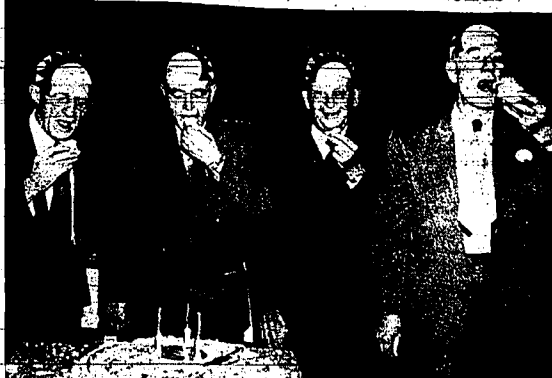

T. F. Display Planned for '52 Mercury

A new look, emphasizing high prominent fender lines, a low flat hood with an airplane-like projection and double front bumpers without a grille, is featured on 1952 Mercury models which go on display Wednesday at the Douglas-Deit Motor company, 251 Third avenue south.

Other notable changes in the exterior appearance include airplane type ornamentation on the side, hard top styling on sport coupes and a fuel filler hidden behind the rear license plate.

Horsepower in the V-8 type engine has been increased from 112 to 123 through a jump in the compression ratio from 8.5 to 10.1 and other refinements.

Among the innovations in 1952 models is the suspension of brake and clutch pedals from a bracket between the instrument and dash panel to allow more floor room.

The master brake cylinder is mounted on the front of the dash panel to permit easier servicing and prevent being and dirt clogging.

As in 1951, Mercury cars will be available in three transmissions, touch-matic overdrive, mechanical automatic and standard.

In addition to a two-door sedan and two four-door sedans, two sport coupes, a convertible and two delivery station wagons are listed among the new models. They are available in 27 colors.

All doors on the new models are hinged at the front. The double bumpers in front has slots between the two sections replacing the grille. A one-piece, curved windshield is used in front of the dash panel.

More than 27 per cent increase in visibility has been achieved through window design. Seats adjust on an inclined curved track giving more horizontal and vertical variation.
