

The French franc has taken another dip, and with it dip the hopes that the Pinay government is long for this world. He's not out yet, but the fiscal handwriting is on the wail.

The latest dido of the mercurial franc accompanied warnings by the French defense minister that France was in for more economic trouble if she didn't get more orders for military goods from the United States.

France had been counting on more than 600 million dollars worth of such orders, but it looks like she will get less than a third of that.

If General Exenhower should lose the election, Senator Evereit Dirksen of Illinois will probably join Tom Dewey as at least a partial architect of defeat in what started out as a propilious political year.

The Illinois senator made enemies for himself with his personal and unnecessary attack on Dewey at the Republican convention. He made a bad impression on several thousand delegates and alternates, important members in their communities and in their local political organizations.

Before leaving Chicago, many important and humble Republicans expressed the hope that "The would keep that man Dirksen, along with Dewey, out of the campaign."

Now, Dirksen makes the unsubstantiated charge that "Stevenson was the worst governor of Illinois' in 60 years. Every fair and thinking voter in Illinois knows that this is not true. The honor—or dishonor—probably goes to Gov. Dwight Green, whom Stevenson defeated by 572,000.

To make it worse, Dirksen continues to revive Stevenson's Hiss affidavit, and makes the unpardonable statement that the governor's divorced wife plants to vote against him. How petty can a politician get—and how illogical?

Fortunately, Ike has no sympathy with these tactics, any more than he agrees with the Dirksen-Jenier-Capehart faction of foreign affairs. But with Elsenhower silent at the moment, it may be the utterances of the Dirksens that will be remembered and resented on Nov. 4.

Whether it be Democratic or Republican, the next senate will undoubtedly give a hard look at the ANZUS pact, which has not been ratified.

Briefly, this agreement guarantees that, if Australia, New Zesland or the United States is attacked, the other two inctions will come to its aid. We have similar arrangements with Japan and the Philippines, and we have applied this theory in Korea, as the French would like us to do in Indo-China, and the Brittah in Majaya, etc.

Although these preparations look toward and seem to be a tightening and strengthening of our defenses in this area, the fact is that almost the entire cost of the project will fall on the United States. We seem to be taking in a lot of territory without the manyower, the weapons or the money to defend it.

New Zealand, for instance, cannot bear her share of the burden for almost the same reason that Britain cannot do her part. New Zealand 1s spending only \$70,000,000 for defense out of a budget of \$300,000,000.

But she will spend as much as \$273,000.
