New Egyptian Chief Nabs 48 For Hostages

BOISE, Sept. 8 (AP)—The announced today that he has arrested 48 prominent Egyptians to prevent the success of new land reform and anti-corruption programs. The weekly newspaper, *Al-Nahdha*, said 78 of the arrested had been taken into custody last night.

The cabinet also would act to purge Egypt's political life of corrupt leaders.

Undisputed head of the government, Gen. Naguib became undisputed head of the government as well as in fact when his cabinet choice for the premier, Ali Maher, resigned shortly after his appointment.

Gen. Naguib's roundup of prominent politicians at dawn today forced King Farouk to flee his throne July 26 at the start of a bloodless army coup, which overthrew the government.

Idaho Ranks 8th for Polio Toll in U. S.

BOISE, Sept. 8 (AP)—Idaho, in its third polio epidemic in five years, ranks eighth in the nation in a number of cases reported to date, according to figures released by the U. S. public health service and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Most of the polio was concentrated in three areas: Magic Valley in the south; Gem and Payette counties in central Idaho; and the Twin Falls-Two-Bluffs area in the north.

Nevada Worst

Idaho's rate of incidence is 263 cases per 100,000 population, statistics showed. Nevada is the highest hit, with an incidence rate of 520 cases per 100,000.

Fight to Block USAF Supply Network Won

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8 (AP)—A house watchdog subcommittee has won a year-old fight to prevent the air force from financing a new \$4.5-billion defense supply network.

The result, said Chairman Bonner D. Dwyer, will divert hundreds of millions of dollars that would be spent for research to actually meet the needs of existing equipment.

Seedless Tomatoes Developed by T. F. Man by Spraying Each Blossom on Vine

By Olive May Cook
Should you happen by Harold Lackey home at the corner of Fifth avenue and Fifth street north one of these cool nights, don't think Halloween's arrival early and a row of plants lined up along his garden will only give you a false idea.

These tomatoes have a two-fold value in home gardening. The large, luscious, red ones and, through this year's experiments, the small yellow preserving variety are both practically seedless. The unusual feature of the vines is another feature.

Lackey has been experimenting with growing "seedless" tomatoes for five years. Care must be taken to use a hormone spray on hands prepared with locally obtainable hormone tablets dissolved in water, and sprayed each blossom as it sets.

It doesn't matter what variety you plant, he advises, as long as he has had good success with both Burpee's hybrids and the John Baer variety. Some of his tomato vines reached a height of eight and one-half feet last year, and should measure up about the same this year. He says the tall growth, however, is not due to the hormone spraying but to the fact that he carefully stakes the plants, cutting off side or sucker shoots as they come on.

One can achieve this and have tomatoes growing in a much smaller position, as well as avoiding the loss of many that would otherwise drop to the ground and rot in water soaked or attacked by insects.

It will not be long now until people catch the "garden bug" and are busy flying outside to see they don't check up more on this phase of tomato production and be sure to make allowance for a few plants of fine seedless tomatoes in your 1936 garden.
