Limony could add to findings of the committee. Childs said he knows of school officials, physicians and driving leaders who are willing to tell the committee of their experiences with the state health department. Hawkins also stated because other Magic Valley county commissioners were among those calling for an investigation, he feels he and Post should not be the only witnesses called from this area. He said as far as he knows he is the only Magic Valley county commissioner asked to testify. He later stated: "In view of the fact that commissioners from five counties in this area have registered their dissatisfaction in a resolution, we are at a loss to understand why the committee is asking only for a representative for Twin Falls county to appear. "These are only a few of the reasons why we feel that this investigation should be continued in this area. Where dissatisfaction with methods of the present administration seem to be widespread, for the above stated reasons we feel that it would be a waste of both your time and ours for Mr. Post and me to appear under such conditions. "We also want to make it clear

that we have not been satisfied with the way the commission has handled its activities in this area. "The commission is administrative director of public health. No Grant Alleged In other comment, Commissioner Palmer said: "We never have made any allegations concerning graft, corruption or anything of that kind. We are not interested in anything with our experiences with the administration of the state public health department — on budgets, conflicting statements and the loss of control on low-county funds are spent. "Palmer likened the allegation to taxation without representation and said: "We intend to take a more active interest, handle policies and psychology on a local basis as much as possible, and in general, eliminate the pressure and control from the state office. "Payment Asked To describe conditions typifying those which have brought the commissioner's dissatisfaction, he said a letter dated Jan. 2 was received by the county auditor from J. R. Burdard, health department fiscal officer seeking payment of county funds ordinarily not approved until the second Monday in January. Burdard wrote: "We wonder if it will be possible for us to bill on an emergency basis for January salary advances. This claim is payable. We would insure that we could meet our obligations to those employees for their January salaries promptly. Childs explained these funds

would be payable ordinarily on Feb. 1, but that the commission was willing to cooperate by forwarding the money as soon as possible after Jan. 14. "He said since social security deductions went into effect for state employees some counties, including this one, have sent their health unit salary funds to Boise for central clearing. "Asks Questions "In further explanation of dissatisfaction arising from handling of funds, Hawkins stated Peterson, a few weeks ago in seeking approval from Magic Valley county commissioners for hiring a medical director for the local unit, stated the \$6,000 to \$8,000 annual salary would be available from state sources but save conflicting statements as to the specific source. "That's only one reason why we want the investigating committee to hold hearings here — that we

could produce a number of local witnesses on various such matters," he declared. "Hawkins said it was only last September that Peterson and Burdard came to local commissioners wanting additional county money or resultant loss of personnel at the local unit, because of the inability of the state to pay their salaries. "The question arises," said Hawkins, "if the state office was broke

in September, had \$8,000 extra in state December, and now in January needs an advance so it can pay its bills — what is going on? "He said this sort of thing is typical of reasons why county commissioners have lost confidence in the health department's administration. 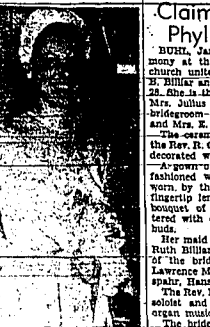

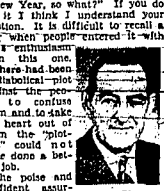

Shaken by milk coats, graft and corruption in high places—shaken by the ever-chasing spiral of inflation and the descending value of the dollar—shaken by declining money, the stalemate in Korea, the forlorn hope for peace, not to mention the tax problem.

In such a situation some may be tempted to take the Shakespearean character to heart and ask which is better, "to be or not to be," and conclude it better to shuffle off this mortal coil, than to remain and face with courage the problems that beset us.

One thing is certain: The making of a better world and the achieving of a good year can never be done by those who wring their hands in despair or run away from the problem.

Let me give you the encouraging words of a man who "faced the problems of life without flinching." I am thinking of the Apostle Paul as he wrote his second letter to the Corinthians (4:7-9): "We have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; struck down, but not destroyed."

All of us could take courage from his statement of a great truth: The power belongs to God, and we too often think it belongs to us. Too often our afflictions crush us; many the time our perplexities do drive us to despair. And we imagine when we are persecuted that we are forsaken, struck down, but not destroyed.

It need not be so. The same Paul said in the same Corinthian letter, "God is not the author of confusion, but of peace." Let us stand with him and we will have peace. We are not forsaken. God has said that His mercy endureth forever, and I, too, with you always. If we have been guilty of apreading

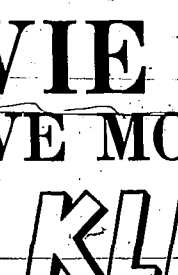

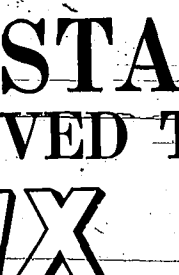
