Speed Sought For Colorado River Project

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7 (AP)—Official plans to speed up the development of the upper Colorado river project are being pushed by the federal government and the states of Colorado, Utah, Arizona, Nevada and New Mexico. The plan is to push ahead with the project as fast as possible to meet the need for water storage and power.

The project is estimated at more than \$1 billion. It would provide for the storage of water in a series of reservoirs and the construction of a dam at Grand Coulee, Wash., to provide for the generation of electricity.

State Warning Is Sounded on Mail-Order Insurance Policies

BOISE, Feb. 7 (AP)—Some mail-order insurance policies are good and some are bad, and any Idahoan who buys them, does so at his own risk, State Insurance Commissioner Leo O'Connell said today.

"Mail order companies aren't licensed by the state and we have no control over them," he told a reporter.

O'Connell said there has been an increase recently in direct mail advertising to prospective customers. Most of the companies sell hospitalization and automobile accident policies, he said.

"Some of them offer pretty good deals, but it's hard to pick the good ones," O'Connell said. "The big flaw is that they offer no local service."

Any claim, he said, must be taken up with the home office, and if there's a dispute about them "there's no one to fall back on."

"It's possible to sue the direct-mail company, but by serving the legal papers on them through the commissioner's office."

"That doesn't mean anything though," said O'Connell, "since the companies aren't large enough to bother bringing a suit."

Meat Production Drops for Idaho

BOISE, Feb. 7 (AP)—The U. S. agriculture department reported today that dressed meat production in Idaho during 1951 totaled 64,400,000 pounds. This compared with 67,800,000 pounds in the previous year.

In December there was a sharp pickup in dressed meat output as compared with November, but the total was still five per cent under December, 1950.

The output last December amounted to 6,440,000 pounds, or 22 per cent above the previous month.

Allied Reporters Receive Warning

TOKYO, Feb. 7 (AP)—Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, headquarters, officially warned United Nations news correspondents today against "infiltration and trafficking with the enemy" at the Korean armistice conference village of Panmunjom.

A memorandum to correspondents from Col. George P. Welch, OHQ public relations officer, said allied correspondents might "inadvertently" divulge information that could endanger U. N. forces in "unguarded conversations during such unnecessary, social sessions."

Welch's memorandum was a surprise to allied newsmen who on numerous occasions have been questioned by U. N. general officers about what communist correspondents had to say. Some allied officers had specifically asked United Press correspondents to query red newsmen on their views.

SALT LAKE CITY, Feb. 7 (AP)—The navy was invited today to bomb "one of our salt water" shipping lanes instead of Idaho's famed Kamloops trout.

The invitation was printed in the form of an open letter from Gus P. Backman, secretary of the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce, to Ad A. Kimball, secretary of the navy.

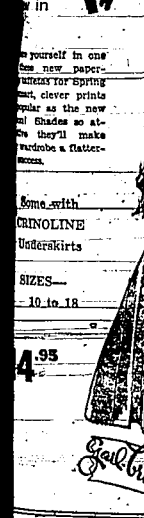

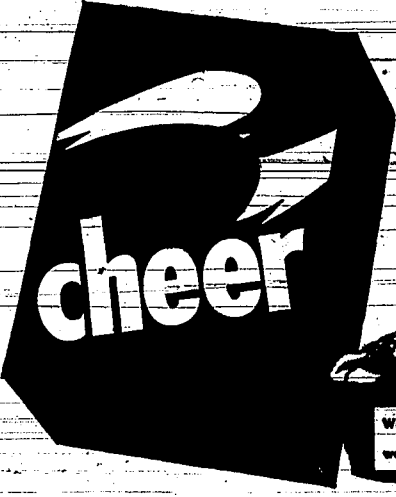

Small Prince Not Aware of Great Change

LONDON, Feb. 7 (AP)—A chubby little prince scrambled over the nursery floor today, unaware that the death of his grandfather has made him one of Britain's richest boys with a legacy of grave responsibility.

Three-year-old Prince Charles, now heir-apparent to the British throne, spent the day much as usual, playing with his small sister, Anne, in a dachshund, and at Sandringham house, the Norfolk mansion where King George VI died.

The prince automatically became the Duke of Cornwall, entitled to the full revenues of the duchy of Cornwall. Mostly rents, the revenues of the duchy amounted to \$20,000 a year just before World War II and now probably total around \$60,000, but Charles won't see the money. The estates are administered by a trustee who looks after crown property. He eventually will get a fixed allowance instead.

At this stage the little boy's life will not be changed much by his step toward the British throne. It will mean, eventually, that he will be moving with his family from Clarence house, their London home, across the street to Buckingham palace.

One of the immediate effects for him will be to bring his mother back home again. Much of Charles' three years has been spent waiting for his mother to return from her royal tour of engagement.

Charles already has learned a lot of the duties expected to carry him through the heavy duties awaiting a British king. He has learned to be polite when a car sweeps him through a street lined with cheering Britons. He must never throw tantrums like other children, no matter how tired and bored he may be.

Nevertheless, he is just as full of fun and mischief as other kids. One of his favorite pranks is to run around Clarence house peering through the doors and windows, rushing into rooms which are deserted when they answer the call.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7 (AP)—President Truman is getting pretty weary of delays in the rebuilding of the White House. He wants to move madam and the lady (Ursula's Mrs. Truman and Margaret) back into the mansion the first week of April.

The president's impatience was reflected yesterday when he took White House newsmen on a 45-minute tour of the residential section from which the Trumans moved shortly after his 1948 election victory.

He cited two examples of why the family had to take refuge in the Blair house across the street on Pennsylvania avenue.

He stamped his foot sharply on the floor of the residential room of the Blair house when he saw his daughter, Margaret's, suite.

