Christmas Lights

Harry Smook, city electrical inspector, has recommended a set of safety rules for lighting Christmas trees and for decorating with lights on the outside of the house and in the garden.

And he warns whatever hazard is connected with the Christmas tree is increased many times when Christmas celebrations are held in

halls, churches or places where many children gather.

Smook says it's easy to make holiday lighting installations entirely safe. He suggests these rules to follow all fires and shocks during the Christmas season:

1. When you take the lighting set in the store, inspect it for insulation weaknesses. If the insulation is damaged or if the sockets are broken, discard the set and get a new one.

2. Screw some of the lamps into the sockets and see if any "live" metal of the sockets or lamps is left exposed, which could contact metal tinsel and cause a short-circuit.

3. See if the wire insulation is in

good where the wires enter the sockets. If the insulation will abrade back on the wires, a short-circuit is possible.

4. If usual reflectors are used, see that no metallic contact is made with the "live" metal of the sockets.

5. If an extension cord is necessary to light the tree, see that it is of approved quality. Approved extension cords, like approved cords on appliances, should be labeled with the maker of a recognized testing laboratory.

6. If you want to surround the base of the tree with imitation snow, buy one of the non-combustible ma-

terials readily available. Do not use cotton. If practicable, mount the tree in a pail of water. It will stay fresher and will dry-out and become so inflammable.

Outdoor decorations - 1. For outdoor decorations use only sets designed for outdoor use.

2. Don't connect the wire to the lighting circuit until the installation is complete. If readjustment is necessary, turn off the current first. Special care must be exercised in handling electrical things out of doors to avoid shocks.

3. Mount lamp sockets downward so rain and snow cannot leak in.

(Water is a conductor of electricity.)

4. Extension cords should be of the approved rubber-sheathed type. Do not use braided cables or cables made of insulating materials.

5. Asbestos insulated cords such as used on heating appliances should never be used out of doors or in damp locations. The insulation will absorb water.

6. In selecting either indoor or outdoor decorative lighting sets, see that they are approved by a recognized testing laboratory.

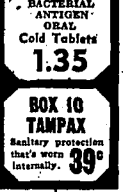

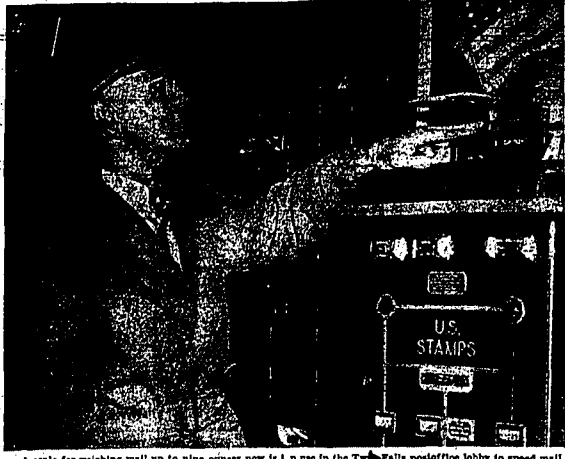

Postoffice Here to Stay Open Longer On Saturday; Scales Placed in Lobby

For the next two Saturdays, the Twin Falls postoffice will remain open until 5 p. m. instead of closing at noon, Postmaster W. W. Prantz, announced. As another added convenience for Christmas-time postoffice customers, a scale for letters and packages up to nine ounces has been placed on top of the stamp vending machines in the lobby. The scale is expected to facilitate service during the rush, especially for persons with airmail letters and packages, Prantz said. Patrons also can weigh their own letters and small packages after hours. The postmaster said, "Too many people are still in the envelope-addressing and a package-wrapping stage" and warned that "Santa Claus may come and go before some people receive their cards and gifts." All parcel post should be in the mail by Tuesday to assure delivery before Christmas day, according to Prantz. Christmas cards for distant states should be posted before Saturday and local greetings should be mailed at least a week before Dec. 25.

A couple of tips to speed postoffice work were offered local residents by Prantz. "If people will tie their Christmas cards in bundles, with all stamps in the upper right hand corner and all envelopes facing the same way, we will be grateful. Holiday headaches are nothing new to postoffice employees, but this one step will speed up the cancellation process," he explained. Correctly addressed letters and packages, written legibly, also are a great help, Prantz said.

Nation Nears Million Death Accident Toll

CHICAGO, Dec. 13 (AP)—The nation's toll of deaths in motor vehicle accidents soon will reach the 1,000,000 mark. The National Safety Council says it may be reached on Dec. 21. But nobody will be able to say with certainty that this man or that woman or child actually was victim No. 1,000,000.

The council has compiled actual figures on deaths from fatal accidents in the United States since the statistics on deaths before that time are based on the best available records and sound-number estimates. They are not actual figures.

Not Certain The person listed as victim No. 1,000,000 might be—off the actual deaths before 1933 was a victim 998,799 or victim 1,000,197. The council counts all deaths in accidents involving a motor vehicle—auto, bus, truck, motorcycle, motor bike, motor scooter.

The council does not intend to name the 1,000,000th victim. It says its only purpose in promoting the day is to call attention to the rise in fatalities to the 1,000,000 mark in the hope that it will "crack the apathy" of the nation.

Weekly Tabulations The council will make its final tabulation before the million-mark is reached. It has been making weekly tabulations but its reporting machinery is not geared for daily gathering of fatality reports.

So, several days before the Associated Press will start gathering figures on deaths across the nation. The AP will file stories on the rise in the toll. On the day it will announce that its count has reached the 1,000,000 mark, and pass along the 1,000,000th name reported to it—if it is a single name.

