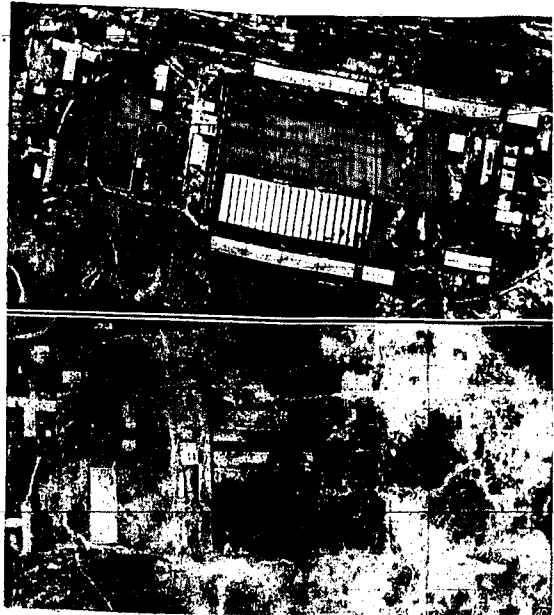

OUR TARIFF POLICY

Now it's Swiss watches. Before that it was things like almonds, garlic, men's suits, and cheese.

These are not random grabs from Alice in Wonderland. They have a great deal in common—the United States tariff policy. The tariff policy in turn is an important hinge on which much of our foreign policy swings.

Take watches. The Swiss now hear that this country may raise the import duty on their famous timekeepers. That would put our own watch industry in a better competitive position by increasing the purchase price of Swiss watches here.

But Swiss rose like an Alp. And they have a point. Every tenth Swiss industrial worker is in the watch industry. Last year one-fourth of Switzerland's exports were watches and clocks. Most of them were produced for export, and about half go to this country.

Furthermore, the Swiss last year bought 60 per cent more United States goods than the United States bought from the Swiss. That's an unfavorable trade balance most any way you look at it.

It was the secretary of the Swiss Watchmakers union to remark:

"The western European working man cannot continue to produce under a free enterprise system if our channels of trade are choked off.

"On the one side, we have the iron curtain, which paralyzes trade relations with the east. On the other side, are we now to see a tariff curtain closed against our trade with the United States?"

Before the watch business came up the other day, President Truman had refused to raise the tariff on garlic, which would have been a blow to Italy's export of that unsociable garlic.

The president explained in effect at that time that he couldn't see the sense in investing billions of dollars in aid to a country like Italy and then putting obstacles in the path of its paying its own way. Every such step, he said, is "a harmful to mutual security and costly in the end to the consumer and to the American taxpayer."

Some believe the President's statement and certain subsequent events may foreshadow a further lowering of this country's tariff barriers in the interest of freer world trade, even at the expense of protecting certain of our native industries.

That belief gains strength with the recent news that a British firm has won a defense department contract to furnish the electrical equipment for a North Dakota dam. Under earlier Pentagon policy a foreign company had to bid 25 per cent under U. S. companies to get such a contract.

The turnabout was reportedly the result of pressure on the defense department by the state department and the mutual security agency.

A few more happenings such as these should indicate pretty clearly that U. S. tariff barriers, possibly not at all-time low, will get a further thinning in the interest of winning friends abroad. And in the not incidental interest of encouraging them to help pay their own ways.

SWINGING TO IKE

The dissemination of many leading newspapers to the Eisenhower cause, especially in the southern and border states, may have a far greater influence on the November election than in recent years, when the press generally backed opponents of Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry S. Truman. It is causing deep concern at Democratic headquarters.

In the first place, the newspapers have a far more likable, appealing and trustworthy candidate than they did in Tom Dewey. In 1948, even though many editors did not like the Truman program, they did not feel that they could place their faith in the New York opportunist.

Moreover, the newspapers have shifted for reasons which may motivate many voters next November. Ever since the victory which 20 years of Democratic rule has accomplished, they believe that it is time for a changeover. That is a factor which is basic in our political philosophy and experience.

There is no bitterness in the editorials which proclaim for the instead of Adlai. All agree that the Eisenhower victory, by its best man, an honest, able and intelligent state executive, but they do not believe that this consideration alone outweighs pro-I Eisenhower factors.

Numerous southern newspapers advance an even more compelling reason. It seems to be their hope that an Eisenhower victory, especially if it is achieved through carrying several Dixie states, will help to restore the two-party system in that section. It might lead to a readjustment of parties, on a national scale, in accord with a more logical and orderly pattern.

Anyway, speaking practically, the movement has strengthened Republican hopes, which sagged a bit after the election of the Eisenhower-Adlai ticket.

