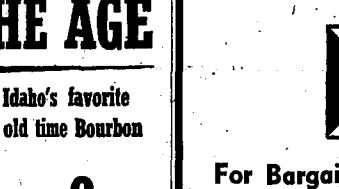

I must not fail a company that would place that much faith in me. Five minutes after receiving this letter I was all damped up with Kilo-owatt hours and cubic feet. Until I received this intimate letter from Con Edson, my knowledge of electricity had been limited to placing a penny in back of a blow-out fuse, and please don't let me that putting a penny in back of a blown-out fuse is unsafe because I know it.

Just as if it were yesterday, I remember Mama telling cousin Willie May not to repair the blow-out fuse with a penny. Cousin Willie May met Hank ahead and placed a Lincoln penny behind the fuse and we had to read by kexasmas lamps for night on two weeks.

"Today I went to the kitchen and climbed in the little cupboard that holds the electric and gas meters. There were six little faces there, not including my own. Fighting down my better self, I sent back my meter reading to Consolidated Edison, showing that I had used no gas and no electricity for three months. I also wrote a footnote asking them never to send a qualified meter reader to my house again as I was perfectly capable of handling the job myself.

# Failure of Drivers to Check Physical Fitness Gets Blame in Many Accidents

WASHINGTON, June 11.—Failure of the U. S. motorist to check his own physical fitness to drive contributes heavily to highway accidents in the opinion of a top motor vehicle official.

U. S. Harris, executive director of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators, says that "just as it is important to know that his car is mechanically perfect, it is imperative that the motorist while driving make sure of his own condition, particularly with reference to fatigue and drowsiness. When these conditions appear, a halt is indicated."

Adoption by motorists of the practice of frequent rest stops—the coffee breaks taken during working hours in business and industry—was suggested by Harris as a step toward a reduction of the prospective crop of summer highway accidents caused by the combination of fatigue and drowsiness leading to reaction spots.

Harris pointed out that the need for frequent stops for the sake of increased alertness was pointed out by figures recently compiled by the U. S. Department of Highway Safety. The center survey found that in cities the driver must make 80 decisions per hour—some of them instantaneous—and in rural areas, 20 decisions. Where traffic is extremely thick, as in New York City or on congested arteries to and from popular vacation spots, the driver is always less than a second away from an accident, the center reported.

"Uninterrupted driving, like prolonged work of any kind, builds fatigue or drowsiness to a point which can be fatal," Harris said. "The tired driver is less vigilant, loses the ability to judge speed and distances, reacts more slowly to emergencies and is less able to resist the glare of headlights. A mistake by an over-tired bookkeeper on the job can be corrected with an eraser's mistakes because of the fatigue of that bookkeeper behind the wheel of the family car can be uncorrectably fatal. In more than 75 per cent of our accidents, there is a contributing factor—a law is being violated. In many cases from lack of alertness."

"The drowsy driver is a particular menace to himself, his passengers and other motorists," Harris said. "In this connection, Harris had some kind words for the maligned back seat driver. "The wife of the driver or his passengers can perform a great

safety service by asking questions requiring an answer. If the driver fails to answer, then he needs to be stopped, rested or relieved of his driving duties by a qualified person who is fresh," he said.

Harris said he believed that last year's estimated highway accident toll of 37,500 dead and 1,300,000 injured could be reduced materially if motorists would enjoy the leisure symbolized by vacation time from the moment they climb into their cars to start for the seashore or mountains.

"Red-eye-park, Atlantic City or the Adirondacks may still be there for you even if you are hours or days late," he pointed out. "For safer motoring, Harris listed three simple rules for drivers: 1. Start your trip when rested, not after a hard day's work when fatigue already has set in. 2. Keep plenty of fresh air in the car at an anti-drowsiness precaution. 3. In case of doubt as to your own physical condition, pull over the road or go to a hotel and sleep."

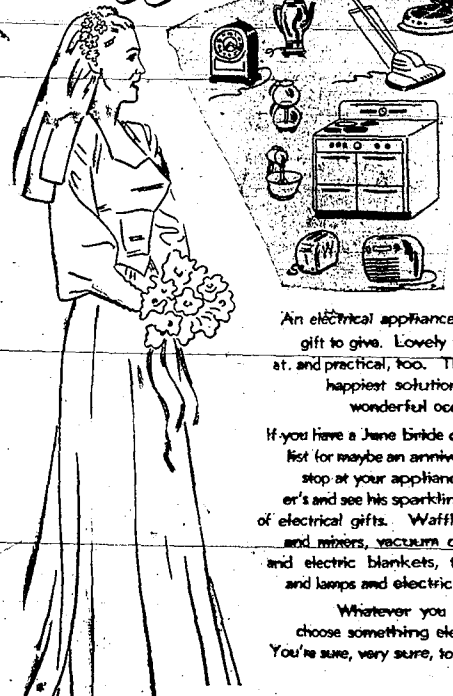
