

We are not proposing here that Russia be given one inch in the struggle to keep men free. The trouble is not with that goal. The trouble is with men who pay it lip scrites but do not believe it attainable. No one can be sure they will not have to be. But the future of this country and its western friends is not secure in the hands of men who work from the conviction of war's inevitability.
