Discouraging as it may seem, the campaign against traffic fatalities must go on, with the hope that some day a solution will present itself and the people of this country will finally come to their senses.

After all the effort that has been put forth in Magic Valley to stem the carriage on our highways, 33 lives have been lost this year—one more fatality than during the same period in 1951.

period in 1951

Although our law enforcement authorities contend that many more lives would have been lost had it not been for the Magic Valley safety drive, and that it's an achievement in itself to check the increase in fatallites on our highways, it's rather discouraging to know that with all our combined efforts we have been unable to make any appreciable headway in our fight with the nation's No. 1 accident killer—traffic.

I accident killer—traffic.

It's to the credit of the Safety councils in Magic Valley, however, that they are continuing their fight against automobile accidents. Meeting at Gooding this past week, the legislative and resolutions committees of the Magic Valley Safety conference perfected plans to be submitted to the organization's next valley-wide meeting in Twin Falls Oct. 15. With renewed determination, the fight will be carried before the next session of the state legislature and extended in every other way possible during 1963.

The chief objective will be the revision of inadequate traffic laws and the enactment of statutes with which to carry on a more attenuous fight—laws with sharper teeth and more drastic pensities for violations.

The public in turn will be urged to support

the Magic Valley Safety conference in this
new approach, not with words of praise
alone, but with definite action through clubs
and organizations.

Meantime, traffic experts will be attacking the same problem on a nation-wide scale, at a meeting to be held in Chicago Oct. 20-24. While attending the 40th anniversary confer-ence of the National Safety Congress and

ence of the National Safety Congress and Exposition, these traffic experts will spend five days atudying ways to curb the toll on this country's highways.

In preparing themselves for this conference, the leading authorities on this subject of traffic fatalities, have called attention to an ugly fact which should help the American people to come to their senses in this rat-race on our streets and highways.

last year and injured another 1,200,000, ONE

In other words, we all have only a 50-50 chance of escaping injury in an auto accident unless we all decide to do something about this death and destruction on our highways

We had an interesting conversation the other day with a Twin Falls man who is deep-ly concerned about what he describes as "our poor driving manners."

The point to be gained from all this is that people who are ordinarily mild-mannered act more like morgus when they are operat-ing their automobiles—an unexplainable characteristic which is contributing greatly to all this unnecessary death and injury on our public thoroughfares.

1. Drive controlly show concern for the other fellow instead of competing with him for speed, space and haspital room.

2. Drive "defensively" that means that you always look ahead for road problems and traffic signals and watch what other drivers are doing instead of builting ahead on your own.