This will hold, he said. He recalls that one day the legs of Margaret's piano had broken through the floor in 1948, narrowly missing Truman often entertained guests.

He said he kidded the madam about what she would have done if she had been entertaining the Daughters of the American Revolution and he had suddenly appeared through the ceiling in a bathtub.

"Truman didn't think it too funny," he said, and told him "he wouldn't have enjoyed the experience any more than a would do."

BOISE, Feb. 7.—Selection of national committeemen, state chairman and all political party offices by direct primary was urged today by Secretary of State H. H. Masters.

"I realize that the GOP (Republican party) favors 'unsavory' tactics in political conventions and will perhaps oppose the primary system," Masters said in a prepared statement. "Masters is the sole elected Democrat in Idaho's statehouse.

"If we are to continue the present convention system, I do not favor reducing the number of delegates to each state convention as advocated recently by the Republican State Chairman Milton Hines."

Masters said he favored the primary system for this year's GOP convention will be 200 and the chairman announced that this number of delegates is unlikely.

"The Republican convention will consist of 220 delegates this year. A convention of less than 300 delegates is not a true representation of the voice of the people of Idaho," Masters declared.

Masters said he favored an amendment to the present state election laws which would give at least two delegates for each county to the state convention regardless of its population or vote.

Controlled by Law

"Number of delegates to each county receives one delegate for each 400 votes cast for the party's candidates in the preceding election."

"Anything which will tend to increase the interest in elections and give a larger percentage of the popular vote will be a move in the right direction," Masters said.

In the last general election for President in 1948 was only 40.2 per cent of the total population of the state, Masters said.

Atomic Plant To Get New I. F. Offices

IDAHO FALLS, Feb. 7.—L. E. Johnson, manager of the AEO Idaho operations office, has announced signing an agreement with Robert Johnson Associates, Boise, to construct a new office building to be constructed in Idaho Falls.

The agreement was signed following analysis of seven proposals, six of which called for construction of new buildings, and one for remodeling of an existing structure.

Lowest bid... The accepted office, calling for leasing of 41,000 square feet of net office space at an annual cost of \$152 per square foot, was the lowest of the proposals received.

The agreement calls for construction of a two-story-and-basement, frame and masonry-block building on Freeman avenue and Second street, approximately 400 feet in length and 40 feet in width.

The office will be used both by the AEO and its contractors. At present, the AEO is housed in the Rogers building and contractors have offices in other locations in Idaho Falls.

Reduces Costs... Johnson pointed out that the new building will provide better working conditions for his men between various offices. In addition, the square-foot cost of the office space will be less than in other buildings in the area.

Additional savings will result in reduced messenger and other communications, and security requirements.

In effect, the agreement provides for a nine-year lease, from Oct. 1, 1952, to June 30, 1961, and an option for leasing for a further period of five years, if the AEO so elects.





...the world's first conversion of nuclear energy into electric power.

Zinn declined to speculate on how soon nuclear-powered submarines may become a reality.

"I can't answer that," he said, "because I happen to know the target date."

But he discussed the "breeder" reactor at Arco, Idaho, designed to produce more fissionable material than it consumes. Because of limited uranium supplies, it is considered of vital importance in the atomic energy program.

"Zinn said he is 'fairly confident' that a year's experience with the breeder reactor will give us 90 per cent of the information necessary to say whether this type of nuclear fuel breeding can or cannot be done."

For the rest of the information needed, he said, he believes it will be necessary to build a nuclear breeder reactor on a commercial scale. This type of breeding is describable from an economic standpoint.

"We expect that this breeder will produce more fissionable material than it consumes," he said. "But the real question is how much more."

Zinn said he doubts "very much" whether "we will ever tell the world

The current college graduates can just about write their own ticket in the 1952 job market, a survey shows today.

It was definitely a "graduates' market" for the mid-winter term of students leaving school, particularly for engineer and scientific graduates. Some have as many as 20 job offers. They was considered common.

Salaries are correspondingly exciting. The average was around \$325 a month with many up to \$400.

Others differ.

The demand for graduates in the arts was not quite so heavy as for the technical fields, but it was very brisk.

Job placement officials agreed the call for college-trained people was the greatest of all time, brought on by the defense effort and the draft.

"The situation has never been as good as this and I don't think it will ever be as good again," said C. H. Kaufmann, placement director at the University of Virginia.

All fields active.

The demand is greatest in the technical field, but there is no field in which there is not a great demand," Kaufmann said.

Employer representatives crowded onto campuses, interviewing like graduates and "fighting" for the top men. As many as six such representatives called at university placement offices daily, offering their lures.

Ranking right behind the engineers and physicists as the most sought-after graduates came the accountants, then business administration students and government majors.

Empire Loss Great During King's Reign

By The Associated Press
In the 15-year reign of King George VI, the British lost most of their Victorian empire and he gave up the title of emperor, but they saved a measure of British leadership around the world.

Nationalistic pressures and World War II changed the picture of British domination.

A Big Areas Lost
Three big areas of empire in 1947 were given their choice for the future. India and Pakistan—nearly 500,000,000 people—chose dominion status within the British-led commonwealth of nations, and Burma chose to be a completely independent republic. India later became a republic but by special arrangement stayed in the commonwealth without allegiance to the English king.

The India-Pakistan-Burma decision took away the title of emperor of India and left King George VI simply a king instead of king-emperor.

Released Palestine
In 1948, Britain gave up the Palestine mandate, and the Zionist state of Israel was born. Rule over Malaya was changed and relaxed. The large remaining imperial colonies mostly are in central and east Africa.

The commonwealth nations and dominions are Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India, Pakistan, South Africa, Ceylon and the United Kingdom (Britain).
