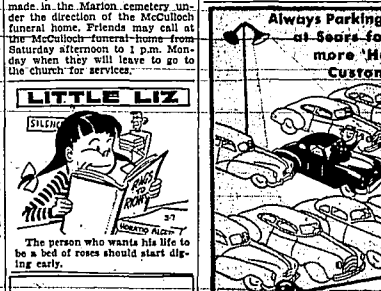

GERMAN ARMAMENT

The future of western Europe's defense program appears brighter. Most of the credit must go to the recently ended meetings of the North Atlantic treaty organization council at Lisbon.

Some of the council's accomplishments, however, loom larger on paper than they are in reality. For instance, the plan for about 50 combat-ready divisions by the end of this year. Some military authorities believe a figure of about half that would be more realistic.

And while council members themselves have come to productive agreement on the most important points, final approval still must come from their respective countries. And that can cause time-consuming bickering, if not downright bickering.

Who pays for what is still a major obstacle in the giant arms program. Some of the European countries are hard up, to put it mildly. France is a good example. The United States, already shouldering a great financial burden in Europe, has agreed to give France another \$400,000,000 for the year.

Perhaps the most striking aspect of the current European defense picture is the sudden rise of Germany, mortal enemy of most NATO countries only seven years ago, as an important column in the defense structure. West Germany is to pay \$2,670,000,000 year toward the western Europe defense program, subject to possible adjustments by the Bonn government.

The way has also been opened for Germany once again to begin stocking up her great war industries. Just what arms she will be allowed to produce hasn't been completely ironed out.

And Theodor Blank, military adviser to West Germany's Adenauer, has told the Germans they are to have 100,000 to 200,000 troops for the European army.

The agreements which elevate Germany to a place of equal footing in the European army were not arrived at without a lot of compromise with her ancient enemy, France. The United States and Britain had to give France assurances that Germany will not be allowed to dominate the European army, or to pull her forces out of it when she pleases.

France certainly cannot be blamed for feeling as she does.

In fact, political news from West Germany seems to bear out the fear of France and others that tolerance for the principles of nazism "not dead."

U. S. High Commissioner McCoy, in a quarterly report to the state department from Bonn, warns of coming "disaster" unless a halt is put to rising German nationalism and the actions of Nazi-like parties.

Certainly not all Germany's sins are atoned for by her entry into the European army.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The heavy disparity in American and Russian losses of lives and dollars in the Korean "police action" has been discussed frankly by members of the staff of the House of Representatives committee. It is far greater than the public reports.

Members have prodded military witnesses repeatedly, almost cruelly, for details on the disparity. Representatives insist they have no definite details on the comparative loss of lives and dollars. The intelligence reports suggest Moscow was waging an extremely painful and expensive offensive.

Even more important, this analysis applies to almost all the conquests in Korea. It is not only the start of the six-year-old "cold war" in that period Russia has conquered or obtained a going control over six million natives with a population of more than 600,000,000.

ROME—The United States information service is an unshining example of bad drawings exhibiting us in an abdominal tone to love one another because, after all, we came from one cell, you know, and the "American" can't measure to dumb communist agents in factories, who couldn't detect the catch in the contents and therefore passed it out to the faceless men in their jurisdiction who probably can't read or write either.

These factory agents of the party thought it was official stuff from Moscow. They were several variations of this trick and they worked so well the communist bosses had to be called in to see to it that they were not so easily fooled.

However, I have only faint confidence in the "American" theory called "the effects of your persuasion on ignorant people whose communism is given faith by the propaganda of your press run on the tongue of your people."

Lloyd Free, a state department member sent to Italy by comparison with Shepard Stone's ponderous machine in Germany, with 100,000 dollars in his pocket, to sell the subnormal Heinies that politico-personal mess of Roosevelt, says that he is very modest.

It is his job to win Italian workers in factories and on construction jobs and all things away from the communists into anti-communist hands. He has to get three people for every working job in the country and that means serious work and discipline and a degree of hunger in some localities.

However, the stocks I see day after day in the shop windows, his voluminous checks, those Italian sausage arrangements like six-inch pipe, enormous day after day gallons of olive oil, little baby lambs, enormous moidy hams and whole carcasses of hogs hanging on the wall, that make an Englishman scream like a horse in a burning barn.

There is a strange difference here. The British have stronger character and better diet than any of the continentals and possibly than ours in this test. For there is reason to believe that the British do it whether we would stand for the tasteless monotony of their food, the mormalized rations of bacon and a dollop of one egg a week.

