# TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG POT SHOTS



**WASHINGTON**—"Galloping" rather than "creeping" socialism will be the Republican platform's national indictment of the Truman record, based on the fact that the party is still the only one to have other aspirations of power during the next presidential election.

It will strike an answering blow among many conservative Democrats.

The bipartisanship of congress in attempts to check a Truman record, by keeping the party out of legislative, lawyers, parliamentarians and even generalists of the White House family as the most striking and alarming aspect of recent Truman's record.

**AUDIACITY**—And when the steel companies sought an injunction against the seizure, Truman threatened to veto the bill. The result was that the steel companies were forced to accept the government's terms.

### Crash Toll of 176 Labeled Navy's Worst

NEW YORK, April 23 (AP)—The sinking of the destroyer-escort USS Jacobson, with 176 men presumed lost, became the worst modern peacetime disaster in the U. S. navy's history.

The navy's worst previous peacetime disaster was the death of 48 men in an explosion aboard the USS *Mississippi* off San Pedro, Calif., June 17, 1924.

There were 176 great submarine disasters. The submarine *U-3* went down in a deep diving test off Portsmouth, N. H., June 16, 1941, killing 33 men. On May 23, 1939, the *Esquimaux* sank off Portsmouth, with 28 lost and 23 saved by a diving bell.

Seven U. S. destroyers—the *Dodley*, *S. P. Lee*, *Chaunoy*, *Fisher*, *Woodbury*, *Nicholas* and *Young*—ran aground off Honda Point, Calif., on Sept. 3, 1923, causing 22 deaths.

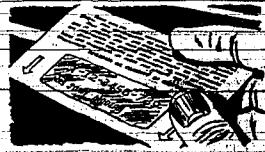

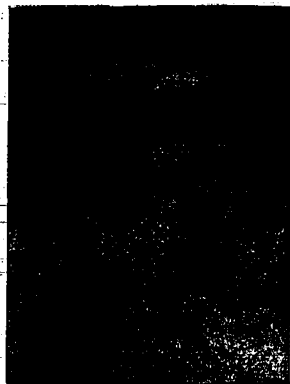

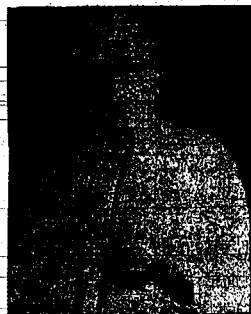
