The bad word: "Damn."

Eisenhower, here on what literally was a flying visit, but he was an aviator he didn't have the slightest memory of having used the word during his Indianapolis speech.

But, he said, "I herewith want to apologize to anyone I may have offended."

Empire Remark

The whole thing came up because of an out-of-the-manufacturer comment made during his talk.

Eisenhower was having trouble with his mechanical promoter, that gadget on which a speech is printed and from which a speaker reads as if slowly revolving like an old player piano roll. The promoter wasn't keeping up with Eisenhower.

During a round of applause, the radio audience—but not those in the hall—heard something that sounded like "damn it!"

Checked on Tape

Reporters in the hall, who didn't hear the comment, listened to a play-back of a tape recording of the speech. They heard:

"Go ahead! Go ahead! Go ahead! Yeah, damn it, I want him to move up."

But Eugene O. Pullman, publisher of the Indianapolis Star and the Indianapolis News and an active Eisenhower supporter, was sitting close to the general. Pullman said a radio technician, not Eisenhower, did the cussing.

Eisenhower told the party workers it's part of his job to keep candidates from making mistakes.

And then he went on to say:

"I'm accused of having said something in my speech last night, and while I haven't the slightest memory of it, I will try to watch it in the future."

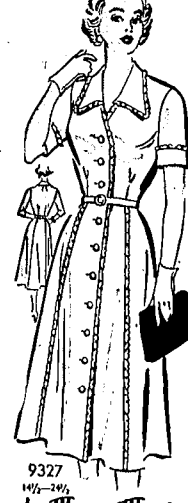

New Cases of Polio Soar to Record Peak

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11 (AP)—New polio cases set another all-time record last week and pushed the total number of cases in this year's outbreak past the record pace set in 1949, the U. S. public health service reports.

The service said 3,874 cases were reported in the week ending Sept. 6. It was the third consecutive week that new cases have reached an all-time high. The increase was about eight per cent over the previous week.

Top Record Year

For the current "disease year," which starts with the first week in April, the total number of cases reported is 26,050. It marked the first time since the present outbreak reached its height that the total has exceeded the record year of 1949 in which 25,450 cases were reported in the same period.

A public health service spokesman said medical authorities hope the current week may see the peak of the new polio outbreak.

Missouri Stricken

This week's summary noted the largest relative increase in cases occurred in Missouri, where the number reported rose from 66 in the previous week to 107 in the current report. The public health service said the increase probably was a result of delayed reports due to the Labor day holiday.

The report also noted the high incidence of polio in Deuel county, S. D., where only one case had been reported previously this year. The report said it is "quite possible" that the outbreak there may later be diagnosed as some other virus infection similar to polio since the cases are mild and without paralysis.

The issue appeared to further divide the "high" and "low" elements of the Protestant Episcopal church at its 87th triennial meeting here.

Rev. Albert J. Dubois, executive secretary of the "high church" American church union, said "the women of the church already have a house of their own in the woman's auxiliary."

A joint commission of the house of deputies, lay governing body, and the house of bishops, reported favorably yesterday on admitting women to the lower house.

Kimball Acts To "Protect" Naval Rights

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 11.—The Secretary of Navy Dan Kimball has arrived here for a first-hand inspection of the Santa Margarita reservation and to see that "the navy gets a fair deal."

The government's suit against landowners in the water rights case on the docket, he declared, and "we don't intend to take it off."

The suit involves water rights the navy contends belong to the government through the purchase of the vast marine reservation at Camp Pendleton.

Kimball said he planned to inspect Camp Pendleton and the water-traded area, but wasn't sure any of the litigants in the case.

Available for Talks
"I told the Fallbrook people if they wanted to talk to me, that was fine," the secretary said when asked if he would see city persons representing interests opposed to the government.

The government has no tentative agreement under consideration, he declared. A compromise worked out in 1949 never was approved by the government because "we found out that legally we couldn't sign it," he said.

Congress put a crimp on original plans for prosecuting the government's case by sticking to the Justice department's appropriations so none of its funds could be used in the prosecution.

Hailed Navy Aid
The congressional action also stopped the navy from borrowing the Justice department's water expert, William Vedder, from presenting the case for the navy.

Kimball had no comment on how the navy would proceed when the case gets into court.

The government suit is directed against 2,400 residents of Santa Margarita river basin over water rights which the government claims it purchased when the Camp Pendleton marine base was established near Oceanside in the Fallbrook area.

Report Given for Summer Program

First A-Bomb Proof Building

The 10-story reinforced concrete building has an interior which its designers maintain will resist anything but a direct hit by an A-bomb. The building will cost two million dollars and will take 18 months to complete.

Farmer Union Dedication Will Start A-Bomb Proof Building

DENVER, Sept. 11.—(Special)—Dedication of the cornerstone of the first atom bomb proof building in America, the new headquarters of the National Farmers Union, is scheduled here Saturday.

The dedication will coincide with the launching of a drive to raise five million dollars to develop the union's extensive peach and phosphate holdings in New Mexico and Utah.

Spokesmen for the union say development of the buildings will mark the first time a farm organization has gone into the basic fertilizer manufacturing business on a commercial scale.

"We're going to bring some real competition to the fertilizer industry," James G. Patton, the organization's president, predicted.

The new building will have floor space of approximately 125,000 square feet. It will be owned by the National Farmers Union Life Insurance company and will house the national headquarters of the union, the Rocky Mountain Farmers union, and the organization's network of cooperative business and insurance services.

Reminder for Taxes Issued
