## Traffic Delays Its Decision on Area Trespass Charge

CHICAGO, Aug. 26.—Automobiles are killing people at the rate of 104 per day on the nation's streets, highway and airways.

Last week the traffic death toll was 37,900, the National Safety Council reported. During the first six months of 1951, 228,000 fatalities were reported, an increase over the half year toll of 1950.

But how good, or bad, is the nation's traffic safety record? What's wrong? What should be done? Can matters be improved?

Actually, traffic accidents account for about one-fourth of deaths from all causes throughout the nation. The comparison in 1950 was 35,000 traffic deaths to 146,000 deaths from all causes.

### Heavy Infestation of Earwigs Is Giving Cassia County Trouble

BURLEY, Aug. 26—Earwigs are on the increase, Glenn J. Booth, Cassia county agricultural agent reports. "These pests have invaded nearly all sections of the county and are becoming one of the most troublesome visitors in gardens and lawns," he said. Booth recommended DDT as the best medicine to discourage the pest. He said his office has had a number of calls from city and country residents trying to eliminate the bugs that were comparatively scarce a few years ago, but have gained such a foothold they now are found in practically all communities. The increase in earwigs developed because winter conditions were favorable for survival and because control has not been carried out in enough places, the agent explained. He recommends a concerted attack by neighbors and communities. The county agent said earwigs can be kept down by spraying with a solution of four pounds of wettable DDT in 100 gallons of water. The spray works best if applied under pressure. Dusting is practical on small areas. He said the chemical should be applied to foundations of buildings and in dark, damp corners.

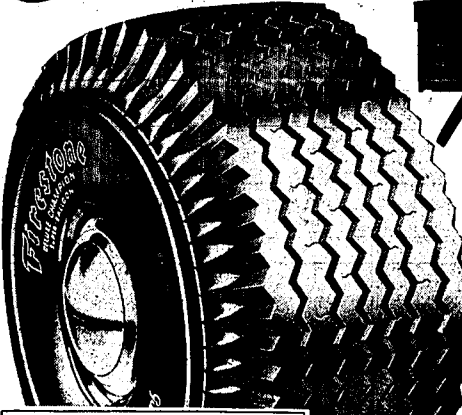

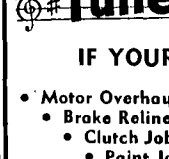
