

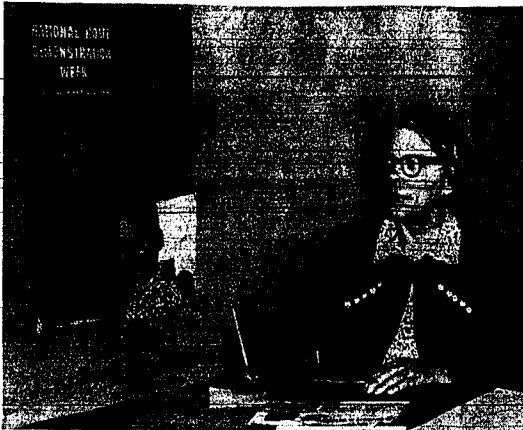

Home Demonstration Week Observance Is Scheduled Here April 27 to May 3

National home demonstration week will be observed April 27 to May 3—the seventh annual observance—Florence Schultz, Twin Falls county home demonstration agent, reports. Open house demonstrations will attract more than 3,000,000 persons across the nation. Thousands of home demonstration clubs will meet during the week. There will be talks, playlets, radio and television programs, demonstrations and exhibits throughout the country, Miss Schultz said. Eleven clubs in Twin Falls county will participate in the week-long observance—three clubs are located in the Piler district and four each in Twin Falls and Buhl.

In describing the home demonstration observance week, Miss Schultz said: "It is a means of acquainting the public with what home demonstration work is and does. It affords a special time for giving an account of this public service. It brings to the attention of many people the work of the entire extension service with particular emphasis on home demonstration activities and accomplishments."

Various activities are planned in the Twin Falls district. The Buhl clubs will feature window displays in the city stores.

At Piler, demonstrations in food preservation, nutrition and clothing will be accorded. Twin Falls clubs will stress clothing projects, consumer buying and good grooming.

Theme for the week is "Today's Home Builds Tomorrow's World." Four objects are set forth for the week's observance.

1. To highlight the fact that home and family can develop and maintain those qualities valued in a democracy.

2. To emphasize that a successful home is dependent upon a well-informed homemaker—who helps the family to take pride in making their home comfortable, attractive and inspiring.

3. To recognize that rural women

through-organized planning and action are making a lasting contribution to community improvement.

4. To make a special effort to acquaint younger homemakers with the work of the extension service and the assistance available to them through home demonstration work.

The program is coordinated through the efforts of Miss Schultz, Twin Falls home demonstration agent for the past nine years.

Ministers and pastors over the nation have been urged to base their sermons on the home demonstration work theme, Miss Schultz said.

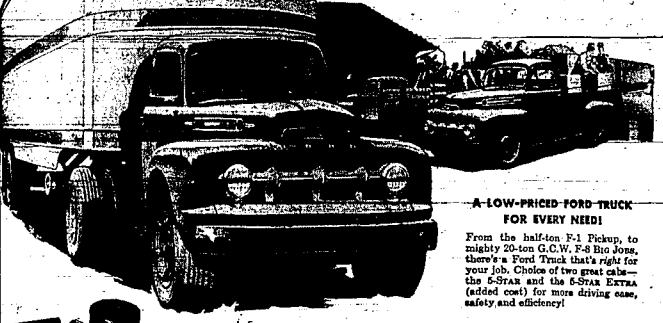

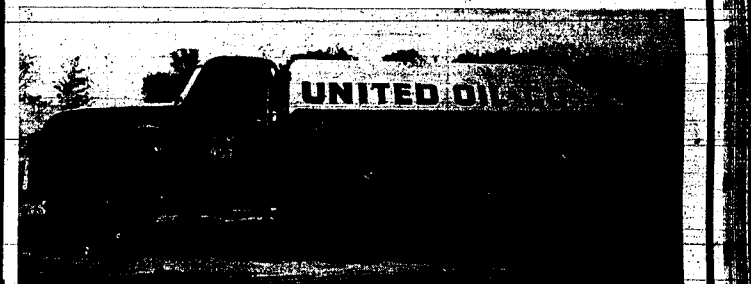
