## Stir Created In Camps of Both Parties

From AP and UP Reports  
Pre-campaign comments by both Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson were providing a test Friday of the harmony and unity within the ranks of their two parties.

Stevenson returned to campaign problems, particularly the question of what to do with a President who won't take a back seat.

Eisenhower, back in his Denver campaign headquarters, also was beset by rumbblings of inter-party dissension over such issues as "time-isolationism," "McCarthyism" and the Korean war.

As he prepared to leave his vacation retreat in northern Wisconsin and return to Springfield, Ill., Stevenson faced the problem of President Truman being visibly vexed over his campaign strategy.

Stevenson never has declared himself dissatisfied with his party's 20-year record in Washington, only claiming it needs "refreshing." He indicated, however, he still is trying to find a way to stand independent of the Truman administration when he termed two of Mr. Truman's pet projects, the Brannan farm plan and compulsory health insurance, "obsolete" yesterday.

While Stevenson sought to steer independent course, private grumbling in the Republican camp hinted Eisenhower was coming too close to the White House.

## No Early End Of U. S. Price Gain Is Seen

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—Price officials today forecast no immediate end to the inflationary spiral which already has taken the cost of living to an all-time high.

At best, all they could forecast was a slight flattening of the inflationary curve in the months ahead.

The bureau of labor statistics reported yesterday the cost of living index in the country last month to reach a new peak. The rise, paced by sharp advances in food prices, put the consumer price index at 169.5 percent of the 1933-34 average. That means the average family now is paying almost twice as much for its needs as before World War I.

Steady climb  
The government's cost-of-living index has been climbing steadily upward for the past five months. Price officials said firmly to the dispirited prediction of Federal Reserve Governor Ellis Arnall that the upward trend will continue for months to come.

Arnall has based his prediction on the combined effects of a weak price control law, the steel strike settlement, and the drought. He said that the government has not been shared by other government officials, particularly Economic Stabilizer Roger L. Conant, Secretary of Agriculture Charles F. Brannan.

Levels this month  
Because of some slight declines in food prices in the past month, price officials said the cost-of-living index for August is expected to reach the July 15 record high.

But after that, price officials feared the inflationary price spiral would continue. They pointed to two factors whipping up the inflationary tide—food and steel.
