"As a means of stopping the extravagant spending policies of the government that have led us into this 'in-the-red' spending, the government should establish a debt ceiling at 205 billion dollars," McGraw said.

He stated that an "unswerving fiscal limitation" would be a bulwark against further money and credit inflation resulting from government spending.

A similar recommendation was made in a report on the subject by Dr. Harvey Lutz, professor emeritus of public finance at Princeton university.

Larger Steel Use Looming In Arms Plan

WASHINGTON, July 21 (AP)—The Pentagon expects defense production to take double its normal share of the nation's steel output during the next six months.

An official handling military production problems said this will necessarily mean less steel, temporarily, for civilian use, and a return partly to the system of wartime rationing for military production.

Last 26 million tons 20 million tons of steel output during the 24 days of recent strike.

In order to assign to the military get first crack at available steel, the defense department has assigned 30 special officers to study at the mills.

### Quick Spiral Is Noted for Polio in U.S.

WASHINGTON, July 31.—The public health service today reported 1,665 new cases of infantile paralysis were reported in the nation last week, a new weekly high for the year and well above the five-year average.

The new cases marked a 20 per cent increase over the 1,392 reported a week ago, the year's previous high. They also were 877 more than reported in the same week a year ago.

Ohio was hardest hit last week with new cases rising from 69 to 179 in the seven-day period. Iowa's case load also climbed sharply from 82 to 116.

The service said polio attacks were easing off somewhat in the south, which has been having the brunt of the 1952 surge.

But in Texas, where polio has been most severe, new cases rose from 285 to 350 last week and the incidence in Mississippi rose from 81 to 64.

Other Increases  
Other states reporting a large number of new cases were Michigan with 78; New York, 76; California, 72; Nebraska, 68; Kentucky, 51; and Florida, 20.

Since the beginning of the "disease year" March 26, 7,690 cases have been reported, compared with 4,840 in the same period a year ago. In the last bad polio year, 1949, 7,297 cases were reported.

### Isotopes Help Disease Study

MOSCOW, July 31.—A special research project at the University of Idaho will use isotopes to learn more about curly-top, one of the Pacific Northwest's most serious plant diseases.

Starting with tomatoes, the researchers will feed radioactive phosphorus to plants and follow it through their circulatory system.

Dr. Harold McIlvaine, associate professor of botany, said, "Thus, disease and healthy plants and those with varying degrees of resistance can be compared."

"From such studies may come information which will help farmers in their defense against plant diseases such as curly-top," he said.

Principal victims of curly-top, which is carried by the desert leaf-hopper, are beans, beets and tomatoes. It also affects many other garden vegetables and more than 80 species of flowering plants.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 31.—The west coast maritime industry still recovering from the effects of a 62-day sailor's strike, was hit by another partial shipping stop today.

CIO radio operators started picketing four ships here at 6 a. m. (PTT) after union and management representatives failed to resolve a jurisdictional dispute over manning of radio-telephone equipment.

Threatened Spread  
The radio union sent 20 men to four piers and said it would spread the picketing to 17 other ships unless the dispute were settled.

"Two huge passenger liners, American President Lines' Presidents Wilson and Cleveland, were scheduled to sail with full passenger and cargo loads for the coast within the next two days."

A spokesman for the shipowners said they were doing "everything possible to resolve the dispute."

"Caught in Middle"  
But J. Paul St. Sure, president of the Pacific Maritime association, said: "We are caught in the middle."

The strike threat arose over demands by the American Radio Association (CIO) that radio-telephone equipment on the 20 ships be operated exclusively by members of their union.

The equipment previously has been operated by deck officers, members of the Masters, Mates and Pilots union (AFL).
