Air Force Helicopter Rescues

BOISE, Jan. 19 (AP)—An air force helicopter landed just before dark with Mrs. Gene Jack and her son, Douglas, climaxing a week-long rescue mission to bring them back from an isolated snowbound mine in Idaho's Sawtooth mountains.
Capt. John A. Peacock, Riverside, Calif., the helicopter pilot, said he made seven passes at a make-shift emergency landing area in the narrow canyon at Rocky Bar before he was able to set the craft down.

Snow Avalanche Kills 3
Ski Instructor Recovered

SUN VALLEY, Jan. 19—Tragedy struck this resort community Saturday afternoon when tons of snow slid down the south side of Baldy mountain and struck the lives of at least three skiers.

Rumors that eight persons were caught in the slide and that four bodies already had been removed from the enormous pile of snow, have been denied by officials at the Sun Valley resort.
Practically all the snow which had been piled up on the mountain, according to officials at the Sun Valley resort, had been removed by Saturday afternoon.

"I was suspected of knowing things dangerous for me to know," said 23-year-old Einar Clayton Erickson, Ruth, Nev.

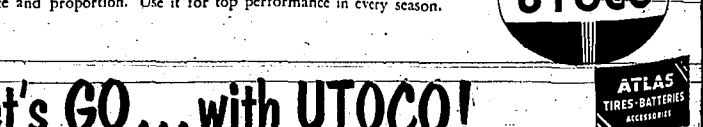

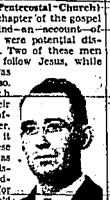

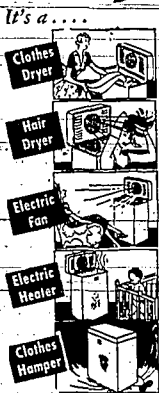