Trace of Missing Sedan Is Sought

BOISE, Dec. 13 (AP)—Only an unconscious driver in an Oakland, Calif., hospital knows the whereabouts of a missing automobile. The father—Morris L. Hamilton—told his father's car here about a week ago.

He talked with him and his girl friend. He left her and went alone while the car was towed to a garage either in Boise or Meridian. He then returned with a friend to get his girl friend. After taking an hour's drive, he was involved in an accident and knocked unconscious. He hadn't told anyone where he took the car.

The father, Leonard Hamilton, Idaho City, has asked the American Automobile association to help find the car, a 1937 Pontiac with Idaho license 43-14.

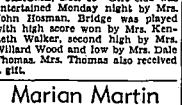

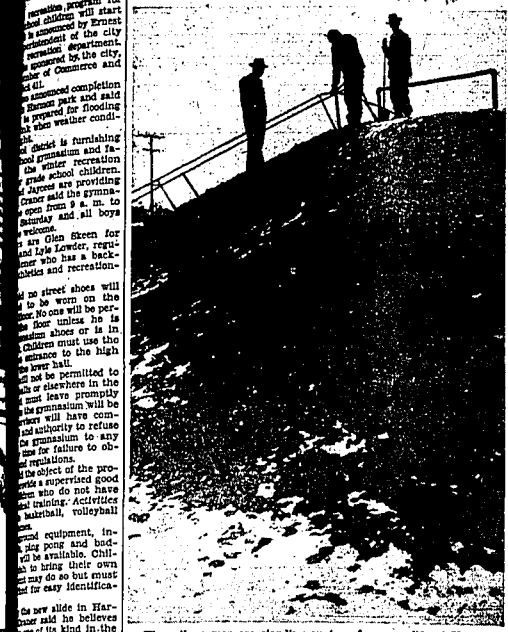

Year Termed 5th Worst on Rate of Polio

BOISE, Dec. 13—An unusually late rise in polio incidence throughout Idaho pushed the number of cases well over the state's total for 1948, making 1951 the fifth worst polio year in Idaho history, according to figures of the Idaho department of vital statistics.

The December incidence is the highest reported for any year since 1947. Seven cases have been reported from widely scattered areas throughout the state, so far this month.

While polio generally is considered a crippling disease, the death rate has climbed to a five-year high. Six polio deaths have been reported to date this year, giving the state a fatality rate of 4.8 per cent.

The state's highest four years in the order of their intensity include 1949, 1947, 1950 and 1934. Vital statistics show during the last five years since 1947, nearly twice as many cases of polio have been reported in Idaho than for the entire preceding quarter of a century.

BOOKS Dec. 15.—Financing polio epidemics and the responsibilities imposed by "long term" patients have been placed before county chapters of the National Foundation for Infantsile Paralysis in their most serious financial position in history, it was disclosed today by Joe Inhof, chairman of the Idaho state polio planning committee.

"Since the inception of the March of Dimes program in Idaho, county chapters have raised and retained \$612,618.28 in their fund raising efforts while headquarters of the March of Dimes organization has advanced \$1,706,180 to its county units throughout the state," Inhof stated, adding, "of this amount \$1,250,000.11 has been expended for financial salaries to Idaho's polio patients only since 1937. During this five-year period, the state has been unable to meet the needs of polio victims leaving nearly twice as many stricken in their wake than had been stricken in the prior quarter of a century."

"Polio patients care problems tend to expand with the number of long term patients, he pointed out, adding, "several Idaho patients are still hospitalized from the 1937, '38 and '39 epidemics."

Last year the audited treasurer's report of all Idaho county chapters revealed that \$81,472.58 had been expended for polio patients' salaries during the year ending June 30, 1937.72 had been expended for patients stricken in prior years. Of these amounts, the national organization supplied more than half of the needed funds in epidemic areas, "it is interesting to note," Inhof said, "that the entire administrative cost of operating Idaho's individual county chapters runs considerably less than one per cent. The state polio planning committee and all county chapters of the National Foundation in Idaho are administered entirely by volunteers. He emphasized, adding only two people are employed in the entire state, a representative and his secretary."

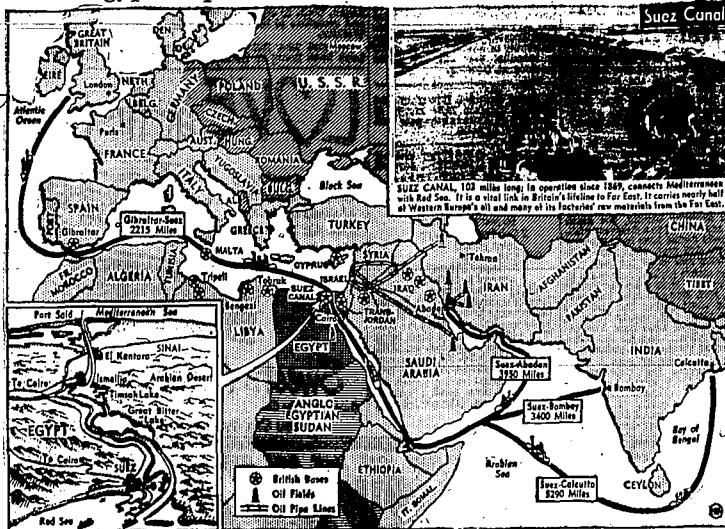
Aside from rendering financial assistance to polio patients and their families, the National Foundation also provides polio equipment such as iron lungs without charge and finances a wide program in the fields of research and professional education.

Nationally, last year 74.3 per cent of the March of Dimes dollar went directly for patient care, 15.4 per cent was earmarked for research and professional education, while only 10.3 per cent was expended for administration. Other costs include medical department services, 1.4 per cent, state offices, 3.1 per cent, and public information health education, 1.3 per cent.
