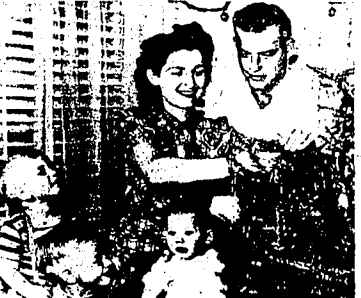

Money Safe in Government Bonds but It's Hard to Prove Good Investment

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (AP)—It would be unparliamentary to say a United States government bond is not a safe place to put your money. It would be a false statement, to boot.
But the way the United States dollar is dropping these days, it would be mighty difficult to prove that a government bond is really a good investment.
An investment is putting money into something for income or profit. Government bonds produce income, all right, but whether they benefit the owner with any real profit is not so evident.
Authority for that statement can be found in the National City bank's December letter on economic con-
ditions and government finance. The bank remarks that the value of the dollar is shrinking and continues to do so.
This shrinkage has been at the rate of about five per cent a year of late and the dollar now is worth only 83 cents in comparison with its purchasing power some years ago.
The bank considers this fact in relation to the prudent man or woman who saves and who, maybe, put the spare money in government bonds. Of the saver, the bank says: "He rationally compares the 2 to 2.5 per cent he can get on government bonds with the 5 per cent a year average rate of shrinkage he has been experiencing in the value of his money."
The dividend rate is far short of merely covering the average rate of shrinkage. And whether putting money up for such as that is really a profitable and income producing investment seems to be, at least, open to question.
Buying a government savings bond or any other bond is a lot better than squirreling your money away in a backyard tin can. Also safer. But the way things are going now, when you step up to the cash window to collect on the 2.5 per cent savings bond for which you laid out \$18.75 just 10 years ago, your \$25 really is worth less than your \$18.75 was back yonder.
The disease which eats away the

real value of an investment in government bonds is called inflation. When it gets going in any nation in a big way, it hits mighty near everyone. It is more deadly than the plague, and causes much more suffering because the suffering lasts longer than with most diseases.
Among the first remedies usually prescribed for government to live strictly within its income—something which has been accomplished in the United States only twice in the past 20 years.

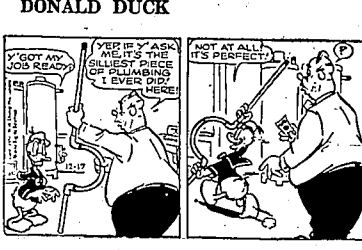

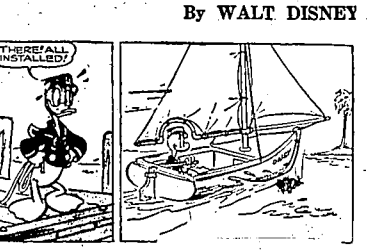

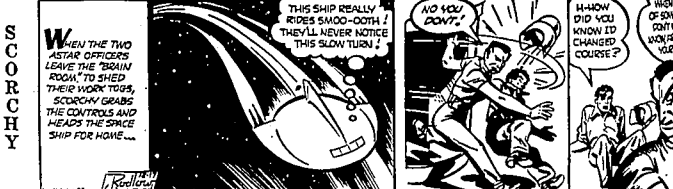

Idaho's Polio Epidemic Aid Fund Is Gone

BOISE, Dec. 17—Idaho's county chapters of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis were advised today that funds available for emergency epidemics will be exhausted and that from now on chapters without funds will have to defer payment of bills until the 1953 March of Dimes campaign, according to David F. Weeks, the foundation's Idaho representative.

Each year since 1947 the majority of Idaho county chapters have used their own funds depleted in meeting the financial responsibilities imposed by polio patients and their families. Last year, the national foundation has advanced to Idaho county chapters in excess of \$120,000 to assist them in providing adequate medical care for well over a thousand patients of the disease stricken in Idaho.

"It is estimated that individual county chapters throughout the entire country will owe in excess of \$1,000,000 by the end of the year. The situation, Weeks explained, is attributable to the tremendous upsurge of the disease in recent years.

"Idaho chapters have been asked to arrange with hospitals to carry chapter obligations until money from the 1953 March of Dimes is available," Weeks said, adding, "All those who urgently need help will continue to receive aid and new cases will receive swift and necessary help."

Aside from rendering financial assistance to polio patients and their families, the March of Dimes supports a professional education and polio research program.

TUTTLE, Dec. 17—Kent Douglas, 21, son of Mrs. Gladys Douglas and former Hagerman high school football star, Idaho's most expensive polio case, has returned to his home in Tuttle.

Douglas has spent the greater part of the last four years in an iron lung. Although he still is suffering from general involvement he has to breathe on his mechanical breathing device only 11 hours a day. An iron lung belonging to the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has been sent to his home for his continued care.

Since Douglas was stricken with polio on Dec. 23, 1947, the Gooding county chapter of the national foundation, through March of Dimes contributions, has made his expensive medical care possible at a cost in excess of \$35,000. C. M. Degler, Gooding county March of Dimes chairman stated.

"For the last 33 months Douglas has been hospitalized at the Elks convalescent home in Idaho where Idaho county chapters of the March of Dimes organization underwrite his care," Degler said.

"We are most grateful for everything the foundation has done for us," Mrs. Douglas said, "and I don't know what we would have done had it not been for the Idaho March of Dimes."

"Gooding county, along with most other Idaho counties, has to depend on the national March of Dimes organization for financial help in meeting patient care responsibilities. Since 1946, the Gooding county chapter has received \$46,225 in polio epidemic aid from headquarters of the foundation for supplementing the amount raised and retained by the local county campaign," Degler said. "The amount of assistance received during the last four years far exceeds the total amount raised in the county since the inception of the March of Dimes program in the late 1930's."

New York State Leading List of Tax Delinquents

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (AP)—The internal revenue bureau reports today that 26 per cent of the \$621,644,697 it has outstanding in delinquent taxes is in New York state.

The delinquency figure is the largest in history.

The bureau, in a district by district breakdown of tax delinquency, reported the total for New York's six districts as \$154,612,424. The New York taxes are owed by 140,243 delinquents.

The report revised downward by approximately \$11,000,000 a previous announcement of delinquents totaling \$637,263,000.

The report, issued as of Oct. 31, listed \$97,500 demands on delinquent taxpayers throughout the country.

It showed delinquencies of \$205,413,855 in income taxes, \$89,885,321 in withheld payroll taxes and \$203,414,723 in other federal taxes.

The district figures on delinquencies issued by the bureau show 1,822 delinquents have \$29,483 total tax delinquencies including \$306,572 income tax, \$116,663 payroll tax and \$12,646 other taxes.
