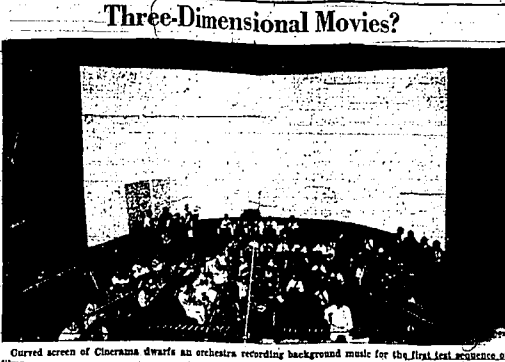

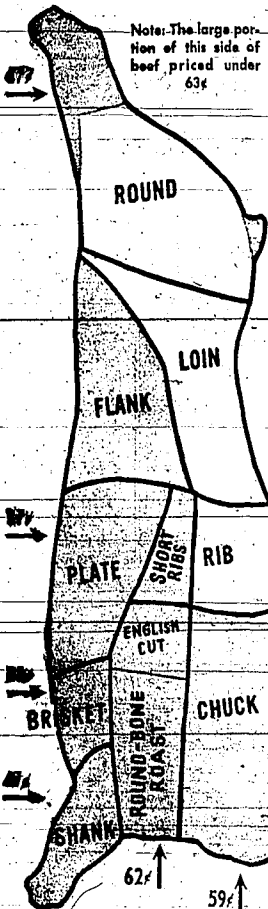

has arranged the pins, badges and other items according to campaigns. He has more than 3,000 of them. His collection dates back to 1840 when William H. Harrison and John Tyler of the Whig party defeated Martin Van Buren and Richard M. Johnson of the Democratic party and James O. Bryner and Thomas Burke of the Liberty and Abolition parties. He has four different kinds of pins for that year. One reads "Tippecanoe and Tyler, Too."

For the campaigns of 1848, 1852 and 1856 Fuld's buttons are those of losers rather than winners of the campaign. Lewis Cass was defeated by Zachary Taylor in the campaign of 1848. Winfield Scott lost to James K. Polk in 1844 and George B. McClellan was defeated by Abraham Lincoln in 1860.

His collection also includes pins for both nominees in 1856—James Buchanan, who was elected with John C. Breckinridge on the Democratic party, and John C. Fremont, the first Republican candidate, who participated in one and one-half campaigns. In the middle of the campaign of 1860, with General Fremont leading so many battles around Atlanta, Fremont decided Lincoln would win the campaign and he bought a Lincoln pin.

For the campaign of 1860 Fuld has the buttons of Abraham Lincoln, Stephen Douglas and John Bell. He also has a facsimile of Lincoln's letter of acceptance after he was elected. His medal for the campaign of 1864 is that of George B. McClellan who was defeated by Lincoln.

The intype of Ulysses S. Grant and Schuler Colfax used in the campaign of 1868 was given to him by a man who was in Grant's staff during the Civil war. It is mounted on a stick pin. For the campaigns from 1872 to 1892 Fuld's collection contains medals and pins used by Rutherford B. Hayes, Samuel J. Tilden, James A. Garfield, Winfield S. Hancock, Grover Cleveland, James O. Blaine and Benjamin Harrison.

In calling attention to the term from 1892 to 1896, Fuld states that Adlai E. Stevenson, grandfather of today's democratic nominee, served under Cleveland as vice president. He also was William Jennings Bry-

er's running mate in the campaign of 1900.

From the campaign of William McKinley down to the present time Fuld displays many different kinds of insignia used by candidates who were elected and those who were defeated in nominating conventions and general elections. His smallest button is one bearing the likeness of Woodrow Wilson which measures 1/8 inch. His largest button measures some nine inches and bears a likeness of Harry S. Truman.

In three scrapbooks he has arranged campaign stickers and other paper insignia. He has thumbtacks, arm bands, hatpins, socks and scarfs. Mrs. Fuld was presented with a heavy silk scarf bearing the words "I Like 'em" while the couple attended the Republican national convention this summer in Chicago. They also attended the conventions held in Philadelphia in 1940 and again in 1948.

One of Fuld's prized possessions is his gray beaver Harrison hat of the campaign of 1853. Photos of Harrison and Reid are in the crown. Also pinned is an ash tray and match holder which was used by Theodore Roosevelt on his desk when he was police commissioner of New York City.

In correspondence with Alfred M. London, Fuld told him he had 43 buttons for the London-Knox campaign of 1936. Upon receiving a reply from London that he had seen only 3 for 4 and did not know there were so many, Fuld sent him several from London's own collection.

Unique pins in Bryan's campaign in 1896 were the gold and silver pins with the wings folded. When opened the goldpins show pictures of McKinley and Hobart and the silver bugs show pictures of Bryan and Howell. Clock faces with the

Order Drawn To Help Area In Power Dip

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—The government announced Tuesday it has drafted a proposed order for curtailing use of power in the Pacific northwest this fall if a serious shortage develops.

The federal electric power administration (DEPA) said curtailment of its proposed order have not been issued to all electric utilities in the region. It terms were not made public by DEPA here, but the agency said it was returned generally after a 1931 order issued during the northwestern power shortage.

DEPA Administrator James F. Fairman emphasized that no decision has been made to issue the order. It was drawn up only "in preparation for emergency procedures . . . in the serious winter shortage develops." The 1931 conservation order was issued when rivers and streams in the Pacific northwest ran low and it appeared power supplies would be inadequate.—The order outlined plans for the most efficient use of power, but as water conditions improved and it never was put into effect.
