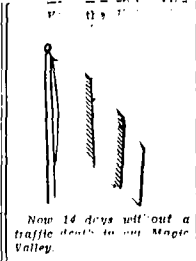

Experts Work Out Tideland's "Compromise"

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27 (AP)—Staff experts of two government departments and a senate committee already are working on the Adlai E. Stevenson proposal for legislation to settle the tideland oil dispute, it was learned today.

The Democratic presidential nominee announced last week that he opposed state ownership of the oil-rich submerged coastal lands because the supreme court had ruled the federal government has paramount rights to them. He called for legislation "indefinite" of both state and federal interests to administer the lands and distribute revenues from their oil.

Staff members of the interior and justice departments and the senate interior committee are expected to hold exploratory conferences to see what sort of compromise can be worked out.

CITES DANGER

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27 (AP)—Sen. Allen J. Ellender, D., La., said today Governor Stevenson's stand on the tideland oil dispute "seriously jeopardizes" the Democratic party's chances of carrying Louisiana in the presidential election.

Ellender told a press conference he "personally" would support Stevenson by voting for him, but he would not campaign for the Democratic nominee.

CALIFORNIA CONFIDENT

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Aug. 27 (AP)—California Atty.-Gen. Edmund G. Brown has expressed confidence that Governor Stevenson will hear both sides of the tideland argument.

Brown, an influential force in California's Democratic party, said despite the defeat of his father's presidential slate by Sen. Estes Kefauver, and last night Stevenson took his stand without knowing California's side of the case.

Big Heroin Ring Declared Halted

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 27 (AP)—A "million-dollar-a-year" heroin ring was reported smashed Tuesday by state narcotics agents, one of whom posed as a "vice king" as a lure to trap his three alleged members.

The arrests, described as the most important in northern California in a year and a half, climaxed six weeks of investigation, agents said.

George Minnie, supervising inspector of the California division of narcotics enforcement, said the ring used a San Francisco Chinatown soy cake factory as a front for its huge wholesale operations.

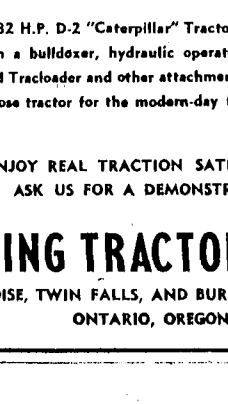

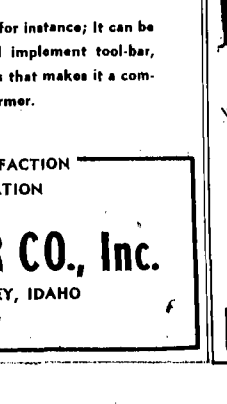

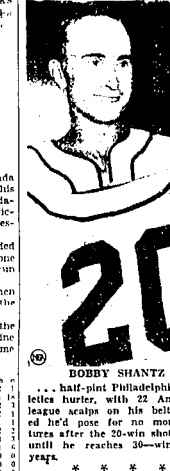

Turnover in Teacher Roll High in State

BOISE, Aug. 27 (AP)—The turnover of teachers in Idaho schools this year may reach more than 30 per cent, Assistant State Superintendent of Public Instruction J. H. Harney said today.

State school officials are working against time to fill by the opening of the fall term the large number of vacancies still existing. Most schools in the state will start next week.

Harney said the turnover this year is one of the highest in recent years. Normal turnover, he said, probably is closer to 20 or 25 per cent. Even the established teachers in Idaho have been advised to higher paying districts in other states. The effect is light in the picture, he said, is that some teachers will not be in Idaho because they like Idaho.

100 Vacant

George S. Spilver, director of teacher placement in the Idaho employment security agency, said about 400 vacancies have been reported to his office. Of these, he said, probably about 100 still are unfilled.

Both Harney and Spilver said it is too early to tell whether any of the vacancies will remain unfilled because the situation changes rapidly by this time of year.

The greatest number of openings, Harney said, are in the low-paying and inaccessible rural areas. There has been a particular shortage of elementary teachers.

Specialized Shortage

Spilver said his office also has found a shortage of specialized teachers, such as for music, commerce and home economics.

The turnover among school administrators also has been high, Harney said, that of 107 school districts in Idaho supporting high schools, 28 will have new superintendents.

At the employment security office, Spilver said, there have been three vacancies for every teacher applicant. The office has placed one out of every two applicants and the others have found jobs easily on their own.

As a centralized agency the ESA teacher placement bureau is in its first year.

Veterans Advised Of New Ruling on Insurance Policy

Veterans with term GI insurance policies may be able to benefit under a new ruling on the part of the public law 36 which provides for the use of unpaid GI insurance dividends to pay now expired GI policies.

