Hearing Scheduled For Next Week on Defendant's Sanity

BURLEY, May 15—With the acquittal of Sean Ward, 26, on a charge of first degree murder on the grounds of insanity early Thursday, District Judge Charles E. Lowe ordered another trial for next week to determine the defendant's present sanity. The hearing will be held at 1:05 p. m. Thursday. Judge Lowe completed his charge to the jury at 8:30 p. m. Wednesday. The judge said under Idaho law a murder trial is necessary to determine a defendant's present sanity if that defendant is freed because of insanity.

The new trial will begin in Burley immediately following the trial of Kay Martin Monday on a charge of selling liquor without a license. The sole question before the jury in the next trial will be the present sanity of the man who was charged with shooting his neighbor to death last week. If a man is acquitted of a crime by reason of insanity, Idaho law requires that another hearing be held to determine his continuing sanity and if he is adjudged sane at the second hearing he must be set free.

The beginning of the murder trial Ward was adjudged sane enough by a civil court jury to stand trial on the murder charge. During that trial it was incumbent upon him and his attorney, Herman Klocke, to prove insanity at the present time. During the murder trial the jury was instructed to determine whether or not the defendant was sane at the time of the crime. The jury returned a verdict of sane at the time of the crime.

But now that Ward has been acquitted on grounds of insanity the burden of proof will shift to the state. The state must prove that the time the crime was committed, the defendant was sane. The state must also prove that the defendant was sane at the time of the crime.

A submarine using such an engine theoretically could have much greater range than conventional submarines and could remain submerged for thousands of miles.

The new U. N. commander said Colson exceeded his authority when he accepted the "obscure and false" charges of U. N. brutality upon which the agreement for Dodd's release was based.

Farm Bureau Says Hells Canyon Power Wouldn't Reduce Costs of Phosphates

Electric power from the proposed Hells Canyon dam would not reduce the cost of concentrated superphosphate fertilizer, the Farm Bureau federation contended Thursday. In a press release the federation declared the cost would not be lowered even if the power could be sold at 2 1/2 mills per kilowatt hour. The federation said the cost of electricity is based on an average of 100 hours per year, which would be about 80 per cent higher than it is when made by the wet process. It cited manufacturing costs of \$21.21 by the wet process. This compares with costs of \$22.83 by the electric furnace method and \$23.17 by the blast furnace method.

The information was procured from three articles dealing with the Idaho rock needed so badly by U. S. agriculture. They were published in a recognized national industrial chemistry publication and were located through the cooperation of the National Fertilizer association, the Farm Bureau release reported. The three articles compared sulphuric acid and thermal reduction processes, discussed factors affecting development of western phosphate and went into potential markets. The estimated figures on production costs were figured for plants located in southern Idaho, with each having the same capacity and the same capital investment. John H. Webb, state federation president, said the articles show "not another example of how the farmers of Idaho are being misled into giving up their water rights for electric power that will be of no benefit to them."

**U. S. Weather Pattern Change
Claimed as Result of Seeding**

TUCSON, Ariz., May 15 (AP)—Erving Langmuir, Nobel prize winning scientist, said Wednesday he had created a nationwide weekly seeding pattern by seeding clouds with silver iodide, the Tucson Daily Citizen reported in a copyrighted story.

Cloud-seeding in New Mexico, he said, resulted in rain in the eastern part of the nation, thus changing the nation's weather pattern.

Dr. Langmuir, associate director of the General Electric Research Laboratory, is evaluating the results of a 21-month project he said was sponsored by the army, navy and air force.

More visiting relatives, Dr. Langmuir said in an interview with the Citizen that the project was set up to determine the value of cloud-seeding.

"Most of the persons who doubted the worth of seeding clouds with silver iodide," he said, "asked the same question: 'How do you know it wouldn't have rained anyway?'"

"We dispose of this argument once and for all by setting out to establish a pattern of rainfall that could be measured across the United States."

For 21 months, he and a group of scientists seeded the atmosphere in central New Mexico. For the first 12 months, two pounds of silver iodide was sent aloft from generators on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. This was discontinued at the weather.

For the next two months, the seeding was done on Monday, using in one day the same amount of silver iodide used in the three seeding days of the first period. The next two months seeding was done only on Friday. Seeding days were shifted periodically, and records were kept for the balance of the year.

Dr. Langmuir said the scientists found that when they had seeded the New Mexico air on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, it had

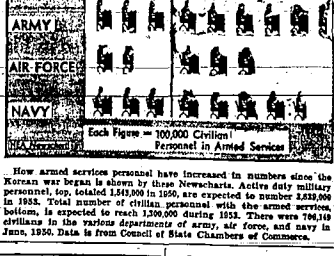
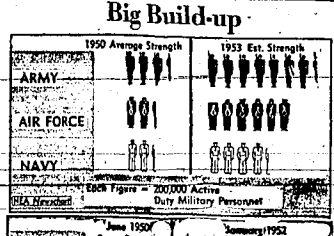
Top Journals Firing Some Sharp Barbs

"Propaganda" Claim on Death March Stirs up Protest in U.S.

By United Press

A statement by a former Japanese general that the Bataan death march was an American "propaganda" ploy has stirred at least three protests from American participants in that infamous World War II occurrence.

"The claim was made in an article by former Lieut.-Gen. Sumita Morioka published last week in a Tokyo magazine. The ex-officer was commander of the Japanese troops conducting the march of prisoners captured in 1942 when Bataan fell.

He said the "march was a normal result of the fortunes of war and American reports of it had no regard for the truth."

In Niagara Falls, N. Y., Col. Donovan Swanson, who was almost bayoneted during the march, charged Morioka was trying to save face.

"Now that the United States and Japan are on friendly terms again it is natural for General Morioka to try and save face," the retired military science at Niagara university said.

"I can never forget how I felt during the march and how an unidentified American soldier dove water he could ill afford to waste on me just before a Japanese soldier came at me with a bayonet," Colonel Swanson recalled.

In San Diego, Calif., Superior Judge Dean Shery, a wartime lieutenant colonel who made the march, retorted:

"The Bataan march was systematic, cold-blooded, savage and premeditated cruelty," Shery said. "If the Japanese general who denials the Bataan atrocities was in command at the time he should be shot for manslaughter. It is a disgrace to our country that he is not shot."

"It is not fair for the fellows who died that he be permitted to live."

"Americans who were too weak from illness or malnutrition were dropped with bayonets. If they fell behind they either were shot or bayoneted."

Shery said he shot of four fellow prisoners and "scores" of the march survived.

"They always die because they were cluffed on the ear," he declared.

"The Japs took the medical instruments of American doctors," Shery said. "This prevented the doctors from rendering even rudimentary aid to the sick and wounded."

"I saw hundreds of empty trucks driven by Japs. But one stopped to pick up a sick or dying soldier. I myself was killed and beaten on the head with a club."

In Phoenix, Ariz., Ruben Iman, who spent three and one-half years in a Japanese prison camp after being captured on Corregidor, said the ex-general's statement made him feel "like I've been hit below the belt."

Iman started out on the march, but escaped with two others. They made their way across the north channel of Manila bay to Corregidor, where Iman later was captured.

Iman said at the start of the march "most of our boys were more dead than alive. We had been lying in the shade of death."
