One-Two Blow Tossed at North Storm Area; Deaths Reach 206

Nature tossed a one-two punch—snow and a cold—at northern sections of the nation today. Recent weather deaths mounted to 206. Fresh snow fell on the northern plains and in the northern Rocky mountain area. Strong winds, with drifting snow, were reported in the Dakotas and Montana. Snow also was falling in New England. The polar parade of bad weather was in its sixth day in many areas, and the end was not in sight.

Real Christmas Promised for Children Found in Icy Home

SIoux CITY, Ia., Dec. 19 (AP)—An angry official today promised that Santa Claus will unload a whole bundle of Christmas gifts on five small children, found shivering and hungry by themselves in their ice-encrusted frame home.

The children, 3 to 14, walked happily for the biggest Christmas of their lives while their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Francis Bennett, were held in jail on charges of child neglect.

Court authorities accused them of the "most shocking case of child neglect" they had ever investigated after police found three of the children lying dead and cold in their two-room home.

The two other children were found near the home carrying bread and beans they had borrowed from a friend of the family.

The five children are Patricia, 3, Wilbur, 6, Mary June, 14, Leslie, 10, and Donald, 8. They have four other brothers and sisters who were staying with grandparents when authorities found the shivering youngsters Saturday.

A neighbor who telephoned police told officers that Bennett went to the home seldom and that Mrs. Bennett had not been seen there for several days.

He was arrested Saturday at a hotel with Joseph Johnson, 52.

Russians Say Pair of U. S. Spies Caught

MOSCOW, Dec. 15 (AP)—The Soviet supreme court said today that two spies with Russian sounding names have been put to death as American saboteur-spies parachuted into Russia.

The announcement from the military collegium of the supreme court said they were dropped into Russia from an American plane manned by American flight officers. Their names were given as A. L. Osmannov and P. K. Saranov.

Nikolai M. Kuznetsov, state department press officer in Washington, said the state department knows nothing about the incident and said he never heard of two men with those names.

The Russians have accused the United States in the United Nations of using some of the \$100,000,000 appropriation to pay for treason in the Soviet bloc. The act is to pay for nations of east Europe for helping western defense.

The two men were killed in August shortly after dropping into Russia's Moldavia republic, a small state in eastern Europe, near the Romanian border, the Russians said.

Foreign papers, guns, pistols and large sums of money were found on them when they were picked up. The Soviet court said the two men were recruited from parachute camps in western Germany by American intelligence agents. They were given special training by American agents in map making, use of firearms, parachute jumping, avoiding airplane, error and spying.

Both were said to have testified at their trial that after carrying out their assignments they were reported to U. S. agents at East, Turkey.

The court gave no details on how the men were caught, how they were tried, nor when and how their death sentences were carried out.

I believe I'd be better off with no brain at all. The little fellow I have is always getting me in trouble, sometimes right grievous.

Only yesterday he rascally collie got together and decided that I should try water skiing, which is a great sport here on Acapulco Bay. Water skiing, if you are lucky enough not to know what it is, is aquatic assault and battery.

You put on a bathing suit, climb your reason along with your wallet and watch, put on a pair of skis, and head for the horizon behind a speedboat driven by a Mexican man.

It is a sport which calls for coordination, balance and nerve, none of which I have. I am awfully pleased when I am able to sit in a rocking chair for five minutes without tiring out backwards, so you can see that I had just about as much success on water skis as a returned rascion on the supreme court.

I warned my speedboat driver to go VERY slowly—that I had no desire to make Perkiwig or Honolulu by sundown, but was perfectly satisfied with my diggings at the Hotel De Las Americas.

The driver was either deaf, indifferent or didn't hear me. We took off, and the plural is exactly right. But we didn't take off in the same direction. The boat, standing almost straight up on its plane, went east, I standing almost straight down on my stomach, soared from the skis like a bustling blimp and snuck into the boat.

Flash slapped me in the face with indignation. The skis, as if unwilling to lose such a choice victim, plunged after me and fought one clear to the bottom.

If Yule Greeting Card Bites You, Don't Be Alarmed; Many Novelties on Market

If a Christmas card bites you this year, don't be alarmed. It's just another indication of the whimsical ingenuity of the greeting card manufacturer.

About a billion Christmas cards are landing the U. S. mails, and of these at least a million are of the variety known as "novelties."

Some of these have a concealed spring device which raps the unwary recipient smartly on the thumb. Others emit flying paper butterflies, elves or Santas. And still others play "Jingle Bells" or recite "Merry Christmas."

Now if the manufacturer could just invent a self-addressing and self-mailing card, it would be a merry Christmas indeed for the millions of citizens at present toiling laboriously through the annual task of addressing, stamping and mailing.

