Vote Results Are Pleasing To Kefauver

LOS ANGELES, Calif., April 9 (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver says he was "highly gratified" with the showing in the Illinois presidential primary but believed Don. Adlai Stevenson would have received more votes if he had entered the race formally.

The Tennessee Democrat, issued the statement after addressing 750 southern California Democrats at a campaign banquet here tonight.

Kefauver said it was "quite apparent that no substantial effort" was made for Stevenson as a write-in candidate in the Illinois primary.

"I imagine that, if he had entered the primary and made an effort to secure votes, he would have received more than he did," the senator said.

Kefauver said in his major campaign speech that armed strength alone will not win the fight for peace, but he added he did not believe that is inevitable.

He said the United Nations should decide the minimum terms for an armistice in Korea and give its armies full throttle if the communists refuse those terms.

"If no armistice is reached, he said, the U. N. should send its bombers

More Papers Are Filed for Divorce Case

Answers and cross-complaints have been filed in district court by Mrs. Jonathan K. Aldritt and Mrs. Samuel David Aldritt, who are married twins, in reply to divorce actions started by their husbands. The writs are represented by G. Lloyd.

In a writ, Earl K. Walker, attorney for the two men, filed answers to the cross-complaint denying most of the allegations of the twins. "The cases be set for trial," the couples were told by the judge at a wedding in Twin Falls June 12.

Denies Claims
Mrs. Jonathan Aldritt denies her husband's claims that certain personal property is his separate property. She claims that the items are community property.

Mrs. Aldritt also denies she refused to get up and prepare her husband's breakfast or that she was sometimes found in bed although the noon meal had not been prepared.

The wife charges cruel and inhuman treatment, including claims that she was stung by their horse moon to Salt Lake City and would not let her spend \$200 from money her parents gave her for a blouse.

Claims Food Betrayed
Mrs. Aldritt claims her husband refused to furnish food, making her prepare dried beans and potatoes for an entire week, at one time she claims he took to the store with her but scolded her for not buying \$1.54 for groceries. She claims he often went to his parents' home to eat, leaving her to get along as best she could.

Charges Cited
A few days later, she claims he took all the personal property from their home, she says he took her to Twin Falls and asked forgiveness for expressing a desire to live with her husband free from interference from his parents. She claims when she refused to do this, he filed the divorce action. She also claims he harmed her physically.

Mrs. Aldritt claims B. K. Aldritt, her father-in-law, owes her \$300 for work she performed with her husband on a farm near the Aldritt farm. She asks the court to award her items of community property in lieu of alimony. She asks for restoration of her former name, Betty Norton Durham.

Formerly Charged
The sister, Mrs. Samuel David Aldritt, admits calling her husband names, but claims she was "forced" to do so by acts of physical violence on his part. She charges cruel and inhuman treatment and physical abuse.

Mrs. Aldritt claims her husband slapped her and returned to her later to a religious song on the radio because it did not come from his church. She claims he pushed her off the running board of a truck, and once threw her against the sink in their home.

Referring to an engagement ring which she claims her husband took from her and which was returned to her later at a district court hearing, she claims the diamond in the ring had been replaced with glass when she was returned.

Mrs. Aldritt claims she was brought before the pastor of her church several times to ask forgiveness for complaining about living conditions at the home of the in-laws where she was living. She says the pastor told her she would be "disciplined" from the church if she "fellowshipped" with her own parents because her father had withdrawn his church membership. 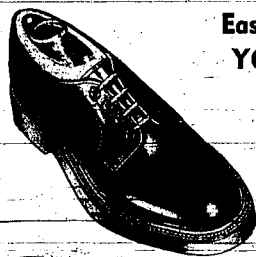
