A resolution opposing construction of the proposed Hells canyon dam and power plant was adopted by Idaho Contractors Association at its dinner meeting at the Park hotel this week.

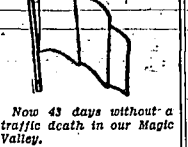

division was held at Mrs. Ernest Hest, Boise, state commander of the society; L. J. Peterson, administrative director of the state health department; Mrs. Ann Angus, Boise, associate state commander, and Henry Blanchard, Boise, a national representative of the society.

Dr. White, speaking on personal experience against cancer, emphasized the necessity of patients specifically asking their doctors for a complete physical examination. He observed that most people who go in for a physical checkup seldom request a complete cancer examination.

Dr. White said that he has seen many patients who have been diagnosed as having cancer and who are dying because they have not been given a complete examination. He said that complete examinations of that sort are an ideal means for uncovering symptoms of cancer which the individual may not realize were present.

Dr. Harold P. Hohlberg, Wendell, said that the group has thousands of persons die of stomach cancer each year. He said that stomach cancer occurs in 20 per cent of the men who are cancer victims and 12 per cent of the women. Dr. Tyler, director of the state tuberculosis hospital, said cancer of the lung is more common in men over 60 and second in prevalence to cancer of the stomach. He said lung cancer has risen from 2 to 15 per cent of all cancer incidence.

The afternoon session was devoted to problems of community protection against cancer, with occasional discussions on national phases.

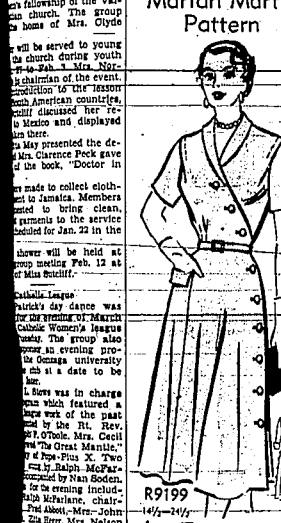

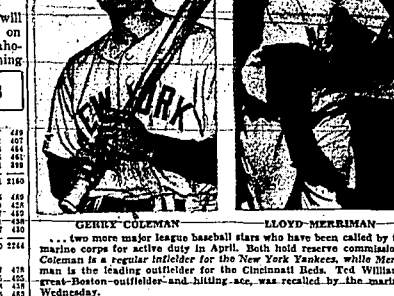

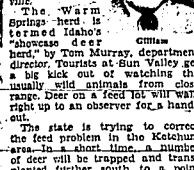
