“GOOD-CITIZEN” MURDERED

Nobody in the Schuster family could have realized at the time, but it was an unlucky day when someone tacked up a “Wanted” poster of Willie Sutton, the nation’s most notorious bank robber, in the elder Schuster’s Brooklyn tailor shop.

Riding the subway in Brooklyn a few weeks ago, young Schuster was about to be arrested and realized. Suddenly his memory clicked and he knew it was Sutton. He trailed the robber from the subway until he spotted a police car. He told the officers his story, and eventually they picked up Sutton and arrested him.

What spurred Schuster to act on his hunch we can only guess. It may have been published reports that \$70,000 reward awaited the man who could point out Sutton. Or maybe he had a streak of the “psycho” in him.

Schuster shortly faded from public notice, but he was not forgotten. After Sutton’s arrest, two of his underworld friends were also seized. Quite evidently, all this was more than some man or men could bear.

Not many nights ago, while he was walking alone about a block from his home, Schuster was shot and killed. Bullets were fired into his stomach, the back of his head, and into each of his eyes—the eyes that had seen too much.

With a tragic commentary this makes on life in a great American city. From the forces of law and order, Schuster got nothing for his display of public-spirited conduct. Their reluctance to admit his tip was a pitiful show.

Some weeks ago citizens of the New York area were in a highly indignant state over the accidental deaths of people in neighboring Elizabeth, N. J. Following the shooting, they were ready to paralyze the nation’s greatest air center to prevent more such “outrages” from occurring near major city airports.

One is compelled to hope that similar public indignation, and what is more effective, police action—will follow upon this outrage of a different sort, the deliberate murder of an innocent young man in brutal retaliation for being a good citizen. For doing the police department’s duty in giving a tip, a young man got the reward that ruffians know so well how to deal out.

TUCKER’S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG POT SHOTS

WASHINGTON—Congressional carelessness is partially responsible for internal revenue “corruption” in the tobacco industry.

The tobacco industry has enabled smart politico-legislators to clean up tax-less millions on an extremely small investment. The tobacco industry has crooked and unethical conduct does not rest solely on the man in the street.

The remedies concocted by congresses for these conditions constitute a series of blunders. The investigators have reached the private conclusion that the losses of taxpayers have been subsequently disposed of at a huge profit that escaped heavy taxes, acted within the law, if at all, in the federal statutes, as well as official morals, which must be strengthened.

Indeed, it now happens that the only charge on which the Chinese-American tanker group may be caught is use of the mails to defraud, and there is no certainty of conviction. However, as following the proceedings closely.

DECEPTION—It is should develop that any of the negotiators misrepresented the purpose to which the tankers were to be put, in communications sent to the United States. It seems there was considerable deception behind the scheme in that tankers supposed to make profits benefited the negotiators, and there is as yet no evidence that the “double talk” assumed legal form.

That would be a very indirect method of hooking a former “new deal” congressman, “Use Casey,” and his shipping associates. In fact it would pit the negotiators against the negotiators. A reputation of a scandalous operation is to close the legal loopholes.

PERFURCTION—Although Sen. Walter P. George, Georgia, has been a severe critic of the present manner of the administration, he has not been a head-on finance—helped to let the rascals and corruption get into key offices in the first instance.

All appointments of internal revenue commissioners are now approved by the committee, and confirmed by the senate. In the past, however, this task has been handled in a perfunctory and aliphoid manner. The committee has not been a factor in his state, he was cleared automatically by the George group and the senate.

CHARACTER—Neither body made any attempt to ascertain the character, the experience, the business and political connections, or the background of the men who were appointed to these offices.

The only test applied to them was political. In view of the fact that several of the appointees were indicted and convicted, it is obvious that this system has not made for efficiency or honesty in the service.

In the future, Senator George says, every man appointed or reappointed to a high post in internal revenue should be subjected to a thorough background check, and justly himself on grounds other than politics. He must produce references and even more important, a list of his character, his ability, his experience and his devotion to the public welfare.

IRONIC—In installing this reform, the Georgia senator admits, though not too notably, that the legislative branch—or at least the senate—must share responsibility for the delinquency and neglect of the executive branch. The present—or the current cry of inefficiency, dishonesty and downright graft in the internal revenue department, is in fact, a reflection of the fact that the senate has not been a factor in his state, he was cleared automatically by the George group and the senate.

SHEEP—The compliments Sen. Estes Kefauver paid to the New Hampshire primary surprised and disappointed many of his backers.
