Editor Blasts Red Controls Over Scribes

WASHINGTON, April 17 (AP)—President Alexander F. Jones of the American Society of Newspaper Editors warned today that "intolerable" tense relations between the United States and Iron Curtain countries "cannot long continue." He added that government policies on protection of U. S. newsmen in Communist-ruled areas was a report prepared for the opening meeting of the ASN convention.

"I am not proud of our course in allowing our reporters in Iron Curtain countries to become harassed, frightened, useless representatives of our free press," Jones said. "While American newsmen are thrown in jail, held at virtual hostages and subjected to indignities by the rule, Jones said, government officials should be allowed to roam at will in Washington. He called for withdrawal of congressional press gallery credentials by this reporter.

The day's program called for the editors to take part in a press conference with President Truman, and for editors to send their wives to take two-hour tours of the refurbished White House.

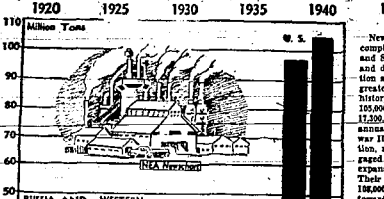

Russians Tap All Prospects To Get Cash

By WILLIAM L. RYAN
Special Staff Writer
PARIS, April 17—Stalin waits for the time of conquest to draw and the money rolls in for his regime.

It takes money—much money—to feed Stalinism. Where does it come from?

Even the salaries of communist members of parliament are tapped to swell party funds.

From communist journalists and printers, come regular remittances. The Russian government, having allowance on the scale of a skilled worker.

From constant subscription drives on behalf of the communist press come the funds and lire and marks of working people persuaded that their lot can be bettered.

But from Moscow comes the bulk of operating revenue. Communist couriers scurry about Europe with remittances doled out to parties according to their needs and importance. Some parties, in Scandinavia for instance, get virtually nothing. Others, particularly in France and Italy, are liberally aided so long as Moscow sees results forthcoming.

A Soviet diplomat, immune from ordinary regulations, transports gold to be used to buy francs or lire or marks on the black market.

The black marketeer in Paris or Rome or Frankfurt who adds up to the dealer to offer local money for American dollars may be indicted in the employ of the confederate. The confederate sardoniously gathers American dollars for its own ends.

Every Source Tapped
Every possible source is tapped, even to raise on the trainees of the unions dominated and controlled by the communists. The money pours in under the form of aid, party discipline.

But the operations of a Communist party are highly expensive, particularly in the key areas of Europe. No matter how extensive the resources of the party constantly, Moscow must kick in.

In addition, large sums come from countries of eastern Europe, either through transfer to the Banque Commerciale Four (Banque du Nord) under the transport of gold or through diplomatic cover. The Communists in various countries did well by themselves during the wartime resistance to the nazis. Often they seized large sums of money for the party.

And covered the money to their own purposes.

Northwest Natural Gas Import Plans Are Wide Open as Presidential Races

WASHINGTON, April 11 (Special)—Plans to import Canadian natural gas into the northwest area as wide open as the presidential race with chances about equal that anything said now will be true three months later.

Since the federal power commission called off scheduled hearings April 8 at which four pipeline companies were to present their proposals, another firm has entered the competition. The new entry, Trans-Northwest Gas, Inc., Spokane, would serve only the eastern Washington market.

At a new hearing set for June 10, the Northwest project will be considered along with another one to import Canadian gas from the west and two other proposals to export American fuel to eastern Canada.

The rush of activity indicates that the backers do not fear the possible imposition of tariffs. A month ago these appeared likely to kill all plans.

Meanwhile, the pessimism aroused by Alberta's 2,000,000 cubic feet limitation on exports from the province has changed to a hope by the pipeline men that this will be only a starter and the Canadians will relax the restrictions later.

Washington sources at first agreed with the angry session of Henry Gellert, president of Seattle Gas company. He declared that five billion cubic feet would be needed to supply a Peace River pipeline. This feeling brought a quick reversal in plans or Pacific Northwest Pipeline company, one of the four original applicants.

The Texas line would have provided natural gas for Utah and southern Idaho en route to the Washington-Oregon market. However, the amended application was filed with FPC March 18. The new project was set down to an 80-mile system

supplying Alberta gas to Washington state and Vancouver, B. C. The announcement of the export limit April 8, Pacific Northwest in Houston. G. R. Williams declared that the hope for the original Trans-Idaho-Washington line was definitely revived.

At the same time, Ray C. Fish, executive board chairman announced plans for construction of a pipeline from north and west to Washington. The plan called for laying a 20-inch main from the rich gas fields at a cost of about \$10,000,000. It will be over to 1,600 miles long and will have a capacity of 500,000,000 cubic feet of gas daily.

By last week, though, the Canadian outlook brightened as Alberta's Premier J. G. Manning won strong support in an extra session of the legislature which voted to okay the construction board's recommendation of the Peace river export.

While the 3,000,000,000 cubic feet limit remained, sources here reported that the Canadian gas producers in Alberta to grant more consideration.

Westcoast Transmission company, Ltd. the sole permittee for the Peace river export, now is believed "very likely" to go ahead with construction of the pipeline to the border.

It is at the pipeline to the Westcoast Transmission company, Ltd. would distribute the fuel in Washington and Oregon. In view of the estimated \$50,000,000 cost of a 500-mile line from Peace river to the border, some union promoters must have been made by the Alberta government if Westcoast takes up the offer. Such promises may even have included access to the huge Pincher creek field only 100 miles from the border, where applications by the exporters were refused by the conservation board.

While none of the pipeline systems except that of the Pacific Northwest—proposal would touch

southern Idaho, gas men believe it would only be a matter of time if a network is established in the Washington, Oregon and northern Idaho area before it would be connected to the Texas fields.

They also point to the Williamson trade in North Dakota as a possible source for gas which could supply the intermountain states together with ties into the northwest system.

All the speedy developments in the situation have cheered completely the opposition of railroads, the coal industry and domestic gas producers to the Canadian import plan. Representatives of these groups will be out in force at the June 10 hearings before the FPC and they won't be any more friendly than they would have been on April 8.

Another thing the gas promoters appear to have forgotten is that a system similar has on the dock a bill to slap an import duty on the first cubic foot that comes across the border. Backers of the bill have not yet decided whether they will have to launch the next war.

If they decide the Canadian plan have a chance of success with the FPC, the bill probably will go to the floor within a few weeks.
