

Halogeton Control Program Goes Into Full Swing for Heavily Infested Area

BURLEY, June 16—Control of Halogeton is receiving considerable attention this year by the Twin Falls gaging district of the bureau of land management officials of the district announced Friday.

The major infestation in Idaho is in Cassia county but the poisonous weed has spread to most of the southern border counties.

The weed control program is in full swing in the Burley area with the spraying and spraying constituting the bulk of the program. In large blocks of land where natural vegetation has been removed by fire, heavy grazing or other means, the establishment of other forage species that will compete with Halogeton is being carried out.

With this in mind the bureau located areas to be reseeded just in advance of the northward movement of the weed. For the current season blocks of land west of Oakley in the Clearhill area three miles east of Albion and in the Black Pine valley south of Juniper, are being reseeded. These blocks of land constitute 30,500 acres, approximately 11,000 of which have been mowed. The work is expected to be finished by Sept. 15.

Planting and seeding are being done by the Gordon Hardest Construction company and the Cruts Brothers Construction company. Approximately 3,000 acres have been reseeded by the bureau's staff and another 1,500 acres have been reseeded on burned areas by livestock operators.

In addition to working large areas the bureau also watches for spots of infestation which break out in advance of the main assault of the weed. Spraying is the quickest way to kill these infestations.

For this work two jeeps equipped with spray outfits have been sent to Burley and have been in operation since June 2. A plan to cooperate with county weed supervisors also is being formulated. The bureau also has completed a cooperative agreement with the University of Idaho towards the continuation of Halogeton studies.

Control of the weed on the North Blue tract was started Wednesday.



Limitless Power Seen if Hydrogen Can Be Harnessed for Peaceful Energy Use

WASHINGTON, June 16 (U. S. Press)—Now they're hitting at hydrogen power. It is trying to beat them, the U. S. atomic energy project. His committee office related to hydrogen power, the prospects appear to be almost limitless. Atomic energy is released by fission splitting of the uranium or plutonium atom. 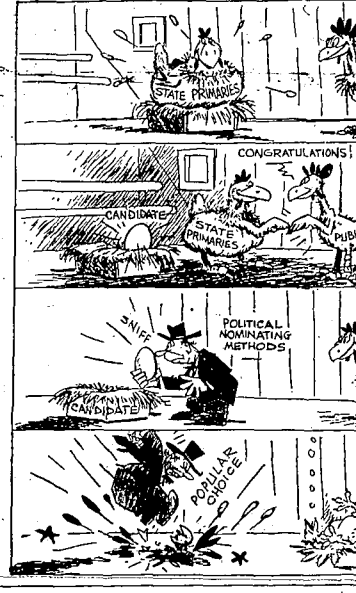

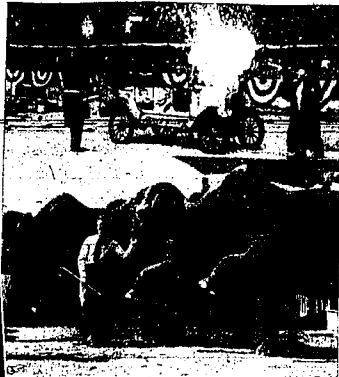

AMERICAN FALLS, June 16.—Unusual winter snow conditions have created poor prospects of another prolific wheat crop for this region.

County Agent Sterling Schow said reports to his office, and his personal checks, give a dim view on prospects. He cited several reasons.

One unusual condition was that warmth was held under the snow last winter, causing abundant snow to melt.

Another factor was the dry fall of 1951. The condition prevented proper germination of wheat, but increased conditions favorable for perilla and other molds.

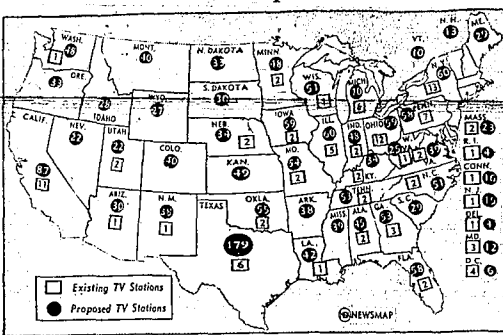

Talking sides in children's spats is what makes bad friends of neighbors. Accept the fact that one child slaps, hits, kicks, shoves another with no more feeling about it than he would have in punishing a pillow. For the moment, a punch or a shove relieves his pent-up feelings. As long as these little ones use hands, no weapons, they won't hurt each other much. Act as referee rather than as judge and they will forget the whole business.

Now and then a bully appears on the scene. Usually he is none too bright and in order to piece out his deficiencies, he picks on the younger and more timid children. He must be dealt with in a different way. Instead of threatening him, talk to his parents in a respectful fashion if that is possible. Try to make friends with this unfortunate
