Chancellor of the Exchequer R. A. Butler, speaking in the House of Commons, said that the program was a "middle road" between a complete return to Keynesian economics and a return to the austerity of the 1930s.

- Christenbery said he suggested to Matthews that he should accept a fight with the Madison Square Garden that a match, he said, would be a good one for the state to the coast; 20 per cent of the gate was not enough.
- Christenbery said that if Matthews did fight in New York, his manager, Jack Hurley, would have to certify under oath that he was not receiving more than one-third of the business carried by the manager's limit in this state. Hurley reportedly collects 50 per cent of his fighter's take.

### School Needs Are Outlined To Filer PTA

FILER, Jan. 20—Filer district schools were discussed by Supr. Maurice Walsh at a meeting of the Filer-Central PTA Monday night. In speaking on what a modern school should contain, Walsh said that the children's home during the day should be designed for his benefit and not as a monument to civic pride.

There is no place for school rooms with leaded glass windows, hot sun exposures, drab walls and wind through cracks in windows, he said. Yet, the supervisors maintained, some of these conditions can be found at Hollister, Harco, Central and Victory schools.

False fronts. There is no place in modern school construction for false fronts, useless ornaments, large corridors and wasted "air" space, the superintendent continues. Filing stations do a better job for automobiles than many school buildings do for children because they are designed to do a job for automobiles.

The superintendent said people demand the latest design in automobiles and are content with "late" designs in schools. He said planning must go into school buildings so the primary purpose of schools—teaching of children—can be carried out.

Regimentation. Since a child spends a considerable part of his time in school the design should be conducive to learning, Walsh said. He strongly protested the regimented environment of some school rooms where desks are set in rigid rows five across and seven deep.

Needs sound in a school should be reduced by soundproofing and color should be given careful consideration. Children, he said, are susceptible to color, but many are forced to spend their days in drab, colorless rooms.

Light, air, sound and color are necessary in the modern school room, he continued, and added that he had spent some time in and near Salt Lake City recently, studying the school building program there. The Filer district is contemplating the building of a new school at Filer. All steps necessary for construction of the building have been completed, including the sale of \$400,000 worth of bonds.
