Solon Claims Federal Government Not Paying Enough Local Taxes for Lands

By DON SHANNON
WASHINGTON, Feb. 18 (Special)—Uncle Sam is paying only about one-third of what he should in local taxes on the vast federal lands in the western states, a Washington state congressman has charged in a letter to the federal government.

Rep. Thor C. Tollefson, R.-Wash., is asking for early hearings by the house subcommittee on bills introduced by himself and other congressmen to correct the situation.

In all 11 western states, 54 per cent of the entire land area is owned by the U. S., 404,033,621 acres out of a total of 732,822,643.

Although no accurate appraisals of the federal domain have been made, Tollefson cited a 1929 report by the National Education association estimating the value at \$2,421,700,000. Private property on the tax rolls in the western states was assessed at \$18,897,942,000.

The estimated taxes payable on federal real estate in the western states is \$9,476,084 or about nine per cent of the total property taxes (\$1,043,702,743) actually charged in these states, Tollefson said.

The government has recognized the unfairness of tax exemption on its land and congress has authorized some payments to local governments, mostly aids to education. The NEA calculated such payments at more than \$20,000,000 a year, but this is far short of the \$93,476,084 which would be due on a regular tax basis.

"Most people will agree that certain classes of federal property should be exempt," the congressman admitted, but he took special exception to the case of revenue-producing property being used by private industry.

Citing two examples in his own state, Tollefson pointed out that the Boeing aircraft plants outside Seattle and a nearby foundry are

operating from local taxation. Both plants were owned originally by the RPO and leased to the private companies. In 1949, they were deeded to the federal government.

"Prior to the transfer, tax payments were made by the RPO to the local taxing body pursuant to congressional authority," the legislator related. "After the transfer, no such payments were made because the particular congressional authority extended to the RPO only while held by the RPO."

The town in which the plants are located lost \$100,000 in annual revenue through the transfer, but still has to provide water, fire protection and other municipal services for the property.

"If congress is reluctant to act upon the overall problem of tax payments based on federal property generally," Tollefson urged, "it should correct such specific situations," the Washingtonian commented.

The states themselves have been lax in bringing out the facts on the problem, Tollefson said only generally, "because of the thorough survey of the federal tax potential within its borders. Oregon and Washington have done some work on appraising U. S. property but other western states have done nothing."

"To obtain such appraisals from the government itself would be well-nigh impossible," the congressman said.

"Four western states—Arizona, Montana, New Mexico and Wyoming—have constitutional prohibitions against taxing federal property. In Tollefson's opinion, this represents an outdated situation."

"Each year the problem becomes more acute and more important. The impact of federally owned land and activities becomes increasingly greater."

"Local governmental units, including school systems, are directly concerned because the general property-tax is one of their major sources of revenue. When the government removes a large amount of property from local tax rolls, the local unit may find it impossible to raise sufficient revenues for the required public services."

In the days of atomic development plants, huge military installations and other activities of "big" government, many small local governments must have tax power over federal property in their jurisdiction or resort to handouts. Western congressmen will have to work together to take their home towns off the dole.

Dr. Herbert A. Wenner, of the department of research and medicine, University of Kansas medical center, in a report received today by the Idaho office of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.
