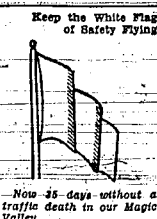

Plan for Atomic Census Outlined To Panel of U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., April 8 (AP)—The United States outlined to the U.N. Atomic Energy Commission today an atomic census and check-up plan designed to lead to the development of atomic energy for peaceful and reduction of armaments.

The working paper called for U.N. inspection in the early stages to determine the size and location of atomic energy plants.

France and Britain immediately announced they would study the plan, but Russia's Joseph A. Malik denounced it as "a smokescreen to hide the U.S. secret atomic program."

Malik reiterated the old Russian demand that arms reduction begin with prohibition by the general assembly of the atomic bomb.

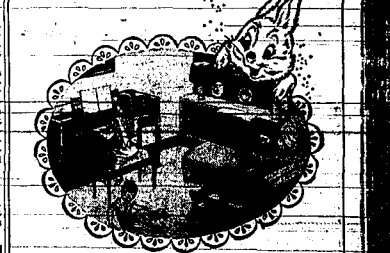

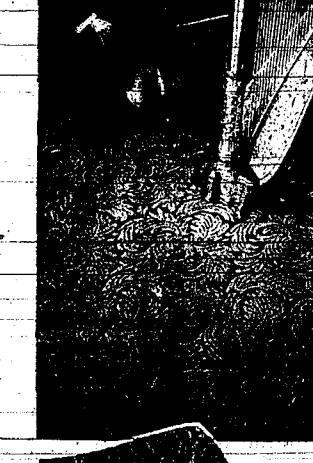

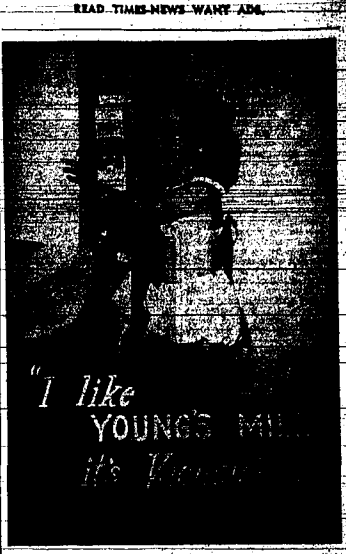

Stars Lost in Sunshine; Pruett Avers

By a BUREAU PRESS

Mercury is bright in the eastern dawn and in the western twilight, but about noon it is hidden for a half-an-hour before the sun and disappears, setting at 7:01 p.m. Do not think that it is lost for several days after sunset, as it is in the brilliance of old Sol. We shall have to go without it for several weeks.

But planet Mercury is brighter than the two just mentioned, and is not hidden completely after sunset as the sky is only darkened, yellow Saturn being still above the east horizon.

The bright star Spica will be accompanied by April 6 and the bright star Vega will be above Saturn. In the following evening it will be prominent.

Star Bright

10 p.m. or shortly after, red and white stars will be seen in the sky. They will have cleared the sky-southward.

For the brighter stars around Spica was mentioned above, it is a large star, now at the southern horizon.

Northern Crown

Below the wide part of the and south of Arcturus, an line of small stars of little stars.

The northern crown is just rising or soon to be seen, the astronomer of Grants Pass, writes that the early evening appearance of the stars is "with the promise and hope." Very high in the sky is the star Vega, the brightest object in the moon—in the evening.

Other Group

In the horizon in the west are the attractive stars of the Orion group are prominent, besides two are blue-white and considerably above it is Betelgeuse. About midway in the sky is the star Rigel, the second star in brightness in the Orion group. Above Rigel and to the south, the little star Procyon, in the constellation Canis Major and Pollux, are the stars of the constellation Gemini. They are only a little above the horizon. Hairless Hereford Bull Is Born On Cattle Ranch Near Jerome

JEROME, April 5.—No matter how he turns out, even if he grows a full beard or a mass of muttonchop whiskers, the odds are hell always "to make the market" for a hairless bull, because when he was born the other day he was virtually hairless, which, in Hereford circles, just isn't done.

Joe first saw the light of day at 11 a.m. Thursday on Shirley Byington's ranch, three miles south and five and one-quarter miles west of Jerome. He came from registered stock and except for the lack of hair, seems to be pretty normal.

Byington says that in all his years of handling livestock he never before saw a bald calf.

He and sheep ranchers occasionally have hairless lambs but they generally die shortly after birth. Joe, on the other hand, shows no inclination to cash in his chips with the calf, and that part of his anatomy commonly referred to as the lower back, are completely without hair. The amount of hair on his back is negligible but his face is sprouting a good set of whiskers.

Byington says the "cull calf's" tongue is larger than tongues in most calves but he doesn't have any idea what this might have to do with the lack of hair.

The hairless skin also seems tender for Little Joe runs away whenever his mother tries to suck him.

Such a characteristic is normal, however, in the young male of the species commonly known as man.

Shortly after birth the calf screamed and Byington says she doesn't know what the crier was to do, come winter. For that matter, Byington doesn't know what the calf will do, come summer. He may get his hide tanned before he's slaughtered.

Having failed to grow hair before birth, the calf may acquire a heavy coat before he's much older. That again, he may not. If he doesn't he'll have to get through life as a freak. The Jerome rancher says freaks are more common in registered stock than in other animals and claims he has seen a lot of native specimens—wherever he was raising sheep.

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

Wife-of-the-month—Jewel going down daily; residents of Wood river valley are beginning to suffer from that stomach-aching, spring fever. In the more advanced cases it is manifesting itself in digging into buckets of sand and loam stored away last fall, for early spring seed plantings.

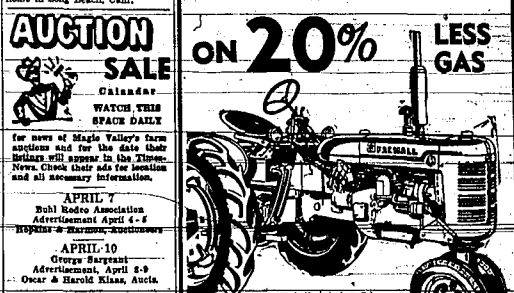
