

WE NEED A SPEED LIMIT

According to a Times-News analysis of Magic Valley's traffic fatalities in 1951, speeders were responsible for 14, of the 41 deaths resulting from automobile accidents on our highways.

This figure does not include those fatal accidents in which speed may have been a factor but was not definitely blamed as the chief cause.

nector put was not definitely blamed as the chief cause.

If the accidents in which speed was a probable cause are included in the total, then speed could be blamed for well over half of Magle Valley's traffic Intalities in 1951.

1951. In any event, speed accounted for more traffic deaths in Magic Valley during 1961 than any other single cause.

This comparison is interesting in several respects.

Inling, it adds emphasis to the respects thing, it adds emphasis to the fact that excessive speed is branded everywhere as "Killer No, 1" on the highway, it should make us realize, therefore, that drivers who violate speed laws that are established for the safety of everyone—including themselves—should be made the primary target of state and local enforcement authorities throughout the nation in their determined effort to save at least 10,000 lives in traffic accidents in 1922.

Unfortunately, Idaho has no effective septed law. It's up to the individual-motorist to determine in nearly all instances on the open road just how fast he can edive and yet not be arrested for reckless operation of his car.

During the last session of the legislature an attempt was made to establish a state speed limit in Idaho, so there might be some snforceable law to employ as a weapon against persistent speeders, but, opposition and indifference resulted in failure.

Anyone who is honest with himself wi gree that every state in the union-shoul ave drastic speed laws so long as speed con inues to be the "No. 1 Killer" on our high

ways.

Penalties, too, must be -commensurate with the crime-stiff -fines for so-cattled inhore speed violations, a year's minimum suspension of driving privileges for more serious speed violations, and permanent revocation of driving licenses for repeaters.






