New Artificial Respiration Technique Demonstrated

Red Cross First Aid Leaders Get Instruction in New Respiration Plan

The Red Cross first aid leaders received instruction in the new back-push, arm-lift method of respiration which has displaced the former technique of artificial respiration.

Approximately 25 first aid leaders were present Thursday night at Patterson's demonstration of the technique. His emphasized getting respiration started quickly still is the most important point. He said 70 per cent of the victims recover if treatment is started in the first few minutes—otherwise only 40 per cent recover if it is started between three and four minutes after the accident is occurring.

The back-push, arm-lift method is employed with the victim lying face down with his arms folded forward with hands under the face. The operator half kneels in front and begins the operation by placing his hands on the subject's back with the heels of the hands approximately in line with the shoulder blades.

Forward pressure with the hands lifts the air. The operator then lifts his hands down to the subject's elbows and lifts the arms while pulling them forward. This lifts the diaphragm and forces the air into the victim's lungs.

Holstein Cow Paces Output For T. F. Area

Martin, a grade Holstein cow owned by Mrs. F. W. Johnson, Ripley, produced 121 pounds of butter during March, Martin's dam, being superior for the Twin Falls County Dairy herd improvement association, reported Friday.

O. W. Dalen, Twin Falls county agent, reports an investigation of the association records fails to mention higher butterfat production by any other cow. This is one of the reasons for carrying on a production program.

Dalen said the previous record holder, one of Mrs. H. V. Haver's cows, was a grade Holstein, named "Daisy", which produced 117 pounds of butter with an average of 56.8 per cent of butterfat.

Other herds are producing between 40 and 50 pounds of butter a week, he reported. Three herds had the same average, 44.7, owned by Ernest Peterson and sons, Fred Simon Baker, Kimberly, and Harvey Fry, Piler.

One leading above 40-pound average was herd of W. F. Richmond, Ripley, W. J. Thomsen and Ervin Ebers, both Twin Falls. Herds totaling between 35 and 40 pounds, owned by Ernest Peterson and sons, Leo Lammer and sons, and Harold Peterson and sons, all Piler.

Thirty-five herds representing 1114 cows tested. An average of 48.6 pounds of milk produced was 78.4 with an average butterfat production of 75.1. Total amount of fat produced was 33,919 pounds at an approximate value of \$15,000.

Excavation Work for School at Hagerman Is Started Thursday

HAGERMAN, April 19—Excavation operations were already under way for the new \$125,000 school building. The contract was signed by school officials and contractors Thursday afternoon. The building is expected to be ready for occupancy by September.

Cashon Construction Company, Pocatello, was low bidder of the 20 contractors submitting bids. Jack Pope, Twin Falls, is construction foreman for the project. Pruett Recalls Star's Role at Chicago Show

 When we consider that stargazing is so hard to do, it is hardly surprising that a single bright star could be the source of the illumination of the night sky. It is possible that a star of this magnitude could be seen on one occasion for a star in our sky is so bright that it is visible in the immense century of progress, especially on the opening evening, May 21, 1955.

Thirty years earlier another great world's fair, the Columbian exposition, was held in Chicago. At the fair of 1893, one of the interesting exhibits was part of the new star's name was "Chicago". It was set up at Yerkes observatory.

The star's position in 1893 was being planned by Dr. H. P. Pruetz, who noted that another "40" was in the sky. The light from the star, Arcurus, flashes through space at 180,000 miles per second, requiring 60 years to reach us.

This meant that radiation leaving Yerkes during the first exposure would arrive during this second similar event. Why not give an astronomical star to the observatory? Let the 60-inch telescope participate.

Dr. Pruetz's well-prepared plan was accepted by the exposition managers. On the opening evening the unusual feat immediately to be attempted. He ceased speaking. Dr. Pruetz resigned.

A signal was flashed to Yerkes observatory 10 miles away. The wide area of "old light" from Arcurus struck the huge telescope lens and was turned down the tube and into the lens and was focused to a brilliant spot in a photographic plate.

There the concentrated light was exposed—some more—some more—then the star appeared to the naked eye. This generated a feeble electrical current which, greatly amplified in other circuits, sped to the eager throng in Chicago.

Brushes automatically operated and motors began to turn. When the great doors opened as if by unseen hands, suddenly thousands of incandescent lights flashed into full brilliance. Stargazing had opened the great exposition.

To be more sure of success should "star" name be "Yerkes" "Yerkes" telescopes "stood by" at Harvard and the Universities of Illinois and Princeton. At only one of the four cooperating stations was the sky overcast.

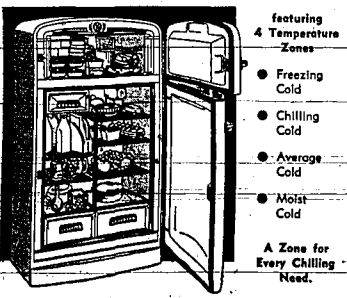
