Report by Bureau Sees Big Idaho Like for Population

BOISE, Aug. 25 (AP)—Idaho's population is expected to increase from 857,000 to 892,000 in 1953, according to a report adopted by the state's population committee.

The committee forecasts that Idaho's population will reach 1,000,000 by 1975—nearly twice the national rate of increase.

H. T. Nelson, Boise, chairman of the committee, says the report is the work of the regional director of the U. S. Census Bureau.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—Republican Presidential nominee Dwight D. Eisenhower warned the nation today of a great peril from the Soviet Union, the Democratic opponent, Adlai Stevenson, faced trouble at home.

Eisenhower said in a speech to the 47th annual American Legion convention in New York that Russia's craving for power puts the U. S. "in greater peril than at any time in our history."

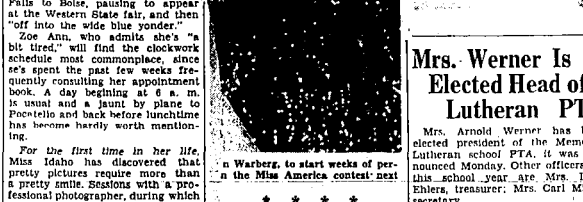

The invitation for formal answers came from Sen. John Sparkman, Alabama, Democratic nominee for vice president in the role as chairman of the senate small business committee.

It resulted from release of edited portions of a critical and controversial report on an international oil cartel, kept secret for more than a year by the committee.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—The political independence of the federal government is being tested during the presidential campaign as a result of Truman-Snyder concern that rising interest rates on money.

For more than a year, it has followed the latter policy, although its efforts have been offset partly by government spending and congressional termination of consumer controls.

UNHAPPY—In early 1953 the reserve negotiated an agreement with treasury under which it refused to support government bonds at par, and to purchase federal securities at a premium from the bank.

REPERCUSSIONS—Although the monetary operations of the federal reserve board and member banks are an extremely complicated affair, they can have extremely important political repercussions.

ILLUSION—Flushing these billions into business and industry created the illusion of good times, as well as inflation, consumer prices, and a boom in building.

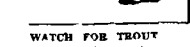

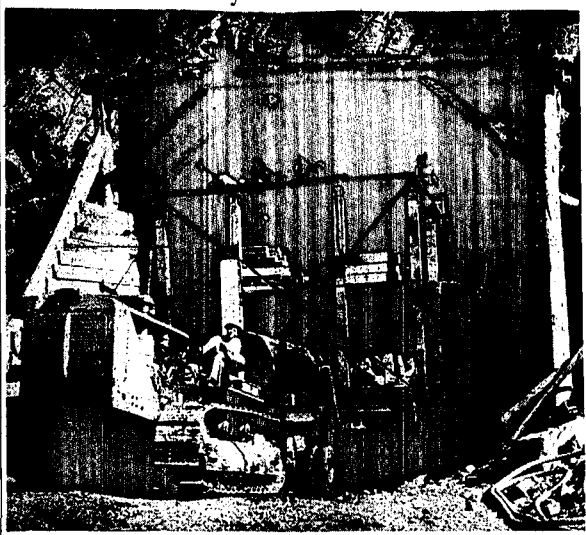

Giant Machinery Works on Palisades Dam



A triple-decker "jumbo" drill rig is at work driving two 31-foot diameter diversion tunnels through the rock abutment of Palisades dam. Mounted on the decks are 15 compressed air drills which are drilling holes 8 to 12 feet deep. After drilling about 120 holes, the "jumbo" is wheeled out by the tractor and the holes are loaded and blasted. 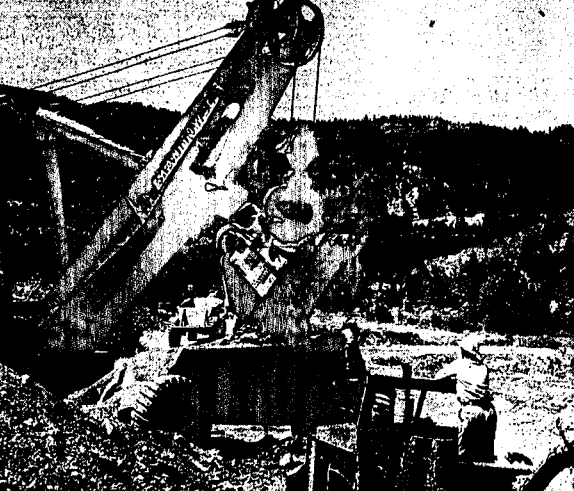

