Discouraging as it may seem, the campaign against traffic fatalities must go on, with the hope that some day a solution will present itself and the people of this country will finally come to their senses.

It's to the credit of the Safety councils in Magic Valley, however, that they are continuing their fight against automobile accidents.

MEANTIME, traffic experts will be attacking the same problem at a nation-wide scale at a meeting to be held in Chicago Oct. 20-24.

WHILE attending the 40th anniversary conference of the National Safety Congress and Exposition, these traffic experts will spend five days studying ways to curb the toll on this country's highways.

IN preparing themselves for this conference, the leading authorities on this subject of traffic fatalities, have called attention to an ugly fact which should help the American people to come to their senses in this race on our streets and highways.

UNLESS an effective way is found to curb traffic accidents which killed 37,300 persons last year and injured another 1,300,000, ONE OF EVERY TWO PERSONS LIVING TODAY WILL BE INJURED IN TRAFFIC BEFORE HE DIES!

IN other words, we all have a 50-50 chance of escaping injury in an auto accident unless we all decide to do something about this death and destruction on our highways.

Globe's Speed King Is Killed In Boat Crash

DRUMNADROCHT, Scotland, Sept. 20 (AP)—John Cobb, the fastest man on earth, was injured fatally today when his jet-propelled speedboat broke into his at a speed of 205 miles per hour during an attempt to break the world record.

The 33-year-old Cobb, holder of the world automobile speed record of 204.98 miles per hour, suffered a broken neck when his 442,000 "Cruiser" broke apart on a famous beach near.

The London broker was trying to break the international speed boat held by Stirling Goss of the United States.

Witnesses said the boat appeared to explode.

It had almost reached the end of the mile course and Cobb appeared assured of breaking by far Baynes' record of 174.4 miles per hour. Then it began leaping from the water in great bounces and came apart.

Cobb was world famous—a man who confessed he always "loves jetting" sitting at his office desk and had to get back to racing. He set the world automobile record in 1947 on the salt flats of Utah.

Wool Tariffs Check Urged

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—Speakers from today's wool growers went before the federal tariff commission today urging a check on heavy imports of the fiber.

Joining with the American Wool Growers association in the protest was Rep. Clark Fisher, D. Tex. He declared the "foreign wool drive" prices are the lowest level guaranteed domestic producers through the government loan program.

"It seems to us that it is foolish to provide a loan program on the one hand," he told a reporter, "and on the other to encourage the dumping of foreign wools on the American market to drive down prices."

He quoted the agriculture department figures in saying the parity price of wool is 60 cents per pound gross basis, just as short and before being scoured. Although the government loan program guarantees growers a return of 90 per cent of parity, or 54 cents, the actual market price now is about 52 cents, he added.

The present tariff on imported wool is 25 cents per pound, clean basis. About four years ago the rate was cut by about 25 per cent under the reciprocal tariff act, said Fisher.

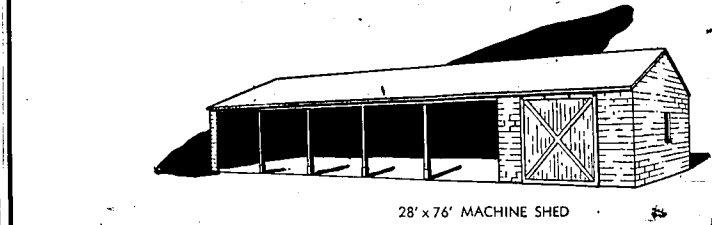

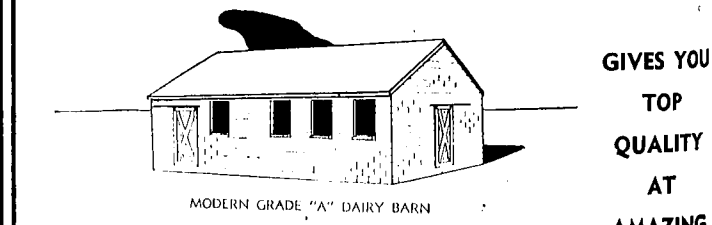
