## Safety Conference Asks State Committee, Plans "Teeth" in Traffic Laws

### Kimberly Man's 98 Years Span Period From Horse to Airplane Transportation

A man who witnessed the burial of Gen. George A. Custer and his men following the Little Big Horn massacre in 1876 celebrated his 98th birthday anniversary this week taking an airplane tour of Magic Valley. He is George Anderson, Kimberly.

Anderson was 85 May 18 but celebrated his birthday observance Monday night over Magic Valley in a four-passenger Super-Sub-Airway airplane with a keen mind and a lively sense of humor. Anderson possesses a vivid memory of the history of the early northwest.

—George Anderson was living in Billings, Mont., in 1876 when he heard of the massacre of Custer and his troops. He immediately set out for the scene on horseback and arrived in time to see a burial party completing its work.

There wasn't much left of the gallant seventh cavalry outfit, according to Anderson. It was there on the Little Big Horn that Chief Sitting Bull and his Sioux warriors lured Custer and his men into a trap and wiped them out to the last man.

Anderson says there has been quite a change in civilization since the days of the massacre. He has seen Yellowstone park and Montana since. However, he has had to witness the changes. Monday's flight was the second time slot for the pilot.

The flight was planned by Ed McCarty, Kimberly. In honor of Anderson's 98th birthday anniversary. The Kimberly Boosters club helped to make it a real celebration by presenting Anderson a complete western outfit.

Later this week Anderson will accompany Mr. and Mrs. McCarty on a motor tour of Yellowstone park and Montana. The group will climax the trip with a visit to the scene of the Custer massacre near Sheridan, Mont.
