Early Settlement Formed Dim for Telephone Tieup

NEW YORK, April 8 (AP)—The nationwide strike of nearly 100,000 telephone workers went into its second day today with the prospect of an early settlement.

The Communications Workers of America threatened large scale picketing tomorrow to keep all 300,000 union members employed Bell system away from work.

The strike began yesterday morning with the walkout of installers and salesmen in 48 states and the District of Columbia.

It was followed by 25,000 operators in New Jersey and Michigan, and 10,000 in New York and California.

The strike in New York is being held in the city by the Telephone and Telegraph union. It has 23 cents per hour and 2 cents per minute for overtime. A strike of 10 to 15 cents per hour would set a pattern for the rest of the country.

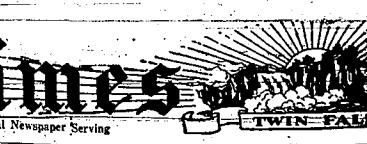

Solon Wants Inquiry Into 2 Academies

WASHINGTON, April 8.—A wide investigation of military education, particularly of the recruiting of cadets at West Point and Annapolis, was urged today by Sen. Harry M. Kilgore, D., W. Va.

Kilgore's discharge last Wednesday of military education has been authorized to seek out high school subjects for enrollment at the military academies. He provided they meet all other requirements.

Special Check-Up—Kilgore calls for a special commission to look into the military education system to see that present service academies are producing the best possible officers. He said the recruiting of cadets would be "only one point in the entire matter."

Idaho Miners Face Problem For Monazite

BOISE, April 8.—A fairly high recovery of monazite values can be expected to have been reported by the board of control of the Idaho Monazite Mining Association.

The board, headed by Dean A. W. Fairbank, of the University of Idaho school of mining, said its research has been directed mainly toward producing a marketable concentrate by flotation.

The report said monazite prospects in the Black Warrior district of Elmore county are good. The mine has received a definite mineralogical investigation. The board said that it is possible to concentrate in that area, along with elvanite.

Idaho produces about 20 to 25 per cent of the national production of garnet, the report said. This would be increased by output of garnet as a by-product of the extensive monazite.

Educator Raps Effect of TV on Youngsters, Warns of Danger

LOS ANGELES, April 8.—(Telephoto)—A national convention of the American Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation. Dr. Jay B. Nash, professor of education at New York university, said: "I don't want kids watching television. I want them doing things."

Dr. Nash told delegates Monday at the national convention for Health, Physical Education and Recreation. He observed that a recent Grosby survey showed children spend 30 minutes more a week before a TV screen than they spend in school. "They should be solving problems, a work bench, experimenting in chemistry, throwing a ball, playing a trombone, skinning a squirrel," Dr. Nash suggested.

"They should be learning skills, skills, skills. When is a person's learning done? From 4 to 14. Pattern formed in a skill during those ages is never lost. You can take a man and make an adult of 60."

Dr. Nash made it plain he does not believe TV programs are bad, but that the outstanding or past other wrong-doers in the kiddies' "heavens" is just that they spend too much time looking at them.

The medium could be used very effectively to teach some skills, he admits.
