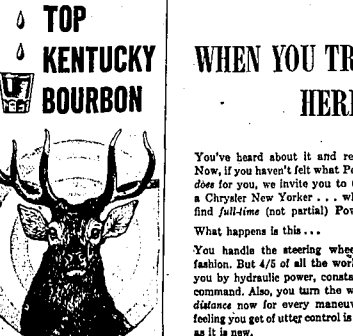

Arnall Blasts House Voting On Curb Law

WASHINGTON, June 24—Price Stabilizer Ellis Arnall said Monday house amendments to the economic control law would leave the government powerless to prevent skyrocketing prices on food, clothing and other consumer goods.

In a letter to Speaker Rayburn, D. Tex., Arnall again attacked an amendment by Representative Talle, R. Ia., saying its effect would be to "kill price controls." Arnall repeatedly has attacked moves to weaken the control program.

The house tentatively approved the proposal last week. A final roll-call vote on this and other amendments is due Wednesday. The controls law will expire next Monday unless congress acts before then to extend it.

The Talle amendment would (1) bar controls on goods not being allocated or rationed for civilian use and (2) provide for suspension of controls on goods that sell below ceilings for a period of three months.

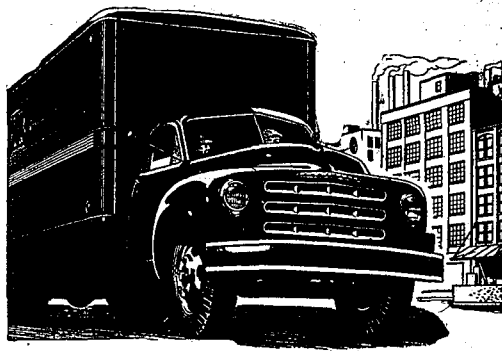

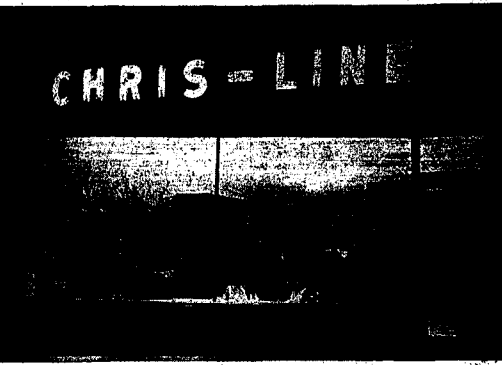

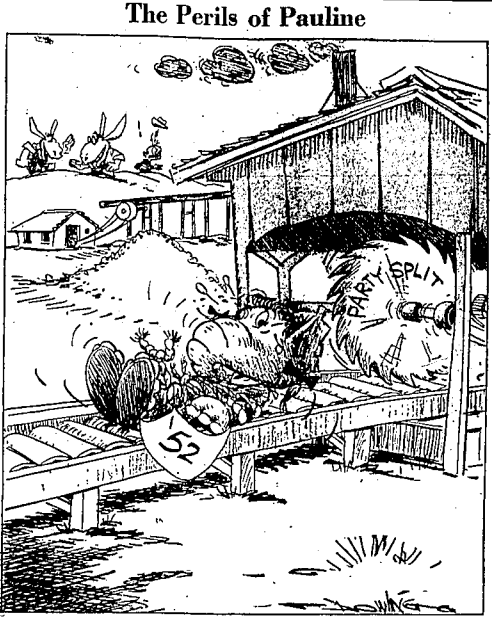

Controls Over Spuds Appear Legally Ended

WASHINGTON, June 24 (Special)—Price controls over potatoes and other fresh fruits and vegetables appear just about legally ended.

While OPS has lifted the lid on potatoes, worried members of the senate inserted a floor amendment to the defense production act formally extending all fresh fruits and vegetables from controls. The house banking and currency committee put in a similar action before reporting out their version of the act to the floor.

Then came a skirmish last Friday in the house floor to die the section. A voice vote was taken and the section remains in the bill. Further action is due Wednesday. Among those fighting against controls was Rep. James Zenger, R., Ida., who told the house: "I am thinking about the consumer, and I think all of the members of his body are honestly thinking about the consumer as well as the producer. This amendment applies to the potatoes which are grown in my great state of Idaho. I should like to denigrate just what has happened to the potatoes under price control—when there were any potatoes available under price control in the stores in the city of Washington. The calling was 7 cents, and the consumer was paying 7 cents for them. After the ceilings were taken off a couple of weeks ago the price was 10 cents. Last night I listened to Mr. Zenger, the commissioner for the American Federation of Labor. He told the housewives in the Washington area not to be afraid that the small potatoes, the little ones, he called them, would be up in the front of the grocery stores, and there were a couple a pound, but he said that in the back of the grocery store, if you will just walk back a few more aisles, you can get the large potatoes for 8 cents a pound. "Under OPS control, when potatoes were available they never sold at a cheaper price than 7 cents per pound in Washington. I think that story speaks for itself."
