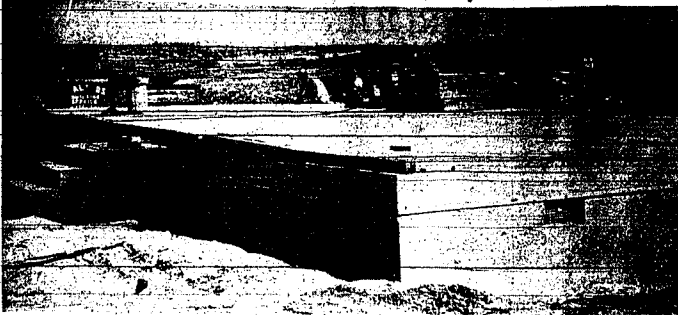

"Organized Confusion" Reigns at Hunt As Workmen Ready "Farm-in-Day" Site

JEROME—April 15—The 100-acre desert site of the farm-in-a-day program at Hunt is beginning to look like a circus grounds just before the circus leaves. Activities are taking on the appearance of organized confusion as workmen ready for the "zero hour" Thursday.

While the farm actually will be created in one day, the prep as a circus performance is put on one day. There are a multitude of details in both instances which must be done ahead of time. In the instance of John Hermann's farm, a well had to be dug, corner fence posts installed, one ditch dug and the foundation for the fire-room water poured.

Besides that, food stands had to be erected, fire aid stations located, rest rooms installed, bleachers erected and a playground prepared for the 300 children expected at the event. Plans have been completed for directing traffic and handling the thousands of spectators which officials hope will attend the event.

Trucksloads of lumber and equipment are arriving almost constantly and pipe for the irrigation lines is being placed in accessible spots for the workmen on Thursday. A house moving crew has moved the old barn to a new location where it will be used as a cattle shed and 1700 feet of concrete pipe has been installed to carry irrigation water.

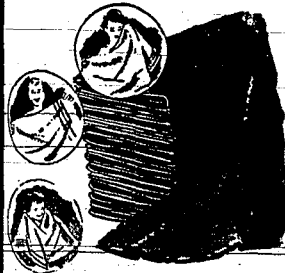

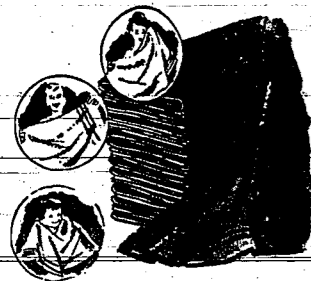

Bruce H. Taylor, trustee of the Idaho Society of Crippled Children, thanks all those who have assisted in the local Easter seal drive.

"I want to extend my thanks to the many volunteers who have assisted in making the drive a success," Taylor said. "A great deal has been done by these volunteers and we are very grateful to them for the help they have given."

Taylor said that the thanks of the society are particularly extended to the members of the sophomore unit of Olathe High School. This group raised approximately \$250 through the sale of paper Easter seals at the streets of Twin Falls Saturday.

The sophomore unit also served lunch to the girls. Young Daily donated milk and Idaho cereals to the girls. The girls were given complimentary tickets to the Easter theater.

The drive, which ends this week, has a total goal of \$220,000 with funds going for the rehabilitation of Idaho's crippled and handicapped children. The money is used by the Idaho Crippled Children's Society.

More than 15,000 letters containing Easter seals were sent to Idaho residents last March. Thousands of people throughout the state have already accepted the seals and sent their contributions to the society, Taylor said.

The state will keep more than 90 per cent of the funds received in Idaho for the benefit of its own crippled children. Less than 10 per cent of the funds will go to the National Crippled Children's Society and Adult's society for use on a national scale.

Last year the state society assisted more than 200 crippled children of Idaho with funds received during the 1951 Easter seal campaign.

This year the society hopes to help more than 400 crippled and handicapped children, including many cerebral palsied children, if the drive quota is reached, Taylor said.

Services to the crippled children last year included special training, transportation for training, medical and dental assistance, and help in purchasing supplies and equipment to assist them in their rehabilitation program.

Economy-Run Proves Gasoline Mileage Can Be Improved by Minimum of Three

Proof that a third more gasoline mileage can be obtained by a few simple rules is shown in the Mobil economy run which passes through Twin Falls Wednesday.

Expert drivers take stock cars—exactly the same car you may select off the showroom floor—and run a minimum of 25 per cent more gasoline mileage than is achieved by the average motorist. There are no special gadgets or gimmicks. There are no tricks in the trade, however. The experts differ slightly as to their relative values but generally agree on these:

Start out in low gear, get through second and into high gear quickly. At 20 miles an hour second gear starts up to 15 to 20 per cent more gas than high gear and first gear consumes 30 to 45 per cent more.

Tread lightly and evenly on that throttle. Published reports that some economy run drivers sandpaper the soles of their feet and drive barefoot are exaggerated but illustrate the idea.

Watch the traffic lights ahead and pace yourself so that you can avoid as many starts and stops as possible. Stops and starts waste plenty of gasoline. Don't speed up more quickly than necessary, either from a standing start or in passing another car. Weaving in and out of traffic also means use of the brakes and gasoline.

Turn up your engine before taking a trip. Tests show that carburetors, ignition and valve troubles are frequent gas and power robbers. A carburetor correction is needed about every 14,000 miles and a real tune-up can add four to six miles per gallon of gasoline. It's well to remember, too, that timing and carter valves are not always properly adjusted even on new cars.

Three to seven cubic centimeters of gasoline are used every time you step on the accelerator or spill gas out of the bowl by a sudden stop.
