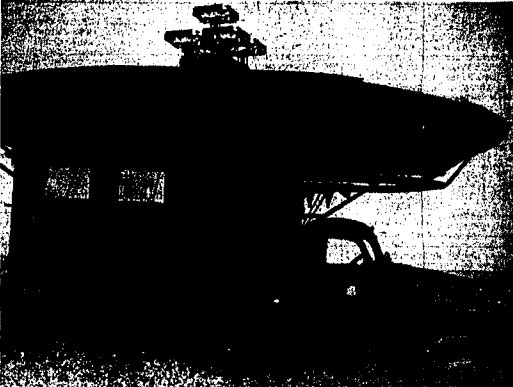

Truck Sends Signals to Plane in Test

New, Improved Type of Navigation Aid Is Tested for Installation at Joslin Field

Cross country air traffic passing over Twin Falls may be able to make positive course corrections from a vastly-improved type of air-aid navigation aid tested at Joslin field during the week. The tests, conducted by representatives of the civil aeronautics administration, were made to determine the feasibility of installing the omnirange range navigation aid at the local airport. The omnirange has elements in common with other types of radio ranges and of other finding systems. However, it represents a definite refinement in technique. Technically, the omnirange furnishes magnetic bearing information with respect to the range station and provides definite course guidance in the service area. The omnirange produces two signals. One is a constant in phase and independent of the aircraft's position. The second varies in relative phase directly accordance with the magnetic bearing of the aircraft from the station. A phase measuring device in the aircraft receiver enables the pilot to determine his magnetic bearing and to select and fix a range course on any desired magnetic bearing. What does all that mean? J. W. Parry, chief pilot of the OAA crew, explained it this way: "There are only four flight courses available on conventional navigation equipment. Omnirange is like a grapefruit. It provides courses around 360 degrees instead of only four courses. It tells the pilot his exact position in relation to the ground station. Parry said the omnirange unit will not tell the pilot how far he is from an airfield equipped with such a device. That feature is still in the engineering stage. However, he pointed out that the... 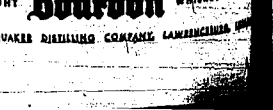

State Pension Union Desires Peace Confab

PAYETTE, June 23 (AP)—A peace conference of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters, Joiners and Joiners, Britain and France was urged today by the Idaho Pension Union for settlement of the world's differences.

It said it would endorse only those political candidates who agree to its peace program.

Other resolutions passed at the closing session of the state convention Sunday:

1. Asked repeal of the state lien law.

3. Recommended that "in the interest of economy and human dignity" use workers be removed from hoistly welfare departments.

4. Asked a survey by the legislature of the feasibility of public assistance recipients in Idaho.

5. Opposed the Smith act as "a stifling expression of ideas by intimidation and arrest."

6. Opposed military concentration camps, saying that while "the government tells us that only communists will be incarcerated in these camps . . . remember what happened in Germany."

7. Asked no income taxes on income of less than \$500.

8. Opposed a five-year military training and asked repeal of the Nationality Law.

9. Backed continuation of Hells canyon dam.

Rain-Makers Probe Slated By Congress

WASHINGTON, June 23 (AP)—The senate has voted to set up a government committee to look into the efforts to make weather instead of just talking about it.

First item for the committee would be a hearing on whether or not science actually has learned how to make large doses of rainfall.

The senate also approved another bill providing up to \$100,000 to back research on making fresh water out of salt water.

Dr. Irving Langmuir, Nobel prize-winning chemist, said recently that experiments in his southwest section proved the success of rain-making. He said scientists had created a nationwide pattern of rainfall—mostly a series of week-end wettings in the east.

The U. S. weather bureau scoffed at these claims. It said the pattern claimed by Dr. Langmuir was just coincidence—that there was even more of a "pattern" in Europe during the experiments.

The senate bill would create a committee of nine members to advise congress on who's right and whether the federal government should license and regulate attempts to modify the weather.

Both bills now go to the house.

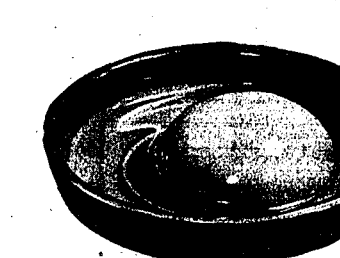