They might also include in each box of cards a list of rules on creating card etiquette, such as those worked out recently by one manufacturer, Alvin Barker, as follows:

1. When signing an informal card, the wife's name comes first, thus: "Mary and John Jones." But in a formal card the signature is "Mr. and Mrs. John Jones."
2. Do not combine printing and engraving in personalized cards. Addresses are never written in pencil. Cards should be addressed by hand.
3. Children should sign their cards simply with their full names and no prefix such as "master" or "miss." But when sending a card to a child, the address should carry the prefix "Mr.," or "Miss" or "Master."
4. Cards always should be sent by first-class mail. If you can't afford a three-cent stamp, don't send a card.
5. Always include a return address, in case the card fails to reach its destination.
6. A brother and sister or a family may send out a joint card, but engaged couples always should send individual cards.
7. Christmas cards need not be acknowledged by the recipient.
8. Never send Christmas cards, even the solemn or religious kind, to persons in mourning for less than three months.
9. A widow signs her cards "Mary Jones" or "Mrs. John Jones" but never "Mrs. Mary Jones."
10. Avoid highly glazed or gaudy cards which cannot be processed through regular postoffice machinery, as they cause increased delay and often get damaged.

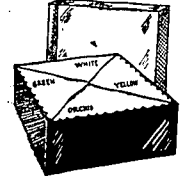

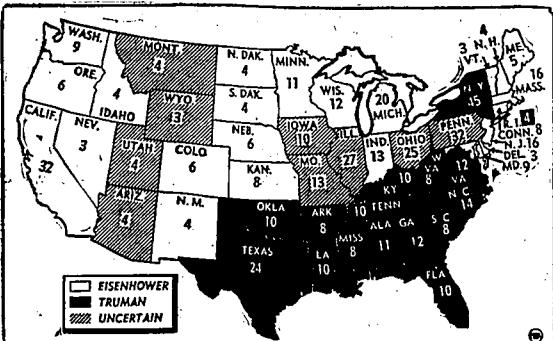
Workers' Truman's Word on Gift

Senator Urging Studies, Change in Controls Law

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Senator O'Mahoney, D., Wyo., says Congress should undertake a new study of price stabilization program and possibly make some changes in the economic controls law.

O'Mahoney didn't say just what he has in mind, but he acknowledged some proposals might be concerned indirectly with wool.

O'Mahoney talked with reporters after a call on Price Director Mitchell W. DeLoe. He said he urged DeLoe to make no change in present wool price ceilings until Congress has had time to consider changes in the law.

The senator said a rollback in present wool prices would cause confusion in the minds of the public and impose hardships on the woolen textile industry.

The office of price stabilization has been considering a reduction in the ceilings for several weeks to bring them closer to current market prices. World wool prices have dropped sharply since the ceilings went into effect last spring.

Not a single American or other U. N. soldier was killed in action during the 24 hours ended at 6 p. m. (4 a. m. EST) yesterday. No American deaths were reported on Sunday, either, but that was a first, no-fatality day since last August.

Silver and Gold Output Increases

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Silver and gold production both increased during October.

The bureau of mines says the increased reflected full time operations at most of the big metal mines in the western states.

Silver production totaled 3,288,000 fine ounces. There were increases of 14 per cent in California, 13 per cent in Arizona, 22 per cent in Idaho, 30 per cent in Montana, 27 per cent in New Mexico, 22 per cent in Washington, 4 per cent in Nevada, and 7 per cent in Utah. Colorado output dropped 8 per cent.

Gold production totaled 181,278 fine ounces, with increases of 13 per cent in Arizona, 69 in Idaho, 12 in Montana, 8 in Nevada, 8 in South Dakota, 15 in Utah and 20 in Washington.

Colorado gold output declined 18 per cent.

Dismissal for 90 West Pointers Is Termed Mistake

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif., Dec. 19 (AP)—West Point made a "horrible mistake" when it ousted 90 cadets for cribbing without trial, according to New York Attorney Robert Daru.

Daru, whose New York bar committee investigated the scandal, told the Beverly Hills Bar association yesterday that his committee probably would recommend that Congress reinstate all the men involved.

"The lawyer said his committee had determined there was no actual cheating in the ordinary sense."

"What happened," Daru explained, "was that some of the students at their meals talked with other students who had taken the examination the day before."

"I hold no brief for cheating," Daru continued, "but it seems to me a matter of elemental justice to try these men under their ancient honor code which required that one cadet be on the committee conducting the hearing."

Chase National Bank, New York, was the first to announce the increase from the 2 1/2 per cent rate which had prevailed since Oct. 17. Prior to then it had been 2 1/2 per cent.

Other leading banking houses, including some in Philadelphia, immediately took similar action.

It was expected that the rise soon would become nationwide as the going New York rate usually sets the pattern for the entire country.

Bankers said the higher rates are necessary to meet mounting operation costs.