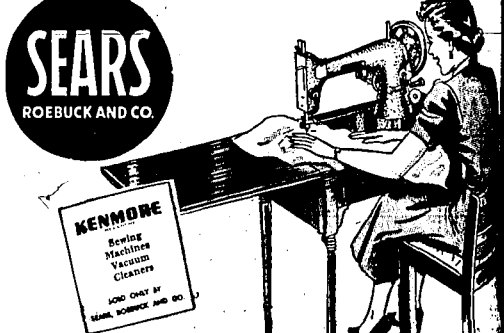

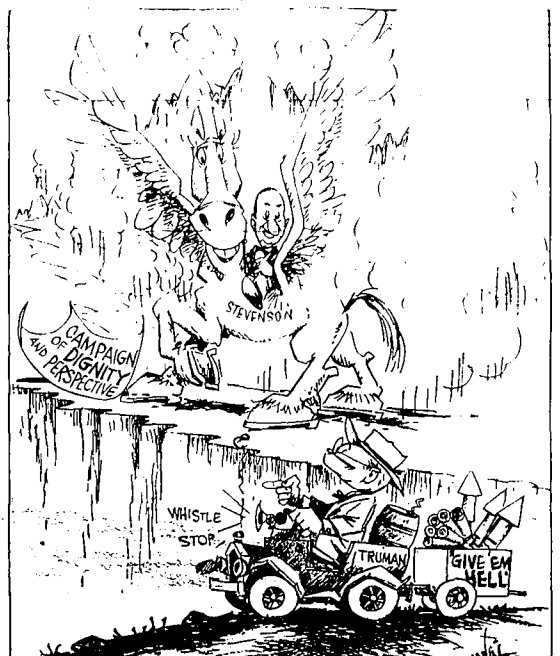

Cabinet Eyes "Grim" News In Iran Row

LONDON, Aug. 7 (AP)—Prime Minister Winston Churchill convened a special cabinet meeting today to discuss the "very grim" prospects of a communist coup in Iran.

Britain was reported preparing new proposals for a settlement of the Anglo-Iranian oil dispute in an attempt to keep Iran from falling to the Reds.

The latest reports from Tehran indicate the situation is becoming very grim; a foreign office spokesman said.

Analysis Monte
The spokesman said reports from Tehran by British and American officials coincided and anxiety was mounting in both countries.

Although other pressing subjects also were on the agenda, "alarming reports" from Iran was understood to be the main reason for the session.

Ames Situation
Churchill and his ministers planned to assess the situation and determine what, if anything, can be done to forestall any red grab for power.

The government was believed to be in close touch with the United States on the red threat and the two powers presumably would act together. The U. S. has helped arm and train the Iranian army and has made Iran a key country in its point four economic assistance program.

Checks Show Small Impact

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—Fearful of the impact of the drought on business activity and employment, Secretary of Commerce Sawyer has taken a poll of his field offices which shows:

No serious slump in any area, but some sharp increases in production prices; scattered setbacks to rural trade; some decrease in the hiring of harvesters and, in a few areas, a threat to factory production if dry weather persists.

The drought has business men as well as farmers scanning the skies for rainclouds. Sawyer has ordered a repeat survey next Monday and has most of them informed him that crop damage—estimated at around a billion dollars—so far, has not been reflected in curtailed buying or hiring in agricultural centers.

PARIS, Aug. 7 (AP)—U. S. Secretary of the Army Frank C. Pace, Jr. is here on an inspection tour to check France's mobilization plans, was scheduled to confer today with French War Secretary Pierre de Chevigny.

Pace was reported to have explained that he was powerless to change the sum congress had allocated for foreign aid, and that the army does not have separate funds available.

Athens itself was calm, but authorities issued a precautionary alert to gendarmery and army units.

No Danger Seen By U. S. Officials

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—American officials said today they see no particular danger to world peace in the Greek military move to retake a tiny island in the Evros river.

U.N. Bombing Drive Aims to 'Destroy Will'

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—The United Nations command has embarked on a systematic bombing campaign deliberately calculated to destroy the enemy's will to hold out against an armistice in Korea.

Military officials here placed this interpretation on the Tokyo announcement that military targets in North Korea population centers have been selected for destruction.

The plan is to hit some of these objectives earlier in the war but generally try to avoid bombing population centers unless urgent military needs dictated otherwise.

Located Year Ago Many of these military targets in North Korea cities had been accurately located more than one year ago. But that was when the air force decided its most profitable effort should be directed against slowing the flow of supplies to Korea from Manchuria.

The new bombing campaign announced from Tokyo says that civilians in North Korea are subject to bombing and strafing when military targets in their area are attacked. Leaflets dropped behind enemy lines blame the red leaders for jeopardizing civilians by hiding military objectives in population areas.

Frank Calculation The psychological angle is frankly calculated to wear down the will of civilians and their leaders and thus to weaken the enemy's war effort.

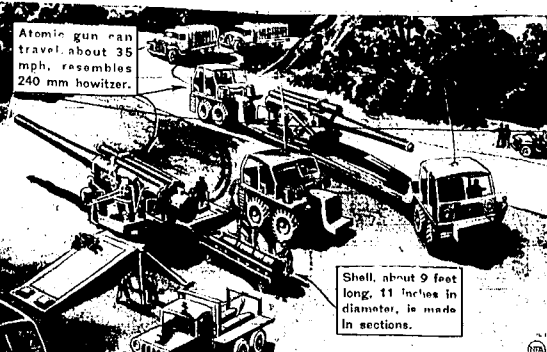

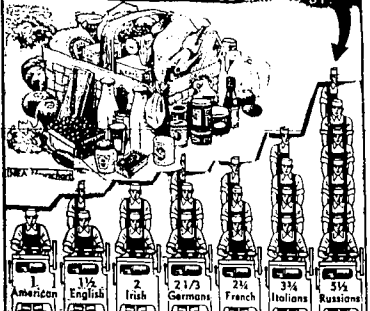

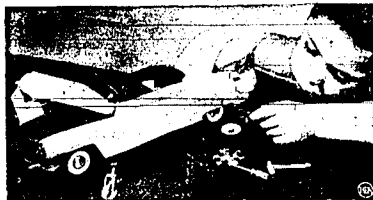
