OUR CHRAPANE' DOLLAR

A. V. Kinney, manager of Produce Containers, Inc., at Weiser, and Idaho member of the national committee of the National Association of Manufacturers, has warned that the American people are faced with the tragic prospect of our dollar being worth only about 25 cents by 1955 if the purchasing power of the dollar continues to decline as it has in the past 13 years.

Kinney bases this statement on a review of the diminishing purchasing power of the dollar, which has dropped from 100 cents in 1929 to 53 cents today.

According to Kinney, the loss of the dollar's purchasing power has been brought about by the deficit spending policy of the federal government, which has piled up a public debt from less than \$4 billion dollars in 1929 to some 260 billion dollars today, of which the public share is \$92 billion.

He pointed out that a \$250 monthly income for a family of four "won't go as far today as \$130 monthly in 1936 because of inflation and increased federal income taxes since that time."

"Moreover," he added, "the wage earner has nothing to show for his increase in experience and skill during the past 12 or 13 years."

Starting as it may seem, as Kinney points out, the burden of federal taxes, direct and indirect, has become so great that today the average Idaho family pays more in taxes each year than it pays for food!

"Millions of Americans today are fighting a losing battle to get along on savings, pension and insurance dollars worth more than 50 cents of their 1939 value," he reasons.

"It is true, as the politicians say, that people never had so much money as they have today. But, as these comparative figures show, much of our so-called prosperity is an illusion. No true, sound prosperity is achieved by government policies that continually cheapen the value of the dollar. There must be an end to the federal government's excessive wasteful spending of dollars it doesn't have. Deficit spending inevitably spells more inflation."

"That's a hard and cold fact that hasn't seeped into the American people's minds sufficiently to call a halt to the great spending spree by the present administration. They have been interested in what they seem to be getting, nothing from the government, a clever scheme which the master planners have worked to perfection for 20 years.

Sometimes it takes an indirect development to arouse the average American mind. American tourists going into Canada this summer, for instance, had their eyes opened just a bit. When they found that the dollars were not equal to Canada's on the rate of exchange, instead of it being the other way around not so many years ago, it began to dawn on them that our country's financial rating apparently is not quite as good as the New Dealers would like to have them believe. In fact, it was a little embarrassing for them to fork over the difference, when not so long ago it was difficult to pass Canadian money in this country.

But that's only one slight manifestation of the embarrassment we are bound to suffer in much greater ways if all this wastefulness, corruption and irresponsibility in our national government is permitted to continue.

The power to change all this is in the American people's hands as they go to the polls in November. But it remains to be seen whether they'll appraise this country's predicament realistically, or kid themselves a while longer, in the belief that there's still more time to go on getting "something for nothing."

MODERN EXAMPLE

Thirty years ago one of this country's big insurance companies, with a nice blending of good business sense and interest in the public weal, ran an advertisement in a national magazine on infant mortality.

That was the beginning of a national advertising program by the company which has produced dramatic results.

In keeping with the tone of its first ad, subsequent ones are notable for their good taste and restraint, but at times their subtlety has been dynamic.

For instance, as far back as 1929 the company brought out into the open the virtually taboo subject of syphilis, from which millions of Americans suffered and from which an estimated 200,000 died each year.

Now, thanks to the new miracle drugs and an enlightened public approach to the disease, syphilis is no longer the scourge it once was.

Cancer still is a hush-hush word with many, but back in 1920 the company began running ads on the subject, advising people of the importance of early and competent diagnosis.

These health messages, ranging across the wide field of disease, reached the heart in modern-day advertising, which too often has dipped far below our average national standards of taste and morality. And certainly the messages are a credit to the company which inspired them.

HOW THINGS APPEAR FROM PEGLER'S ANGLE

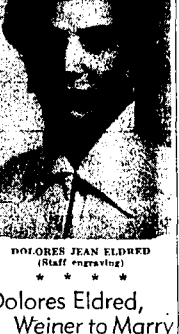

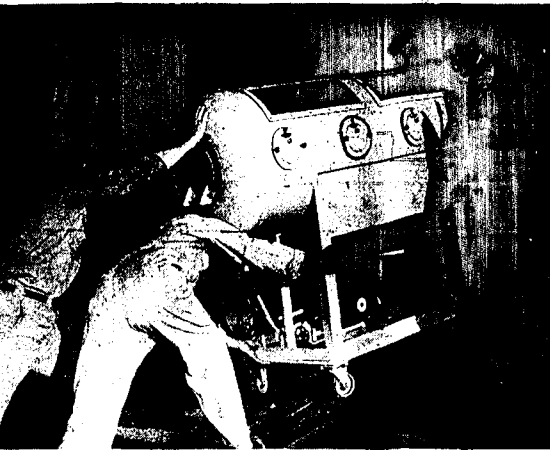
