LONDON, Feb. 11 (AP)—King George VI returned to his capital today on his last day as monarch. The public paid homage to the king by lining up at the gates of his palace through crowds of silent strikers.

His train, bearing Queen Elizabeth II and her family, edged slowly into the King's Cross station in a downpour of rain and sleet at 2:45 p. m., after a private funeral service at Westminster. The king, who died Wednesday, was buried in the royal vault at Windsor.

Death Toll in Third N. J. Plane Wreck Reaches 30; Airport Operations Cease

NEWARK, N. J., Feb. 11 (AP)—Operations of the huge Newark airport, although called an umbrella of death over nearby Elizabeth—were shut down today after a third air crash shot a two-month death toll to 115.

Four other national airlines DC-8's sheared into an Elizabeth apartment house early today killing 30 people, including 17 children. Passengers threatened to block the runways with their bodies.

Mayor Kirk Elizabeth said the city could no longer live under "an umbrella of death."

Newark city officials demanded in the demand to close the airport, which handles an average of 3,500 passengers and 27,000 pounds of freight daily.

Truman Asks Extension for Controls Law

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11 (AP)—President Truman asked congress today to extend the controls law because "new inflationary risks" threaten to break out "all through the economy."

In a special message to congress, Mr. Truman urged repeal of three amendments to the defense production (controls) act last year. He said the amendments would give "special treatment to certain favored groups" and hinder the campaign against inflation.

The president said he also wants tighter credit controls, "firm wage and price controls" and a revision of federal livestock accounting for congressional development.

Court Begins Hearing Over Damages Suit

A district court jury of nine men and three women was hearing testimony today in a civil action in which both parties claim damages of \$100,000 as the result of a collision between a truck and a car on the night of Sept. 12, 1951, near Five Points east on a bridge over the Lewis and Clark river.

China's Right In Fact Talk Is Challenged

PANMUNJOM, Korea, Feb. 11 (AP)—The United Nations today challenged communist China's right to take part in the armistice Korean peace conference.

Vice Adm. C. Turner, Joy, head of the U.N. armistice delegation, said the role for China could claim a seat at the peace conference. He said he still contended that the only China in Korea were "volunteers."

"They could not answer 'that question,'" Joy said after the primary session. "It was the one choice left of the day."

9 Men Killed In War Game

CAMP DUMM, N. Y., Feb. 11 (AP)—A make-believe war at this rugged military reservation became a real one today as army officials counted nine dead and about 80 injured in a simulated battle.

Seven men were killed and 25 injured in three separate accidents during the war game, which simulated to their death in an earlier phase of the maneuvers staged to simulate operations under Arctic conditions.

A twin-engine C-48 transport plane crashed while taking off from a runway, killing nine men and injuring 25. Three were killed instantly and a fourth died in a camp hospital. Eighteen were hurt.

FBI Nabs Doctor For Bribe-Taking

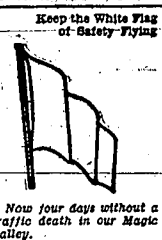

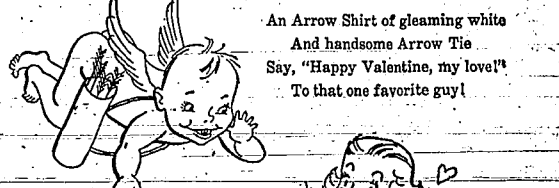

Despite his condition, the youngster has what hospital attendants described as a "10,000,000 smile." He winks at visitors and once managed to squeeze his hand out through the rubber collar of the iron lung to wave to his parents.

Rodney's case is described as different only in that he has been in the respirator since he was very young. His tiny body is growing some in the year and nearly four months he has been in the hospital there has been little change in his condition.

The society has spent \$5,770 in hospital and nursing charges for Rodney's care. He is one of 128 patients who is receiving care through Fresno county's chapter of the Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.
