

During the 10 years 1941-1950, there During the 10 years 1041-1950, there were 15 spectacular and unusual disasters in which a total of about 2,700 persons were killed. Most sensational of these were the Texas City (Texas) fire and explosion, which claimed 301 dead in 1047, and the Gocoanut Grove night club fire and panic in Boston, which took 402 lives.

which took 492 lives.

The nation properly demanded that measures be taken to prevent recurrence of these disasters in other communities, and preventive machinery hummed into action promptly and thus far successfully.

promptly and thus far successfully.—
During precisely those same 10 years there was another much greater disaster that aimost passed unnoliced. It was the 309,032 persons who were killed in motor vehicle accidents throughout the oounity-in-exactly the same length of time. That is about 111 times the number of persons who died in the 13 accidents that were officially labeled major disasters.

for disasters. The point is that the 309,032 were killed here and there, at the rate of about 100 per day, and thus lacked the spectacular touch. As a result, there was no unified public demand for protection against recurrence and the killing on the streets and highways today is even worse.

Can it be that we, as a people, have become so inured to slaughter in traffic that, we scarcely lift an eyebrow over 309,532 killed in a mere 10 years, yet, shudder at an explosion that claims 501? If that is true, then it is time we made the duly traffic record spectacular by publishing it in 8-column headlines at the top of page one in every newspaper in the country, day after day, until public demand for correction becomes so overwhelming that mensures to stop it are made effective.