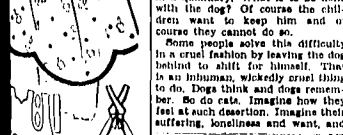

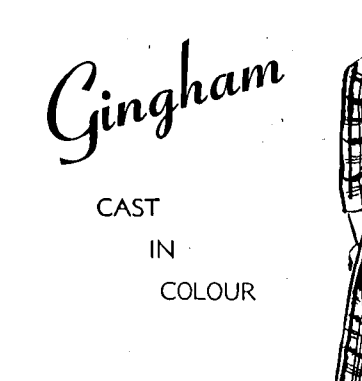

ADA Report Flunks All 4 State Solons

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (Special)—The left-wing American for Democratic Action has issued reports on the voting records of members of congress during the last session. Idaho's entire four-man delegation all Republican. On 13 selected issues Sen. Herman Weiker voted wrong, in the eyes of ADA, every time. His "perfect" bad record was duplicated by a half-dozen other Republicans.

In the "completely correct" column were such men as Sens. Estes Kefauver, D. Tenn., and Hubert Humphrey, D. Minn.

Sen. Henry Dworshak missed a perfect anti-ADA record by only one vote. He favored statehood for Alaska and Hawaii, as does ADA.

In the house, Rep. Hanner Rudge slipped up and voted twice out of 13 times along lines supported by ADA. Although absent on one vote, Rep. John T. Wood's record while voting was a perfect tally against the ADA position.

Conclusions Noted
ADA concludes in its current copy of its monthly newspaper: "Successful holding action on the basic structure of our foreign policy and almost complete abandonment of sound principle in our domestic program marked the record of the 82nd congress. While the congress did not match the majority of the Republican dominated 80th, it came very near to it."

ADA has endorsed the Democratic ticket of Stevenson-Sparkman.

Idaho's Senators Show Best Record in Voting Agreement

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (Special)—Idaho's Senators Dworshak and Welker agreed with each other more than any other pair of Republican solons in the last congress, a review of their voting record showed today.

Noting together 248 times and differing only 17 times out of a total of 265 roll calls, the Idahoans topped the 18 GOP teams with a harmony percentage of 93.

This mark put them below the "agreeingest" Democrats—Sen. Lister Hill and Vice Presidential Nominer John Sparkman, Alabama. The southerners saw the same way on 276 votes and split on only nine for a percentage of 96.

The Dworshak-Welker percentage might have been higher if the junior senator's attendance record for the 82nd congress had been closer to his colleague's. Dworshak led the Republicans in the senate with 98 per cent on the record, but Welker lagged with an 89.

The Idahoans still were far above the average GOP state team, who could get together only 79 per cent of the time. Bottom men for the Republicans were Oregon's Wayne Morse and Guy Gordon, who opposed each other on 49 per cent of their ballots.

In Oregonians differed more than Democrats. Pat McCarran and Republican George Malone, Nevada. This pair led the dozen bi-partisan teams with an agreement percentage of 76.

By coincidence, Idaho's eastern neighbor produced the "disagreeingest" mixed combination where arch-new deal Democrat James E. Murray and Republican Zules N. Dixon took opposing stands 59 per cent of the time.

Dworshak and Welker were closest in close array of the last congress with 117 similar votes and only six at odds, a percentage of 93.

In the 1051 session, their record was 251 agreed and 22 opposed—only 92.4 per cent.

Foreign policy found the Idahoans in close array of the 72 present votes, they divided only once. This was when Welker voted in favor of Alaska statehood and Dworshak opposed. At the time, Welker said he acted principally out of friendship for various Alaskans and he admitted their case was not practical.

Least harmony was shown in military and veterans affairs, where Dworshak and Welker voted together 19 times and split twice. Their second most frequent clash
