The government issued the announcement following a meeting last night of Premier Antoine Pinay's cabinet and top security officers.

Report Contradicted
The statement issued by a spokesman for Defense Minister Rene Pleven contradicted an earlier announcement by Toblin authorities, following police raids on communist headquarters there Saturday, that important documents had been discovered.

Interior Minister Charles Bruneau left last night's meeting in an angry mood. He has been directing the government's 10-day-old offensive against the communists.

Moved Toward Peace
It was understood that Bruneau and Pleven had a heated argument at the meeting—infused—somehow in the defense ministry said there was a meeting Bruneau had moved too fast and expected results too quickly in his attack on the communists and had failed to build up a firm case of espionage or treason against the French reds.

Other sources said, last night's meeting will not affect the government's case against red leader Jacques Duclos and 16 other communists imprisoned for acting against the "internal security" of France.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 10 (AP)—James G. Smyth, third of the scandal ridden internal revenue bureau's chief collectors to be fired, was acquitted of bookkeeping his own \$485,000 income tax returns to defraud the government.

Two other ousted collectors—Dennis W. Doherty, Boston, and James P. Finnegan, St. Louis—were convicted earlier this year.

A federal court jury of eight women and four men freed Smyth Monday night after deliberating seven hours. They acquitted him of three charges after his attorneys testified his returns were duplicates, filed to replace lost originals.

However, two other indictments remain against Smyth. Smyth was dismissed by President Truman Nov. 28 on charges of "fraudulent to manage his office property" after a federal grand jury was called to investigate reputed scandals in his department.
