Bigger State Potato Yield Is Predicted

BOISE, Aug. 15—Idaho's potato crop is estimated at 40,800,000 bushels by the U. S. department of agriculture, more than three million bushels larger than last year's. Although it is expected to be above the 1943-44 average it will be well below the crops of 1943, 1944, 1946, 1948 and 1950.

Official weather during July was favorable for potatoes and most farmers were able to keep adequate water on their crop. About 85 per cent of Idaho's production will be Russets, compared with 92 per cent last year. Andrew Johnston, state potato expert, said Idaho's state potatoes were ahead up to the 1943-44 average. The state's sweet cherry crop has been estimated at 4,700 tons and the sour cherry crop at 1,200 tons. The state's plum crop is estimated at 2,242,000 tons; nuts, 8,883,000 bushels, and corn, 2,430,000 bushels.

GOPers Applaud Rejection Of Briefing Bid; Stevenson Sees Farm, Labor Leaders

Republicans applauded Dwight D. Eisenhower today for spurning an invitation to a White House briefing, and one Republican leader urged the GOP presidential nominee to follow up with an "all-out" attack upon administration foreign policy.

Sen. Styles Bridges, New Hampshire, senate Republican leader, said it would be "ridiculous" for Eisenhower to enter into any bipartisan arrangement to keep foreign policy out of the campaign. In fact, Bridges said, "I don't think General Eisenhower or the Republicans can win without an all-out attack on administration foreign policy."

In the Democratic camp, meanwhile, Illinois Gov. Adlai Stevenson, party presidential nominee, turned to a heavy round of political talks with spokesmen for farm and labor organizations.

Bridges echoed the sentiments of other Republicans when he said Eisenhower, by declining the White House invitation now, will be "free to campaign without restrictions."

Republicans also attacked the invitation as a "shoddy trick," designed to get the administration "back the book" after a similar briefing for Stevenson "boomeranged."

In an obvious attempt to meet Eisenhower's pointed reference to the receipt of the invitation only after the Stevenson speaking tour, Truman told his conferees yesterday he had offered over a week ago to supply the general top-secret intelligence reports on war affairs, the same as Eisenhower.

Later, Gen. Omar N. Bradley, chairman of the joint chiefs of staff, confessed he had not relayed the presidential offer to Eisenhower because it was "a shoddy trick."

In Springfield, Ill., the APN, the CIO and the American Farm Bureau Federation were representing the Democratic presidential nominee's calling list today.

Other developments today in the presidential race included:

1. California Democratic National Committee Chairman, Earl Warren, in Springfield for a conference with Stevenson, said Sen. Styles-Bridges' attack on the administration was "a shoddy trick" to get the "all-out" for Stevenson.

2. Ford also reported Stevenson probably will make two campaign swings through California, this fall.

3. Publisher, Wayne W. Martin, said in Washington that Stevenson would assign independent experts to study the "all-out" of Stevenson.

4. Democratic National Chairman Stephen A. Mitchell said a new campaign strategy was being developed by Stevenson the possibility of challenging Eisenhower to a television debate on campaign issues.

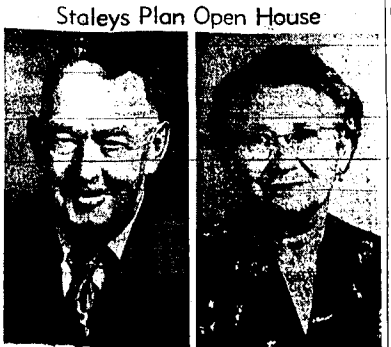
