Insane Plea Is Made for Ward Trial

TRIAL, May 10—Defense attorneys for Earl Ward, 26, charged with the first-degree murder of his mother, Alice Ward, last March 10, today brought out in opening statements to the jury and in cross-examination of witnesses Friday afternoon. Herman Becke, counsel for the defense, in opening statement last Friday afternoon, said he would be offering from what is known as an "insane plea" that the defendant had a persecution complex.

Because of the nature of the mental disease, Becke argued, it was impossible for the defendant to formulate the necessary intent to commit murder.

So far the trial eight witnesses have been called by Norman Neilson, prosecuting attorney. Neilson's opening statement to the jury was brief. He said he would prove Ward had murdered his mother with premeditated malice aforethought. Before evidence in the case was introduced Friday the attorneys agreed to select two alternate jurors. They are Dr. E. Tracy, Oakley, and Claude Lattin.

Becke, in continuing his opening statement, said the jury can be sure of his persecution complex was his mother.

First witness for the state both Friday and Saturday was State Patrolman Albert Snyder who had made the large drive to take Ward's father, Alvin Ward. He testified as to helping his son get his mother's body from the hospital in front of the Ward home on the day Mrs. Ward was killed. Under cross-examination he said his son was unusually calm that afternoon, more calm than he has seen since.

Next, Tracy, service station operator at Almo, said Ward stopped to get gasoline in Almo on the afternoon of May 10.

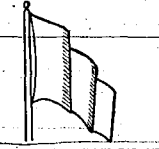

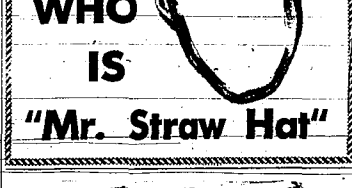

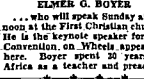

He said he had hidden bacon and other food in his cell but had forgotten to take it with him.

Ward said he had "walked right through the middle of Declo" to the top of the hill west of Dewey's ranch before daybreak. He said he spent the day under a juniper tree, uncooked, dried beans taken from the county jail. The beans made him sick, he said.

Although dark he said he waded through the backwaters of the reservoir and crossed the hill east of the Dewey ranch. His matches became wet as he waded through the water and he was unable to build a fire to relieve his shivering cold.

Trying to keep warm, he walked around and around the Dewey ranch, he said. And as the sheriff took him back to jail he muttered, "I should have put my matches in a bottle. Then they wouldn't have gotten wet."

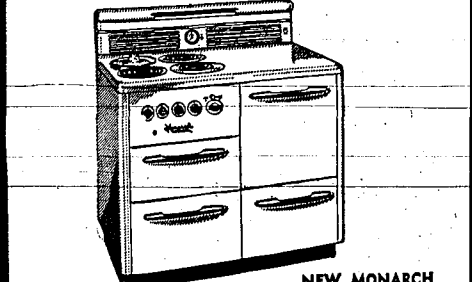
