**Filer "Jet" Band Presents New Show on Gridiron Each Week**

FILER, Sept. 19—Time was when all a band had to do was march and play music.

But today it's different. Now a band can't be content with just plain marching; it has to entertain as well. It has to execute novel and difficult formations for the entertainment of the spectators.

The Filer high school's new band is such an organization. Each week it presents a new series of formations for the entertainment of spectators at football games.

Nick Chroniak, band director, works out the formations a week in advance and then puts the 32 band members through a series of intensive drills for the shows.

Most bands march in a cadence of 132 steps a minute. Chroniak has stepped up the cadence of the Filer band to 150—sometimes faster—and has named the band a "jet band" because of its speed.

For the game Friday the band will execute a "V" at a run to the 50-yard line on the football field and then will break into regular band formation.

Using what Chroniak calls a "scatter system," the band then will form a many batteship and march down the field. Breaking rapidly from the batteship formation the band then will form a bow and arrow and actually shoot the "manner arrow down the field.

Marching across the field to the home stands, band members will form a large wigwam. Lights will go out in the stadium and the formation will be outlined in lights.

Under spotlights the majorettes will do an Indian dance while Drum Major Nancy Jo Davis enters from beneath the flap on the wigwam.

**ADLAI'S TIN-HORN SATIRE**

General Eisenhower suggested a sobering thought the other day when he told a crowd at Fort Wayne, Ind., that "see nothing funny about the issues of the presidential campaign."

Obviously this remark was aimed at Adlai Stevenson's repeated attempts to wisecrack himself into public favor.

"I am in this business (running for President) because I believe America is in peril," said Eisenhower. "There is nothing funny in that."

"We are involved in a war in Korea without any plans for winning it. We have had 170,000 casualties in killed and wounded. There is nothing funny in that."

He could have gone on, of course, in listing a good many other things to the present administration's discredit, which are anything but funny. This country's demoralizing ineffectiveness, all the graft and corruption in the government itself, and its general inefficiency.

The point to be gained from all this is that Stevenson is devoting altogether too much of his campaign to petty ridicule and satire which make him sound more and more like Truman himself.

A further point to be drawn in all this connection is that Stevenson actually hasn't much else to talk about. Naturally he wants to keep off the subject of graft and corruption, if it's at all possible. It's easy to understand why he would shy away from any discussion of our national debt. The "policy action" in Korea is another subject the present administration would rather not discuss.

That's all part and parcel of the Democratic administration's wasteful bungling, so anyone can understand why Adlai would rather talk about changing "two-headed elephants" in the middle of the stream. The administration's record itself is indelible. There's nothing funny about it at all, and a lot of super-minded Americans are beginning to regard Stevenson's flippant wisecracking as something more in keeping with some political tin-horn, than with one who is seeking the serious responsibility of becoming President in these troubled times.

The Democrats have looked loud and long on the old time that the Republicans have nothing to offer but criticism. Up to now, criticism of the Republicans is about all that Stevenson has had to offer, and, as we have pointed out, the reason is rather obvious.

There's one very simple reason for a change in administrations. After 20 years of self-doubt and under-handed dealing, anything would be better than the last four years under Truman. Even a two-headed elephant party couldn't be any worse.

**"SOVIET BALLY"**