According to the veterans administration, a recent interpretation of the law provides that where a term GI insurance policy expires on or after Jan. 1, 1952, and the veteran has not made a written request for payment of the dividend in cash prior to expiration of the term period, such dividend may be used to pay the insurance and pay the first premium.

In such a case, the VA said, the veterans will be advised that removal of the insurance has been effected in that manner and will be asked to complete an application for renewal to be placed in his official folder with the VA.

The veteran will be advised of the premium rate for the new term period and advised to continue paying premiums at the new rate.

Any surplus of the dividend, over and above the amount needed to renew the policy, will remain on credit to the veteran's account and need to pay any future premiums.

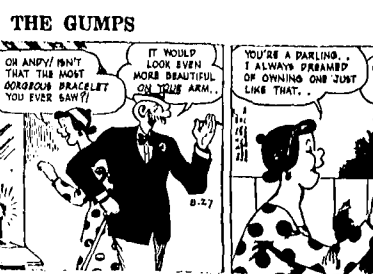

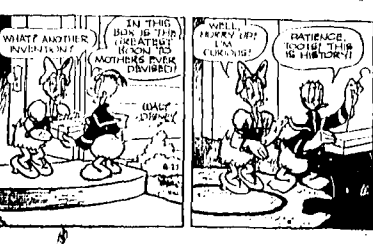

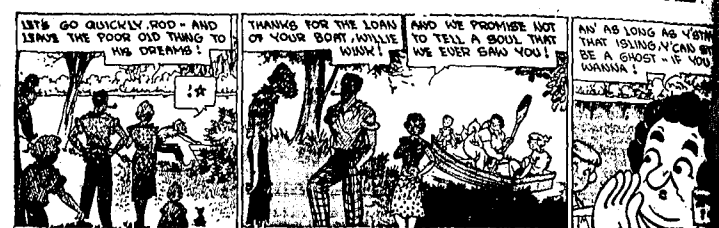

Dealers Note No Backlog of Car Demand

DETROIT, Aug. 27 (AP)—Contrary to earlier expectations, the new car strike did not build up a backlog of unshipped demand in the automobile industry.

This is disclosed by recent surveys of the car market. Curtailed output and normal midsummer demand did clear out the stock of most dealers, but an abnormal accumulation of new cars is not expected.

The showing of the streets disturbs many new car dealers. Many dealers lost money during the first quarter of the year, when new car sales totaled 817,171 units. They did not recapture all their losses in the second quarter, when new car sales totaled 817,171 units. They moved the strike's effect to the second quarter.

Many pessimists.

The surveys disclosed that many retailers were pessimistic about sales prospects for the remainder of the year. Those who believed sales would match output for the year qualified the view with the statement that they might have to be "forced" or that it could be done if production and prices do not go too high.

So there is more than a possibility that the final quarter of the year will show some dealers operating in the red again.

An interesting disclosure in the trade surveys was the rather widespread admission of retailers that even in July buyers were trying to drive hard bargains in top trade-in allowances. This is unusual at the top of the industry's peak sales period.

It appears to be agreed generally among most industry analysts that field stocks at the year-end will be substantially greater than they are at present. Of course they should be higher. Dealer inventories now total fewer than 200,000 new cars. A normal average is considered to be around 400,000. Dealer stocks have the bit that they are since governmental controls became effective more than a year ago.

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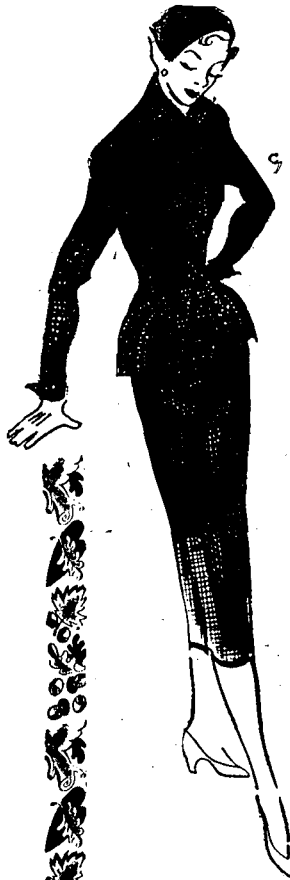

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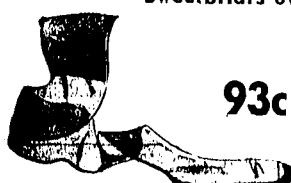
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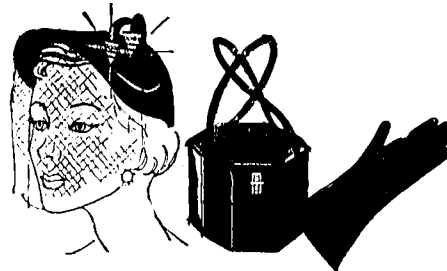
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