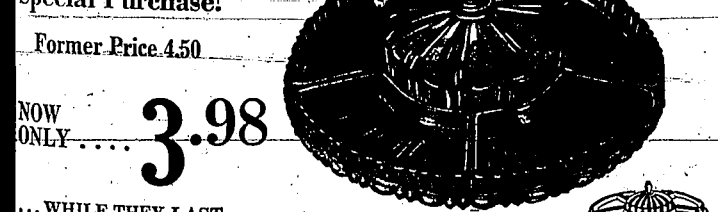

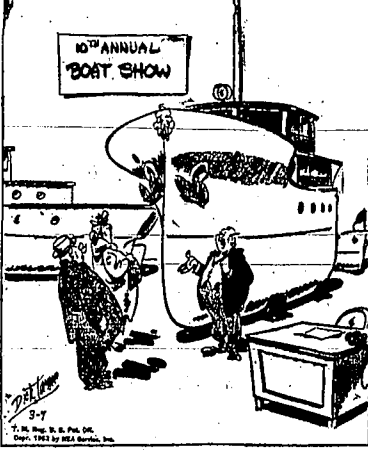

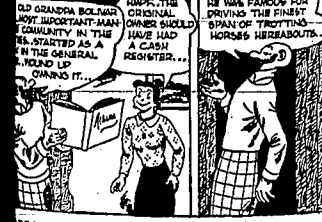

Warren Tries Wisconsin in Primary Vote

Gov. Earl Warren of California invaded a traditional stronghold of Gen. Douglas MacArthur today to bid for votes for the April 3 presidential primary.

Warren was to head straight for the heart of the MacArthur territory with a speaking engagement today at Ashland, Wis., where John Chappie, publisher of the Ashland Press, heads the national Fight-for-MacArthur organization.

Three Opponents
Warren entered the Wisconsin trial run just 10 days ago and faces three opponents in the battle for Wisconsin's 30 convention seats: Harold Stassen—former governor of Minnesota, Gen. Robert Taft, and Grant Ritter, Monroe, Wis., the MacArthur candidate.

Warren's decision to run here was considered an answer to a call for a coalition of former leaders of the progressive party and 1948 supporters of Thomas E. Dewey. The coalition has indicated it may turn its votes over to the supporters of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower if it fails to win sufficient backing of its own.

Committed to No One
Warren contends, however, that he has committed himself to no one. Leading his organization here are Phil La Follette, former progressive party governor and Ralph Emmell, candidate for the GOP nomination for governor in 1948.

Warren's campaign appears aimed at picking up voters in the field which would otherwise support Stassen and has therefore been welcomed in Wisconsin by Taft supporters.

Stassen completely blanked Dewey four years ago and lost only six delegates to MacArthur.

Decline Noted in Idaho Slaughter

BOISE, March 7 (U.P.)—Total dressed meat slaughtered in Idaho in January was 4,470,000 pounds, compared to 4,809,000 pounds in January, 1951, a decline of eight per cent.

The U. S. department of agriculture reported Friday that agriculture inspectors slaughter plants featured 5,600 head of cattle, 500 calves, 19,000 hogs and 500 lambs and sheep.

U. S. Presses Asia Neutrals To Aid Group

WASHINGTON, March 7 (U.P.)—The United States is prodding communist nations of Asia to abandon their neutrality in the current proposed Pacific defense pact, a survey disclosed today.

The American policy is not bearing fruit, and probably won't for some time. But the promptings are being made more strenuously in an effort to convince reluctant Asian nations to move over to the American side in the east-west struggle.

India, Indonesia and Burma—the three main Asian neutrals—are regarded as important members of any defense pact in the area that also includes Indo-China, Pakistan, Malaya, Siam and Japan. This government believes it is impractical to plan a "broad" treaty unless all major non-east Asian powers will join.

The United States has no fixed ideas on membership in the pact. It adopts the general view that time and events will determine which nations can pull together on basic defense principles.

The clearest and most direct statement of American policy on the Pacific-Asian treaty was voiced last week in the east-west secretary of State John M. Allison in an address at Philadelphia.

"It is our hope that there will be a growing consciousness among the nations of the far east of their interdependence in the maintenance of peace in the Pacific and that this will be reflected in further cooperation toward mutual security," he said. "The United States stands ready to cooperate in the furthering of collective security in the Pacific area."
