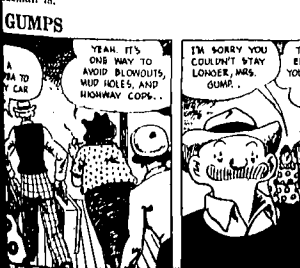

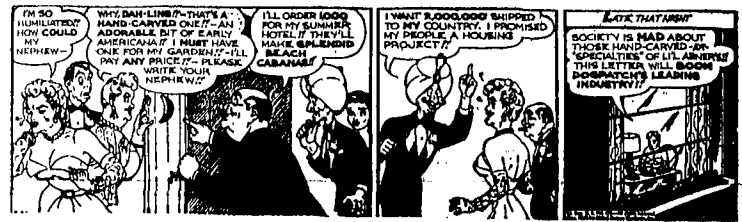

Divorces Are Asked in Trio Of T. F. Cases

Three persons filed divorce actions with the clerk of the district court Tuesday.

Dr. Paul B. Houston, Twin Falls, charges Mrs. Betty Jane Houston with refusing to leave New Jersey to join him in Idaho. He claims she has been hostile to his family. He states that when his parents visited them he, alone, was forced to see them off on the airplane from New York. The airplane crashed and they were killed.

—He claims his wife has told him she doesn't want him anymore—accuses him of having affairs with other women and writes him an complimentary letter.

According to the complaint, the couple was married at Wilmington, Del., March 10, 1945, and has two minor children. He claims all community property, about \$2500 cash and furniture valued at \$1500, is with the wife and two children in New Jersey. He lists several properties in Washington and in Blaine county.

Dr. Houston says he attended medical school in Philadelphia, Pa., and met his wife there, coming to Magic Valley Memorial hospital in March. He claims the couple has been separated except for week-end visits since Nov. 16, 1951.

The husband offers to let the children remain with their mother, providing he may visit them. He expresses a willingness to give \$200 monthly toward their support and claims he has turned community property over to his wife. He asks title to the Washington property. L. B. Quinn is his attorney.

Verne J. Elinger filed suit against Mrs. Ann C. Elinger whom he married at Lewiston in 1927. The couple has a 15-year-old child with her mother in Gooding.

Elinger lists community property as a lot in Gooding county valued at \$4,000, 1940 Chevrolet valued at \$50, 1950 Ford valued at \$1,500 and household goods valued at \$1,500, a total of not more than \$8,000.

He charges extreme cruelty. He claims his wife says she does not love him and for the past five years has lived in Gooding while he lived in Twin Falls. He claims she refuses to come here to make a home for him.

The husband asks that the wife keep the child. He suggests division of the property. His attorney is Earl Walker.

Mrs. Helen L. Crane filed suit against Roy Albert Crane whom she married at Elko, Nev., Jan. 2, 1944. The couple has one child, now with its mother. Community property includes household goods and a 1941 Packard.

The wife states she is employed as a waitress at \$125 monthly and asks \$100 for attorney fees, \$18.50 costs and \$100 monthly support. She leaves her husband earns \$108 weekly at Coeur d'Alene. She claims he left her Oct. 16 and went away with another woman. She says she had to go to work and that prior to his departure he spent money on other women and liquor.

The wife asks custody of the child, with visitation rights for the husband. She also asks all property. Her attorneys are Beckwith and Langley.

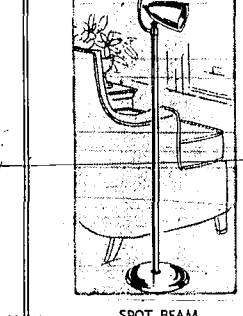

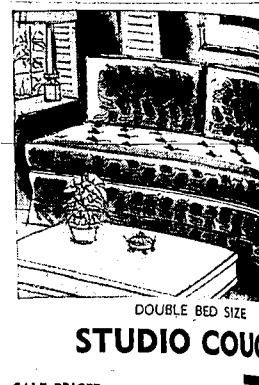

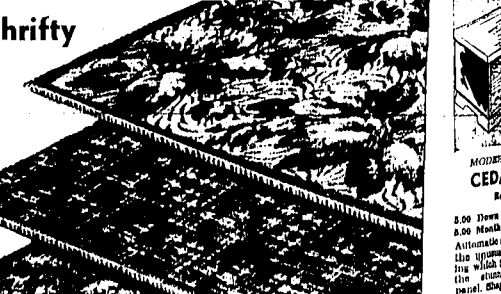
